### **SUMMARY**

<u>Issue:</u> Should the Hearing Officer approve a marijuana production facility to operate within an existing 7,189 square foot two-story building within a 123,045-square-foot complex, comprised of twenty-six buildings located at 7542 Trade Street within the IL 2-1 zone within the Mira Mesa Community Plan area in Council District 6?

### **Staff Recommendation:**

1. Approve Conditional Use Permit No. 2064703.

<u>Community Planning Group Recommendation</u>: As of the printing of this report, a recommendation from the Mira Mesa Community Planning group was not available. If it becomes available, their recommendation will be presented at the hearing.

<u>Environmental Review</u>: This project was determined to be categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15301 (Existing Facilities). This project is not pending an appeal of the environmental determination. The environmental exemption determination for this project was made on June 14, 2018, and the opportunity to appeal that determination ended June 28, 2018.

### **BACKGROUND**

The Mira Mesa Community Plan designates the site for Light Industrial Land Use Area and the Miramar Subarea of the Mira Mesa Community Plan (Attachment 1). The Light Industrial designation is intended to accommodate manufacturing, storage, warehousing, distribution, and similar uses. The 11.42-acre site is located at 7542 Trade Street in the IL-2-1 zone (Attachment 2). The building is currently being used for manufacturing purposes. The purpose and intent of the IL-2-1 zone is to permit a range of uses, including nonindustrial uses in some instances. Specifically, the IL-2-1 allows

a mix of light industrial and office uses with limited commercial. The site presently developed with industrial buildings constructed in 1974 for manufacturing uses (Attachment 3).

The site is designated for Light Industrial uses in the Miramar Subarea of the Mira Mesa Community Plan. The Miramar Subarea was foreseen in the community plan to be developed with a mix of light industrial and specialized commercial uses. All the surrounding parcels are located in the IL-2-1 zone and the existing uses are consistent with the Industrial designation of the community plan. The project site is designated Industrial Employment by the Land Use and Community Planning Element of the General Plan. The proposed project will promote the policies of the General Plan in that Marijuana Production Facilities would create jobs and encourage commerce within the San Diego region.

Marijuana Production Facilities are restricted to forty City-wide, within light and heavy industrial zones. Marijuana Production Facilities require compliance with San Diego Municipal Code (SDMC), section 141.1004, which require a 1,000 foot separation, measured between property lines from, resource and population-based City parks, churches, child care centers, playgrounds, City libraries, minor-oriented facilities, residential care facilities, and schools. Marijuana Production Facilities also require a minimum distance requirement of 100 feet from a residential zone. Security requirements include interior and exterior lighting, security cameras, alarms and a security guard. The security guard must be licensed by the State of California and be present on the premises during business hours. Marijuana Production Facilities must also comply with Chapter 4, Article 2, Division 15 which provides guidelines for lawful operation.

### **DISCUSSION**

### **Project Description**

The project proposes the operation of a Marijuana Production Facility within an existing 7,189 square foot two-story building within a 123,045-square-foot complex, comprised of twenty-six buildings. The 11.42-acre site is located within the IL-2-1 zone in the Mira Mesa Plan area in Council District 6. The Marijuana Production Facility operations would include the extraction, testing, manufacturing and distribution of cannabis products to State of California licensed marijuana outlets (Attachment 4).

The project proposes interior improvements that include non-load bearing partitions, doors, lighting, security cameras and system, millwork, finishes throughout and associated mechanical, electrical and plumbing improvements. Other minor site improvements are proposed consistent with the City of San Diego requirements. No exterior building alterations would occur. The proposed improvements would require the Owner/Permittee to obtain a change of use/occupancy building permit consistent with all California Codes and Regulations in effect at the time of building permit, satisfactory to the Building Official. Public improvements would include the removal and replacement of the existing uplifted and damaged sidewalk, curb & gutter and the reconstruction of the two existing driveways per current City Standards, satisfactory to the City Engineer.

