



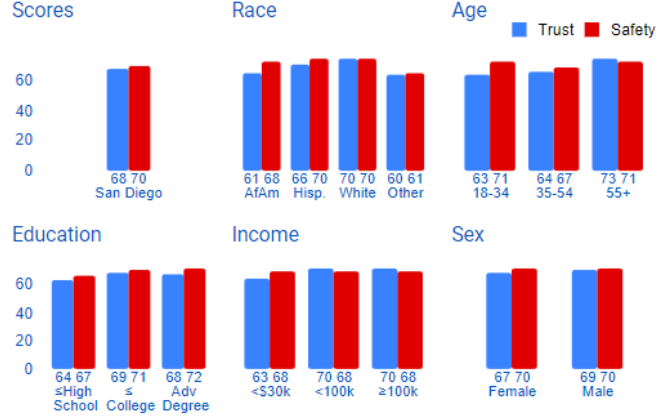

Summary

Citywide Trust (68) was stable and remained the same compared to January. Among the nine Divisions, the most significant changes in Trust scores were a 3-point decrease in Western (64), and a 2-point increase in Northern (73). Citywide Safety (70) was down by one point compared to January with 3-point drops for Southern (69) and Western (66).

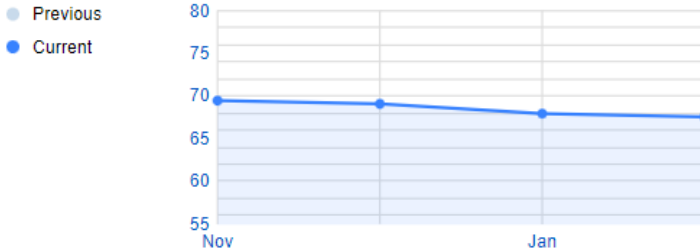
Citywide, the top concerns were Theft, Burglaries & Break-Ins (23%) followed by Homelessness and Streets & Traffic (22% for both).

