

In alignment with the guidance provided in the San Diego Municipal Code section 22.3016, the Purchasing Agent (Director of Purchasing and Contracting) must certify that the award of a sole source contract is necessary by memorializing in writing why strict compliance with a competitive process would be unavailing or would not produce an advantage, and why soliciting bids or proposals would therefore be undesirable, impractical, or impossible.

For consideration, this form must be completed and all required accompanying information must be submitted together, including any related contracts. Failure to do so will result in a delay of approval of the request.

Describe commodity or service(s) to be purchased. Include vendor contact information.

The City approved sole source #3279 on October 3, 2017 with Dr. David Victor to provide professional consulting services for the San Vicente Pumped Storage hydroelectric project.

The San Vicente Pumped Storage Project is a highly technical project and the power industry is a highly regulated environment. Dr. Victor is an expert in the natural gas and electric power market, and in climate-change policy. His specialized knowledge and expertise in the industry are required to assist the City during the feasibility study, and project development and negotiations with regulators to advance a potential public-private partnership business model and to successfully complete a complex permitting process. Soliciting proposals to continue with this project would be impractical as no other consultant has the credentials or expertise comparable to Dr. Victor. He is uniquely qualified to continue to provide specialized and reliable assistance to the City.

In June 2015, the First Amendment to the Agreement for Consultant Services for Energy Market Expert Review with Dr. David Victor, extended the duration of the services through December 31, 2016 and increased the contract by \$100,000, bringing the total not to exceed amount to \$240,000.

In January 2017, the Second Amendment to the Agreement for Consultant Services for Energy Market Expert Review with Dr. David Victor, extended the duration of the services through December 31, 2017.

An Ordinance (O-20913) of the Council of the City of San Diego Authorizing a Third Amendment to the Agreement with Dr. David Victor for Energy Market Expert Review Services, extended the duration of the services through August 22, 2022 and increased the contract by \$240,000, bringing the total not to exceed amount to \$480,000.

The Public Utilities Department is currently requesting to extend the contract three (3) additional years through August 22, 2025 and to increase the contract amount by \$200,000, raising the not-to-exceed amount from \$480,000 to \$680,000.

FOURTH AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT

This Fourth Amendment to the Energy Market Expert Review Services Regarding the San Vicente Hydroelectric Pumped Storage Project dated August 22, 2014 [Agreement], is hereby entered into by and between the City of San Diego [City], a municipal corporation, and Dr. David Victor [Consultant].

<u>RECITALS</u>

- A. The City and Consultant [collectively referenced herein as the "Parties"] entered into the Agreement, to provide expert review services for the Energy Market Expert Review Services Regarding the San Vicente Hydroelectric Pumped Storage Project [Project];
- B. The City and the Consultant executed the First Amendment to the Agreement to increase the compensation amount to \$240,000, and to extend the contract duration until December 2016;
- C. The City and the Consultant executed the Second Amendment to the Agreement to extend the contract duration until December 31, 2017;
- D. The City and the Consultant executed the Third Amendment to the Agreement to increase the compensation amount from \$240,000 to \$480,000, and to extend the contract duration until August 22, 2022;
- E. The City desires to execute a Fourth Amendment to the Agreement to increase the compensation amount from \$480,000 to \$680,000, and to extend the contract duration until August 22, 2025;
- F. Consultant desires to provide the services required under this Fourth Amendment.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING A FOURTH AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT WITH DR. DAVID VICTOR FOR ENERGY MARKET EXPERT REVIEW SERVICES REGARDING THE SAN VICENTE HYDROELECTRIC PUMPED STORAGE PROJECT.

WHEREAS, in October of 2013, the City of San Diego (City) and the San Diego County Water Authority entered into a Memorandum of Understanding for the procurement of professional services to study the feasibility and economic viability for construction of a large hydropower project, the San Vicente Hydroelectric Pumped Storage Project (Project); and

WHEREAS, the City requires continued expertise to understand the regulatory process, pricing, supply – and – demand dynamics, financing options and operational issues related to the Project, and this expertise will enable the City to achieve its goal of minimizing financial risks and maximizing revenue opportunities for the ratepayers through a well-negotiated publicprivate partnership agreement; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Public Utilities Department submitted a Sole Source request which was approved by the San Diego Purchasing and Contracting Department on July 1, 2014, to enter into an agreement for Consultant Services for Energy Market Expert Review (Agreement) with Dr. David Victor, a UCSD professor uniquely qualified to bring a critically important, objective third – party evaluation to mitigate the risks associated with a Project of this scope, complexity, and expense; and

WHEREAS, in June 2015, the First Amendment to the Agreement, extended the duration of the services through December 31, 2016 and increased the contract by \$100,000, bringing the total not to exceed amount to \$240,000; and

WHEREAS, in January 2017, the Second Amendment to the Agreement extended the duration of the services through December 31, 2017; and

WHEREAS, in January 2018, the Third Amendment to the Agreement extended the duration of the services through August 22, 2022 and increased the amount by \$240,000, bringing the total not to exceed amount of the Agreement to \$480,000; and

WHEREAS, this Fourth Amendment to the Agreement with Dr. David Victor will extend the duration of the services through August 22, 2025 and increase the amount by \$200,000, bringing the total not to exceed amount of the Agreement to \$680,000; and

WHEREAS, under Charter section 99, no contract, agreement, or obligation extending for a period of more than five years may be authorized except by Ordinance approved by a twothirds majority vote of the City Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor, or his designee, is authorized to execute the Fourth Amendment to the Agreement with Dr. David Victor, for the Energy Market Expert Review Consulting Services, in an amount not to exceed \$200,000, bringing the total not to exceed amount of the Agreement to \$680,000, and to extend the contract term to August 22, 2025, under the terms and conditions set forth in the Fourth Amendment, on file in the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. OO- 21435.

Section 2. That the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to expend an amount not to exceed \$200,000 from 700011, Water Utility Operating Fund, for the purpose of executing this Agreement, contingent upon the adoption of the Appropriation Ordinance for the applicable fiscal years, and contingent upon the Chief Financial Officer first furnishing one or more

certificates certifying that funds necessary for expenditure are, or will be, on deposit with the City Treasurer.

Section 3. That a full reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to passage, a

written copy having been made available to the Council and the public prior to the day of its passage.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its final passage.