### Conclusion

City staff has reviewed the proposed project and all issues identified through the review process have been resolved in conformance with adopted City Council policies and regulations of the Land Development Code. The design of the proposed Project complies with all development regulations of the IL-2-1 zone and no deviations are required to approve the project. Staff has provided draft findings (Attachment 5) to support the proposed development and draft conditions of approval (Attachment 6). Staff is recommending the Hearing Officer approve the Project as presented.

### **ALTERNATIVES**

- 1. Approve Conditional Use Permit No. 2064703, with modifications.
- 2. Deny Conditional Use Permit No. 2064703, if the findings required to approve the project cannot be affirmed.



### Storm Water Quality Notes

- 1. The contractor shall be responsible for cleanup of all silt & mud on adjacent street(s), due to construction vehicles or any other construction BMP's which may compromise Storm Water Quality within any street(s). A stabilized construction exit may be required to prevent construction vehicles or equipment from tracking mud or silt
- 2. All stockpiles of soil &/or building materials that are intended to be left for a period greater than 7 calendar days are to be covered. All removable BMP devices shall be in place at the end of each working day when 5 day rain probability forecast exceeds 40%.
- 3. A concrete washout shall be provided on all projects which propose the construction of any concrete improvements which are to be poured in place on site
- 4. The contractor shall restore all erosion/sediment control devices to working order after each run-off producing rainfall or after any material breach in effectiveness.
- 5. All slopes that are created or disturbed by construction activity must be protected against erosion and sediment transport at all times.
- 6. The storage of all construction materials and equipment must be protected against any potential release of pollutants into the



3-1 Brush Management- Description
Fire safety in the landscape is achieved by reducing the readily flammable fuel adjacent to structures. This can be accomplished by pruning and thinning of native and naturalized vegetation, revegetation with low fuel volume plantings or a combination of the two.Implementing brush management in an environmentally appropriate manner requires a reduction in the amount and continuity of highly flammable fuel while maintaining plant coverage for soil protection. Such a transition will minimize the visual, biological and erosion impacts while reducing the risks of wildland fires.

3-2 Brush Management- Requirements

3.2-1 Basic Requirements- All Zones

3.2-1.01 For zone two, plants shall not be cut below six inches.

3.2-1.02 Debris and trimmings produced by thinning and pruning shall be removedfrom the site or if left, shall be converted into mulch by a chipping machine and evenly dispersed, non-irrigated, to a maximum depth of 6 inches. 3.2-1.03 Trees and large tree form shrubs (e.g., Oaks, Sumac, Toyon) which are being retained shall be pruned to provide clearance of three times the height of the under story plant material or six feet whichever is higher (Figure 3-1). Dead and excessively twiggy growth shall

also be removed.

3.2-1.04 All plants or plant groupings except cacti, succulents, trees and tree-form shrubs shall be separated by a distance three times the height of the tallest adjacent plants (Figure 3-1). 3.2-1.05 Maximum coverage and area limitations as stated herein shall not apply to indigenous native tree species (i.e., Pinus, Quercus, Platanus, Salix and

3.2-2 Zone 1 Requirements - All Structures

3.2-2.01 Do not use, and remove if necessary, highly flammable plant materials (see Appendix "B").

3.2-2.02 Trees should not be located any closer to a structure than a distance equal to the tree's mature spread.

3.2-2.03 Maintain all plantings in a succulent condition.

1. General Maintenance ~ Regular inspections and landscape maintenance are necessary to minimize the potential damage or loss of property from brush fires and other natural hazards such as erosion and slope failures. Because each property is unique establishing a precise maintenance schedule is not feasible. For effective fire and watershed management, however, property owners should expect

to provide maintenance according to each brush management zone: Zone 1: Year-round maintenance, Zone 2: Seasonal maintenance, Brush management activities are prohibited within coastal sage scrub, maritim succulent scrub, and coastal sage-chaparral habitats from March 1 through August 15, except where documented to the satisfaction of the City Manager that the thinning would be consistent with conditions of species coverage described in the City of San Diego's MSCP Subarea

2. Brush Management Zone 1 ~ This is the most critical area for fire and watershed safety. All ornamental plantings should be kept well watered and any irrigation run-off should drain toward the street, Rain gutters and drainage pipes should be cleaned regularly and all leaves removed from the roof before the fire season begins. All planting, particularly nonirrigated natives and large trees should be regularly pruned to eliminate dead fuels, to reduce excessive fuel and to provide adequate space between plants and structures.

