Background

- In 2019, Department retained consultant to update the 2015 Cost of Service fee study
- Most fees remain significantly below the cost to provide the service
- Department Fee Committee completed a comprehensive review of fees, policies and procedures
- Fees have not changed since 2015



2019 Cost of Service Study Update

California's Proposition 26 (P26)

- Most fees fall under one or more of P26's implied exceptions
 - 1) Fees convey a benefit or privilege as requested by the user and not to the general public, or
 - Fees allow entrance to and/or use of City property as requested by the user for a specific purpose unrelated to general public use
- Recreation fees are exempt provided that the fees are voluntarily paid and do not exceed the cost to provide the service
- Facility rental/use fees are subject to fair market value



Fee Categories

- 1. Use of fields and indoor/outdoor courts by sports leagues and for organized sports programs
- 2. Use of outdoor park facilities and recreation buildings/rooms and pools for organized activities
- 3. Pool Entrance Fees
- Miscellaneous use of park property such as exhibits, beach bars and mooring for private boats, camping, and fitness instruction
- 5. Recreation Program Services and Classes



Fee Schedule Restructure

- The format of the Parks and Recreation Fee Schedule has not changed for more than 30 years
- Proposed fee schedule simplifies fee calculations and applicable fees are easier to identify
- Consolidation of policies and requirements in the Terms
 & Conditions section eliminates duplication of information
- Includes authorized fees not in current Fee Schedule
 - Fees for credit card processing, Recreation Center Fund, recreation programs, and First Amendment Sellers



Summary of Proposed Changes

- Increase most fees by 10.8% to reflect CPI changes between 2015 2019 (est. \$225,000 revenue increase)
- Restructure fees for sports related activities
 - Old fee structure led to miscalculation of fees and were difficult for staff and customers to understand
 - New structure consistent with other fees
 - No 10.8% increase
- New fees for Balboa Park traffic control and transportation services
- Eliminate Season Volleyball League Reservations for Beaches and Bays (users will pay sports league fees)



Summary of Proposed Changes New Opportunity Fund Fee

- Create New Special Recreation Fund (\$1 million annually)
 to be managed by the Parks & Recreation Department
- Fund equitable programs for communities of concern, in accordance with Parks Master Plan
- Not applied when Recreation Center Fund (RCF) fees are paid
- Replaces fees for Dog Classes, Practices, and Shows and Outdoor Fitness Classes

Summary of Proposed Changes New Opportunity Fund Fee

Outdoor Events <50 People

- Non-profit Youth/Non-Commercial \$1 per hour
- Commercial/Government/Non-profit Adult \$5 per hour

<u>Outdoor Events > 50 People</u>

- Non-profit Youth/Non-Commercial \$10 per hour
- Commercial/Government/ Non-profit Adult \$15 per hour

Summary of Proposed Changes New Opportunity Fund Fee

Room/Gym Rental

Non-profit Youth/Non-Commercial \$ 1 per hour Commercial/Government/Non-profit Adult \$10 per hour

Sports Leagues - Use of Fields, Indoor/Outdoor Courts

Youth Sports Leagues \$1 per hour Adult Sports Leagues \$2 per hour



Recommended Actions

This item seeks authority to:

- Change Parks and Recreation fees effective July 1, 2022
- Restructure the fee schedule
- Add or eliminate other fees as detailed within this report
- Add the Opportunity Fee to support recreation programs in communities of concern, in accordance with Parks Master Plan
- Create a special fund to receive Opportunity Fee revenue
- Distribute Opportunity Fee revenue to the eligible community Recreation Center Funds
