The residential half of University City is slated for several infrastructure projects including sewer mains, water mains, Pure Water, and asphalt overlays starting in 2022. I am committed to minimizing impact on the community at large. These concurrent projects will be staged to coordinate street closures, minimize construction storage, and ensure safe routes for residents, commuters, schools, and emergency vehicles.

District 1 Gets it Done

This month, Team LaCava really stepped up as we returned to in-person events across the City. Please see below for a few of our most recent "community wins."

Carmel Valley

- Met with a 2nd grade class at Solana Ranch Elementary School as well as 10th through 12th grade students involved in the Samsung Solve for Tomorrow project at Canyon Crest Academy to discuss the role of local government and the importance of youth involvement;
- Scheduled light pole replacement at the Carmel Valley Neighborhood Park, which are set to be delivered on November 12th, and will be installed shortly thereafter;
- Conducted vegetation abatement near a property line along Carmel Canyon Road and Carmel Mountain Road;
- Investigated reports of private organizations placing A-frame portable signs in the right-of-way at various Carmel Valley intersections and promptly addressed the situation.

Del Mar Heights

- Organized city staff response to a public storm drain sinkhole on private property along Portofino Road;
- Resolved customer water bill issues with the Public Utilities Department;
- · Assisted resident with removal of hazardous waste from their home.

La Jolla

- Met with the 2nd graders at The Children's School on Zoom and, based on their detailed analysis, requested Traffic Engineering to check the signal timing for left-turns on Torrey Pines Road at Torrey Pines Lane;
- Worked with Environmental Services Department to clean La Jolla Parkway;
- Removed trees and vegetation disrupting the bike lane along the North side of Torrey Pines Road from La Jolla Shores Drive to Prospect Lane;
- Restored service to five streetlights at La Jolla Village Drive and Torrey Pines Road when a breaker tripped;
- Resumed coastal bluff spraying along Coast Boulevard;
- Improved the Forward Street drain in Bird Rock, addressing what the community no-so-affectionately dubbed "Lake Forward."



Sorrento Valley

 Conducted emergency channel maintenance for the Industrial Channel near the intersection of Sorrento Valley Road and Carmel Mountain Road, which reduced the severity and likelihood of flooding nearby businesses and critical transportation/safety impacts at the intersection.

University City

- Attended EdUCate's Oktoberfest and recognized the important contributions of the University City Fire Safe Council and Elizabeth Palmer to the City of San Diego;
- Fixed a streetlight along Olivewood Terrace;
- Corrected a resident's smart meter antenna, which in turn corrected their water meter readings and water bills;
- Responded to a code compliance complaint about an illegally operating at-home business causing an influx of vehicular traffic along Syracuse Avenue;
- Conducted a Team LaCava phonebank, calling residents in Southern University City to check-in and say hello!