3. Brush Management Zone 2 ~ Seasonal maintenance in this zone should include removal of dead woody plants, eradication of weedy species and periodic pruning and thinning of trees and shrubs. Removal of weeds should not be done with hand tools such as hoes, as this disturbs valuable soil. The use of weed trimmers or other tools which retain short stubble that protects the soil is recommended. Native shrubs should be pruned in the summer after the major plant growth occurs.

Well pruned healthy shrubs should typically require several years to build up excessive live and dead fuel. On slopes all drainage devices must be kept clear. Re-inspect after each major storm since minor soil slips can block drains. Various groundcovers should be periodically sheared and thatch removed. Diseased and dead wood should be pruned from trees. Fertilizing trees and shrubs is not typically recommended as this may stimulate excessive growth.

4. Long-term Maintenance Responsibility ~ All Landscaping / Brush Management within the Brush Management Zone(s) as shown on these plans shall be the responsibility of \_\_\_Sarmad Hallack\_\_\_ . The Brush Management Zone areas shall be maintained free of debris and litter and all plant material shall be maintained in a healthy growing condition.

#### (g) Zone One Requirements

(1) The required Zone One width shall be provided between native or naturalized vegetation and any structure and shall be measured from the exterior of the structure to the vegetation.

(2) Zone One shall contain no habitable structures, structures that are directly attached to habitable structures, or other combustible construction that provides a means for transmitting fire to the habitable structures. Structures such as fences, walls, palapas, play structures, and non-habitable gazebos that are located within brush management Zone One shall be of noncombustible, one hour fire-rated or heavy

(3) Plants within Zone One shall be primarily low-growing and less than 4 feet in height with the exception of trees. Plants shall be low-fuel and

(4) Trees within Zone One shall be located away from structures to a minimum distance of 10 feet as measured from the structures to the drip line of the tree at maturity in accordance with the Landscape Standards of the Land Development Manual

(5) Permanent irrigation is required for all planting areas within Zone One except as follows:

(A) When planting areas contain only species that do not grow taller than 24 inches in height, or

(B) When planting areas contain only native or naturalized species that are not summer-dormant and have a maximum height at plant maturity of less than 24 inches.

(6) Zone One irrigation overspray and runoff shall not be allowed into adjacent areas of native or naturalized vegetation.

(7) Zone One shall be maintained on a regular basis by pruning and thinning plants, controlling weeds, and maintaining irrigation systems.

#### (h) Zone Two Requirements

City of San Diego BMZ Notes

(1) The required Zone Two width shall be provided between Zone One and the undisturbed, native or naturalized vegetation, and shall be measured from the edge of Zone One that is farthest from the habitable structure, to the edge of undisturbed vegetation.

