What is Going into Our Landfill?

Recent studies by the City show that the average single family household places in their black trash bin 350 lbs of recyclables, 600 lbs of yard trimmings and 400 lbs of food scraps annually. Please help conserve resources by placing recyclables in the blue bin; yard trimmings out for Greenery Collection, where offered; and by requesting a voucher for a discounted backyard compost bin. Applications for vouchers and information on backyard composting can be downloaded at www.recyclingworks.com or picked up at a Dixieline ProBuild location within the city limits.

The Miramar Greenery also offers other recycled landscape products such as, natural and colored wood chips, which are for sale to residents, businesses and landscapers. It is located within the Miramar Landfill at 5180 Convoy Street, off of Highway 52.

San Diego's Safe and Healthy Homes Project

This project is a **FREE** government funded program available to qualified* City residents. This program includes:



- Home safety, health repairs and upgrades
- Mold, asbestos and lead-based paint hazards removal
- Free smoke alarms, CO₂ alarms, grab bars and other home safety equipment
- Assistance in creating smoke free housing
- Attic insulation, gas water heater repair or replacement and the installation of compact fluorescent lamps