(2) No structures shall be constructed in Zone Two

- (3) Within Zone Two, 50 percent of the plants over 24 inches in height shall be cut and cleared to a height of 6 inches.
- (4) Within Zone Two, all plants remaining after 50 percent are reduced in height, shall be pruned to reduce fuel loading in accordance with the Landscape Standards in the Land Development Manual. Non-native plants shall be pruned before native plants are pruned.
- (5) The following standards shall be used where Zone Two is in an area previously graded as part of legal development activity and is proposed to be planted with new plant material instead of clearing existing native or naturalized vegetation:
  (A) All new plant material for Zone Two shall be native, low-fuel,
- and fire-resistive. No non-native plant material may be planted in Zone Two either inside the MHPA or in the Coastal Overlay Zone, adjacent to areas containing sensitive biological
- (B) New plants shall be low-growing with a maximum height at maturity of 24 inches. Single specimens of fire resistive native trees and tree form shrubs may exceed this limitation if they are located to reduce the chance of transmitting fire from native or naturalized vegetation to habitable structures and if the vertical distance between the lowest branches of the trees and the top of adjacent plants are three times the height of the adjacent plants to reduce the spread of fire through ladder
- (C) All new Zone Two plantings shall irrigated temporarily until established to the satisfaction of the City Manager, Only lowflow, low-gallonage spray heads may be used in Zone Two. Overspray and runoff from the irrigation shall not drift or flow into adjacent areas of native or naturalized vegetation. Temporary irrigation systems shall be removed upon approved establishment of the plantings. Permanent irrigation is not allowed in Zone Two.
- (D) Where Zone Two is being revegetated as a requirement of Section 142.0411(a), revegetation shall comply with the spacing standards in the Land Development Manual, Fifty percent of the planting area shall be planted with material that does not grow taller than 24 inches. The remaining planting area may be planted with taller material, but this material shall be maintained in accordance with the requirements for existing plant material in Zone Two.
- (6) Zone Two shall be maintained on a regular basis by pruning and thinning plants, removing invasive species, and controlling weeds. (7) Except as provided in Section 142.0412(i), where the required Zone One width shown in Table 142-04H cannot be provided on premises with existing structures, the required Zone Two width shall be increased by one foot for each foot of required Zone One width that cannot be provided.





WHEREAS, on June 14, 2018, the City of San Diego, as Lead Agency, through the Development Services Department, made and issued an Environmental Determination that the project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.) under CEQA Guideline Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) and there was no appeal of the Environmental Determination filed within the time period provided by San Diego Municipal Code Section 112.0520;

WHEREAS, on August 15, 2018, the Hearing Officer of the City of San Diego considered Conditional Use Permit No. 2064703 pursuant to the Land Development Code of the City of San Diego;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Hearing Officer of the City of San Diego as follows:

That the Hearing Officer adopts the following written Findings, dated August 15, 2018.

### A. <u>CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT [SDMC Section 126.0305]</u>

### 1. Findings for all Conditional Use Permits:

a. The proposed development will not adversely affect the applicable land use plan.

The proposed project requests a Conditional Use Permit to operate a Marijuana Production Facility in an existing 7,189 square foot two-story building within a 123,045-square-foot complex, comprised of twenty-six buildings. The 11.42-acre site is located at 7542 Trade Street in the IL-2-1 zone of the Mira Mesa Community Plan.

The site is designated for Light Industrial uses in the Miramar Subarea of the Mira Mesa Community Plan. The Miramar Subarea was foreseen in the community plan to be developed with a mix of light industrial and specialized commercial uses. All the surrounding parcels are located in the IL-2-1 zone and the existing uses are consistent with the Industrial designation of the community plan. The project site is designated Industrial Employment by the Land Use and Community Planning Element of the General Plan. The proposed project will promote the policies of the General Plan in that Marijuana Production Facilities would create jobs and encourage commerce within the San Diego region.

The proposed Marijuana Production Facility, classified as an industrial use, is a compatible use for this location with a Conditional Use Permit and is consistent with the community plan, and therefore will not adversely affect the applicable land use plan.

# b. The proposed development will not be detrimental to the public health, safety, and welfare.

The proposed Marijuana Production Facility in an existing 7,189 square foot two-story building within a 123,045-square-foot complex, comprised of twenty-six buildings will be within an existing two-story building. The building is currently being used as a manufacturing facility. The project proposes interior improvements that include a lobby area, offices, restrooms, indoor loading/unloading area, packing area, trim area, lab, extraction area and storage. Other minor site improvements are proposed consistent with the City of San Diego requirements. The proposed improvements will require the Owner/Permittee to obtain a change of use/occupancy building permit consistent with all California Codes and Regulations in effect at the time of building permit, satisfactory to the Building Official. Public improvements would include the removal and replacement of the existing uplifted and damaged sidewalk, curb & gutter and the reconstruction of the two existing driveways per current City Standards, satisfactory to the City Engineer.

Marijuana Production Facilities are restricted to forty City-wide, within light and heavy industrial zones. Marijuana Production Facilities require compliance with San Diego Municipal Code (SDMC), section 141.1004, which require a 1,000 foot separation, measured between property lines from, resource and population-based City parks, churches, child care centers, playgrounds, City libraries, minor-oriented facilities, residential care facilities, and schools. Marijuana Production Facilities also a minimum distance requirement of 100 feet from a residential zone. Security requirements include interior and exterior lighting, security cameras, alarms and a security guard. The security guard must be licensed by the State of California and be present on the premises during business hours. Marijuana Production Facilities must also comply with Chapter 4, Article 2, Division 15 which provides guidelines for lawful operation.

The proposed project will be required to comply with the operational conditions as described in the Conditional Use Permit No. 2064703. The Conditional Use Permit No. 2064703 will be valid for five years and may be revoked if the Owner/Permittee violates the terms, conditions, lawful requirements, or provisions of the Permit.

The proposed development will not be detrimental to the public's health, safety and welfare in that the discretionary permit controlling the use of this site contains specific regulatory conditions of approval, as referenced in the Conditional Use Permit No. 2064703. The referenced regulations and conditions have been determined as necessary to avoid adverse impact upon the health, safety and general welfare of persons patronizing, residing or working within the surrounding area. Therefore, the proposed Marijuana Production Facility will not be detrimental to the public health, safety and welfare.

c. The proposed development will comply with the regulations of the Land Development Code including any allowable deviations pursuant to the Land Development Code.

The proposed Marijuana Production Facility in an existing 7,189 square foot two-story building within a 123,045-square-foot complex, comprised of twenty-six buildings located at 7542 Trade Street, is within an existing two-story building on a 11.42-acre site. The site is located in the IL-2-1 Zone in the Mira Mesa Community Plan area. The site was developed in 1974. The project proposes interior improvements including a lobby area, offices, restrooms, indoor loading/unloading area, packing area, trim area, lab, extraction area and storage. Other minor site improvements are proposed consistent with the City of San Diego requirements.

Marijuana Production Facilities are allowed in the IL-2-1 Zone of the Mira Mesa Community Plan with a Conditional Use Permit. The proposed use requires compliance with San Diego Municipal Code (SDMC), Section 141.1004 and Chapter 4, Article 2, Division 15. Section 141.1004 requires a 1,000 foot separation, measured between property lines from, resource and population-based City parks, churches, child care centers, playgrounds, City libraries, minor-oriented facilities, residential care facilities, and schools. There is also a minimum distance requirement of 100 feet from a residential zone. Security requirements, expressed as conditions in the Permit, include interior and exterior lighting, security cameras, alarms and a security guard. The security guard must be licensed by the State of California and be present on the premises during business hours.

The proposed Marijuana Production Facility is consistent with all land development regulations relevant for the site and the use and no deviations are requested or required. Therefore, the proposed Marijuana Production Facility will comply with the regulations of the Land Development Code.

### d. The proposed use is appropriate at the proposed location.

The proposed Marijuana Production Facility in an existing 7,189 square foot two-story building within a 123,045-square-foot complex, comprised of twenty-six buildings located at 7542 Trade Street, is within an existing two-story building on a 11.42-acre site. The proposed project requests a Conditional Use Permit to operate a Marijuana

Production Facility in an existing 7,189 square foot two-story building within a 123,045-square-foot complex, comprised of twenty-six buildings. The 11.42-acre site is located at 7542 Trade Street in the IL-2-1 zone of the Mira Mesa Community Plan.

The site is designated for Light Industrial uses in the Miramar Subarea of the Mira Mesa Community Plan. The Miramar Subarea was foreseen in the community plan to be developed with a mix of light industrial and specialized commercial uses. All the surrounding parcels are located in the IL-2-1 zone and the existing uses are consistent with the Industrial designation of the community plan. The project site is designated Industrial Employment by the Land Use and Community Planning Element of the General Plan. The proposed project will promote the policies of the General Plan in that Marijuana Production Facilities would create jobs and encourage commerce within the San Diego region.

The proposed Marijuana Production Facility is consistent with all land development regulations relevant for the site and the use and no deviations are requested or required. The proposed Marijuana Production Facility is a compatible use for this location with a Conditional Use Permit. Therefore, the proposed Marijuana Production Facility is an appropriate use at the proposed location.

The above findings are supported by the minutes, maps and exhibits, all of which are incorporated herein by this reference.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, based on the findings hereinbefore adopted by the Hearing Officer, Conditional Use Permit No. 2064703 is hereby GRANTED by the Hearing Officer to the referenced Owner/Permittee, in the form, exhibits, terms and conditions as set forth in Permit No. 2064703, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

# Conditional Use Permit No. 2064703 MPF 7542 TRADE STREET PROJECT NO. 585533 Hearing Officer

This Conditional Use Permit No. 2064703 is granted by the Hearing Officer of the City of San Diego to TRADE STREET, LLC, Owner/Permittee, pursuant to San Diego Municipal Code [SDMC] section 126.0305. The 11.42-acre site is located at 7542 Trade Street in the IL-2-1 zone of the Mira Mesa Community Plan. The project site is legally described as Parcel 24 of Parcel Map No. 9637, being a division of Parcel 1 of Parcel Map No. 2972, being a portion of Lot of G-W Industrial Park Unit No. 2, according to Map thereof No. 7674, filed June 26, 1973.

Subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Permit, permission is granted to Owner/Permittee to operate a Marijuana Production Facility within an existing 7,189 square foot suite within a 123,045-square-foot complex, comprised of twenty-six buildings described and identified by size, dimension, quantity, type, and location on the approved exhibits [Exhibit "A"] dated August 15, 2018, on file in the Development Services Department.

### The project shall include:

- a. Operation of a Marijuana Production Facility within an existing 7,189 square foot two-story building within a 123,045-square-foot commercial office complex, comprised of seven buildings. The operation shall include the production of marijuana products consistent with the requirements of the State of California statues and the California Departments of Food and Agriculture, Consumer Affairs and Public Health regulations; and the wholesale distribution and storage of marijuana products;
- **b.** The Marijuana Production Facility operations would include the extraction, testing, manufacturing and distribution of cannabis products to State of California licensed marijuana outlets;
- c. Off-street parking; and
- **d.** Public and private accessory improvements determined by the Development Services Department to be consistent with the land use and development standards for this site in

accordance with the adopted community plan, the California Environmental Quality Act [CEQA] and the CEQA Guidelines, the City Engineer's requirements, zoning regulations, conditions of this Permit, and any other applicable regulations of the SDMC.

### **STANDARD REQUIREMENTS:**

- 1. This permit must be utilized within thirty-six (36) months after the date on which all rights of appeal have expired. If this permit is not utilized in accordance with Chapter 12, Article 6, Division 1 of the SDMC within the 36 month period, this permit shall be void unless an Extension of Time has been granted. Any such Extension of Time must meet all SDMC requirements and applicable guidelines in effect at the time the extension is considered by the appropriate decision maker. This permit must be utilized by August 30, 2021.
- 2. This Conditional Use Permit [CUP] and corresponding use of this site shall expire on August 30, 2023. Upon expiration of this Permit, the facilities and building improvements described herein shall be removed from this site and the property shall be restored to its original condition preceding approval of this Permit.
- 3. No permit for the construction, occupancy, or operation of any facility or improvement described herein shall be granted, nor shall any activity authorized by this Permit be conducted on the premises until:
  - a. The Owner/Permittee signs and returns the Permit to the Development Services Department; and
  - b. The Permit is recorded in the Office of the San Diego County Recorder.
- 4. While this Permit is in effect, the subject property shall be used only for the purposes and under the terms and conditions set forth in this Permit unless otherwise authorized by the appropriate City decision maker.
- 5. This Permit is a covenant running with the subject property and all of the requirements and conditions of this Permit and related documents shall be binding upon the Owner/Permittee and any successor(s) in interest.
- 6. The continued use of this Permit shall be subject to the regulations of this and any other applicable governmental agency.
- 7. Issuance of this Permit by the City of San Diego does not authorize the Owner/Permittee for this Permit to violate any Federal, State or City laws, ordinances, regulations or policies including, but not limited to, the Endangered Species Act of 1973 [ESA] and any amendments thereto (16 U.S.C. § 1531 et seq.).
- 8. The Owner/Permittee shall secure all necessary building permits. The Owner/Permittee is informed that to secure these permits, substantial building modifications and site improvements

may be required to comply with applicable building, fire, mechanical, and plumbing codes, and State and Federal disability access laws.

- 9. Construction plans shall be in substantial conformity to Exhibit "A." Changes, modifications, or alterations to the construction plans are prohibited unless appropriate application(s) or amendment(s) to this Permit have been granted.
- 10. All of the conditions contained in this Permit have been considered and were determined necessary to make the findings required for approval of this Permit. The Permit holder is required to comply with each and every condition in order to maintain the entitlements that are granted by this Permit.

If any condition of this Permit, on a legal challenge by the Owner/Permittee of this Permit, is found or held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unenforceable, or unreasonable, this Permit shall be void. However, in such an event, the Owner/Permittee shall have the right, by paying applicable processing fees, to bring a request for a new permit without the "invalid" conditions(s) back to the discretionary body which approved the Permit for a determination by that body as to whether all of the findings necessary for the issuance of the proposed permit can still be made in the absence of the "invalid" condition(s). Such hearing shall be a hearing de novo, and the discretionary body shall have the absolute right to approve, disapprove, or modify the proposed permit and the condition(s) contained therein.

The Owner/Permittee shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City, its agents, officers, and employees from any and all claims, actions, proceedings, damages, judgments, or costs, including attorney's fees, against the City or its agents, officers, or employees, relating to the issuance of this permit including, but not limited to, any action to attack, set aside, void, challenge, or annul this development approval and any environmental document or decision. The City will promptly notify Owner/Permittee of any claim, action, or proceeding and, if the City should fail to cooperate fully in the defense, the Owner/Permittee shall not thereafter be responsible to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City or its agents, officers, and employees. The City may elect to conduct its own defense, participate in its own defense, or obtain independent legal counsel in defense of any claim related to this indemnification. In the event of such election, Owner/Permittee shall pay all of the costs related thereto, including without limitation reasonable attorney's fees and costs. In the event of a disagreement between the City and Owner/Permittee regarding litigation issues, the City shall have the authority to control the litigation and make litigation related decisions, including, but not limited to, settlement or other disposition of the matter. However, the Owner/Permittee shall not be required to pay or perform any settlement unless such settlement is approved by Owner/Permittee.

### **BUILDING OFFICIAL REQUIREMENTS:**

12. Prior to the commencement of operations granted by this Permit, the Owner/Permittee shall obtain a change of use/occupancy building permit consistent with all California Codes and Regulations in effect at the time of building permit, satisfactory to the Building Official.

### **ENGINEERING REQUIREMENTS:**

- 13. Prior to the issuance of any building permits, the Owner/Permittee shall assure, by permit and bond, the removal and replacement of the existing uplifted and damaged sidewalk, curb & gutter, per current City Standards, adjacent to the site on Trade Street, satisfactory to the City Engineer.
- 14. Prior to the issuance of any building permits, the Owner/Permittee shall assure, by permit and bond, the reconstruction of the two existing driveways, 30 feet wide each, per current City Standards, adjacent to the site on Trade Street, satisfactory to the City Engineer.
- 15. Prior to the issuance of any building permits, the Owner/Permittee shall obtain an Encroachment Maintenance Removal Agreement, from the City Engineer, for the one (1) curb outlet (D-25), landscape & irrigation, and backflow preventer in the Trade Street Right-of-Way.
- 16. Prior to the issuance of any construction permit, the Owner/Permittee shall incorporate Construction and Permanent Storm Water Best Management Practices necessary to comply with current City of San Diego Storm Water Standards Manual and with Chapter 14, Article 2, Division 1 (Grading Regulations) of the SDMC, into the construction plans or specifications, satisfactory to the City Engineer.
- 17. Prior to the issuance of any construction permit the Owner/Permittee shall submit a Water Pollution Control Plan (WPCP). The WPCP shall be prepared in accordance with the guidelines in Part 2 Construction BMP Standards Chapter 4 of the City's Storm Water Standards.

### PLANNING/DESIGN REQUIREMENTS:

- 18. All operations shall be conducted indoors within a secured structure. All equipment and storage shall be also located within a secure structure.
- 19. Lighting shall be provided to illuminate the immediate surrounding area of the facility, including parking lots and adjoining sidewalks. Lighting shall be hooded or oriented to deflect light away from adjacent properties.
- 20. Security shall include operable cameras, alarms, and a security guard. The security guard shall be licensed by the State of California and be present on the premises during business hours. The security guard shall only be engaged in activities related to providing security for the facility, except on an incidental basis.
- 21. The name and emergency contact telephone number of an operator or manager shall be posted outside the marijuana production facility in a location visible to the public from the public right-of-way in character size at least two inches in height. The permittee shall provide this contact information to the San Diego Police Department. The operator or manager shall also be available 24 hours a day to address public nuisance complaints and interact with local, state, and federal law enforcement authorities. Other than the contact information, a marijuana production facility shall limit signage on the exterior of the property visible from the public right-of-way to the address.
- 22. A permit shall be obtained as required pursuant to Chapter 4, Article 2, Division 15.

- 23. The retail sale of marijuana and marijuana products shall only be conducted by a marijuana outlet in accordance with Section 141.0504. A marijuana production facility is prohibited from providing marijuana and marijuana products to any person other than another marijuana production facility, a testing lab, or a marijuana outlet.
- 24. The marijuana production facility, adjacent public sidewalks, and areas under the control of the marijuana production facility shall be maintained free of litter and graffiti at all times.
- 25. The Owner/Permittee shall provide daily removal of trash, litter, and debris. Graffiti shall be removed from the premises within 24 hours.
- 26. The Owner/Permittee shall provide an odor absorbing ventilation and exhaust system capable of minimizing excessive or offensive odors emanating outside of the permitted facility, to the satisfaction of the Development Services Department.

### **BRUSH MANAGEMENT REQUIREMENTS**

- 27. The Owner/Permittee shall implement the following requirements in accordance with the Brush Management Program shown on Exhibit "A", Brush Management Plan, on file in the Office of the Development Services Department.
- 28. Prior to issuance of any construction permits, a complete set of Brush Management Construction Documents shall be submitted for approval to the Development Services Department and the Fire Marshall. The construction documents shall be in substantial conformance with Exhibit "A" and shall comply with the Uniform Fire Code, M.C. 55.0101; the Land Development Manual, Landscape Standards; and the Land Development Code, Landscape Regulations Section 142.0412 (Ordinance 19413).
- 29. Within Zone One, combustible accessory structures, including, but not limited to decks, trellises, gazebos, et cetera, shall not be permitted while non-combustible accessory structures may be approved within the designated Zone One area, subject to Fire Marshall and Development Services Department approval.
- 30. Prior to final inspection, the approved Brush Management Program shall be implemented. The Brush Management Program shall be maintained at all times in accordance with the City of San Diego's Land Development Manual, Landscape Standards.

### TRANSPORTATION REQUIREMENTS

31. The automobile, motorcycle and bicycle parking spaces must be constructed in accordance with the requirements of the SDMC. All on-site parking stalls and aisle widths shall be in compliance with requirements of the City's Land Development Code and shall not be converted and/or utilized for any other purpose, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the appropriate City decision maker in accordance with the SDMC.

- 32. The Owner/Permittee shall provide and maintain a 10 foot by 10 foot visibility triangle area on both sides of each driveway measured along the property line along Trade Street. No obstacles higher than 36 inches shall be located within this area.
- 33. Eighteen parking spaces shall be provided for the project at all times.

#### INFORMATION ONLY:

- The issuance of this discretionary permit alone does not allow the immediate commencement or continued operation of the proposed use on site. Any operation allowed by this discretionary permit may only begin or recommence after all conditions listed on this permit are fully completed and all required ministerial permits have been issued and received final inspection.
- Any party on whom fees, dedications, reservations, or other exactions have been imposed as
  conditions of approval of this Permit, may protest the imposition within ninety days of the