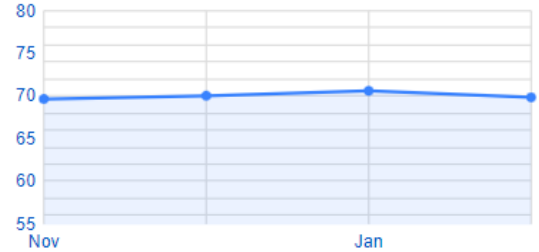

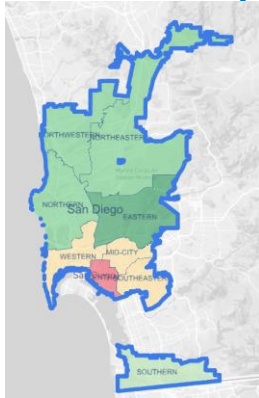

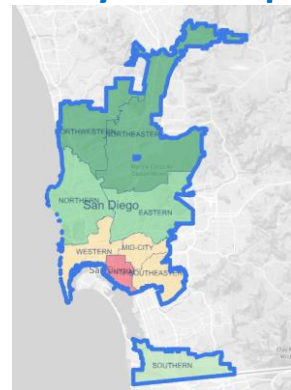

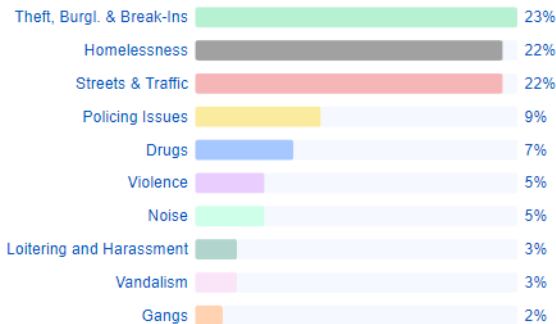
Trust Heatmap

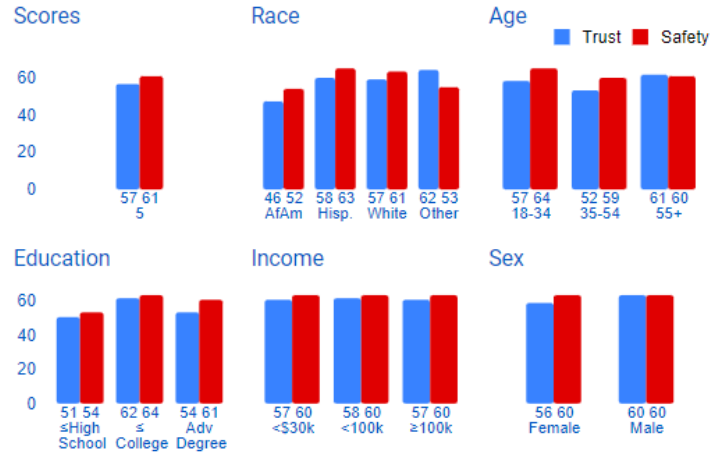

Summary

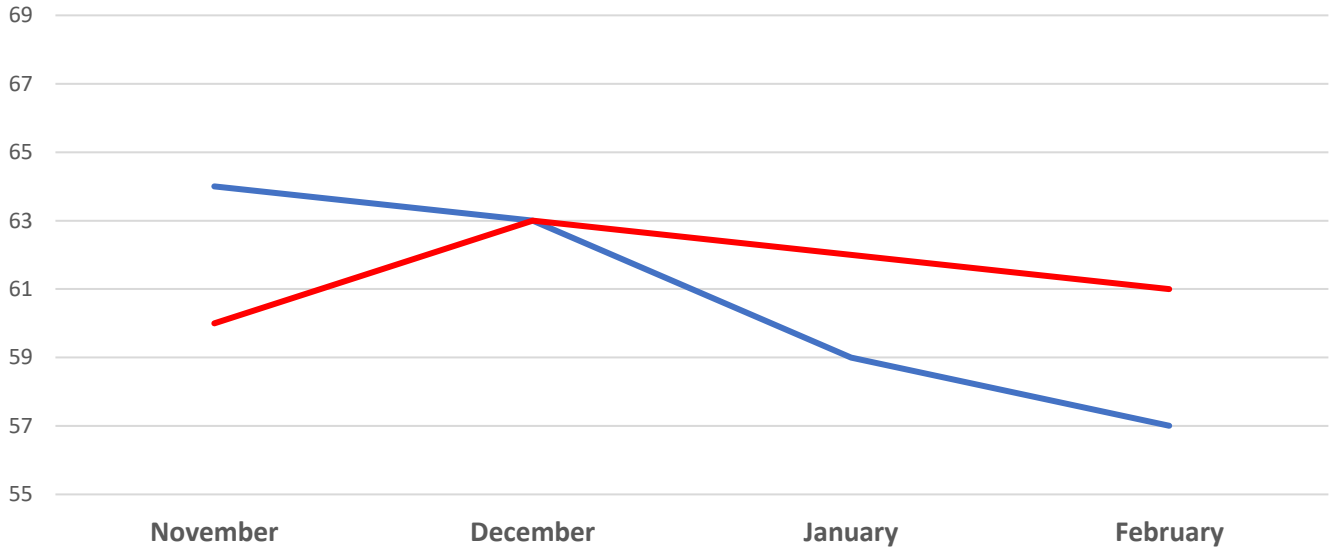
Trust for Central Division was down by 2 points compared to the previous month (57). Safety for the division was down by 1 point compared to the previous month (61).

Homelessness was by far the main concern for the division (40%, last month – 44%), followed by Theft, Burglary and Break-Ins and Drugs (both 14%).

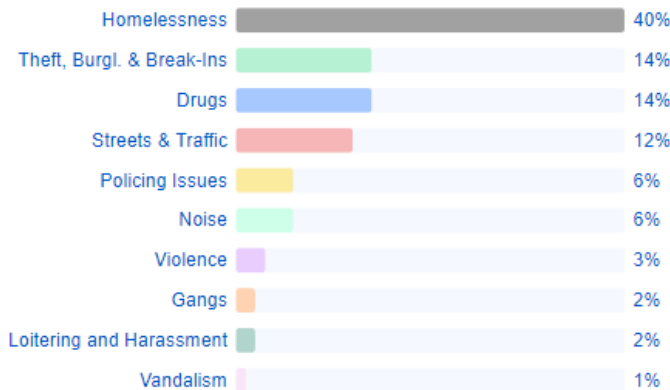

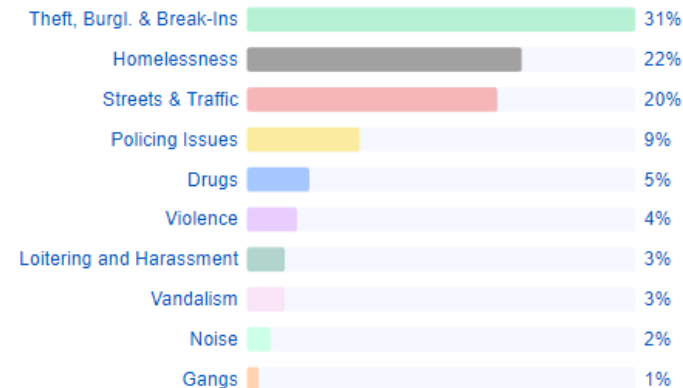

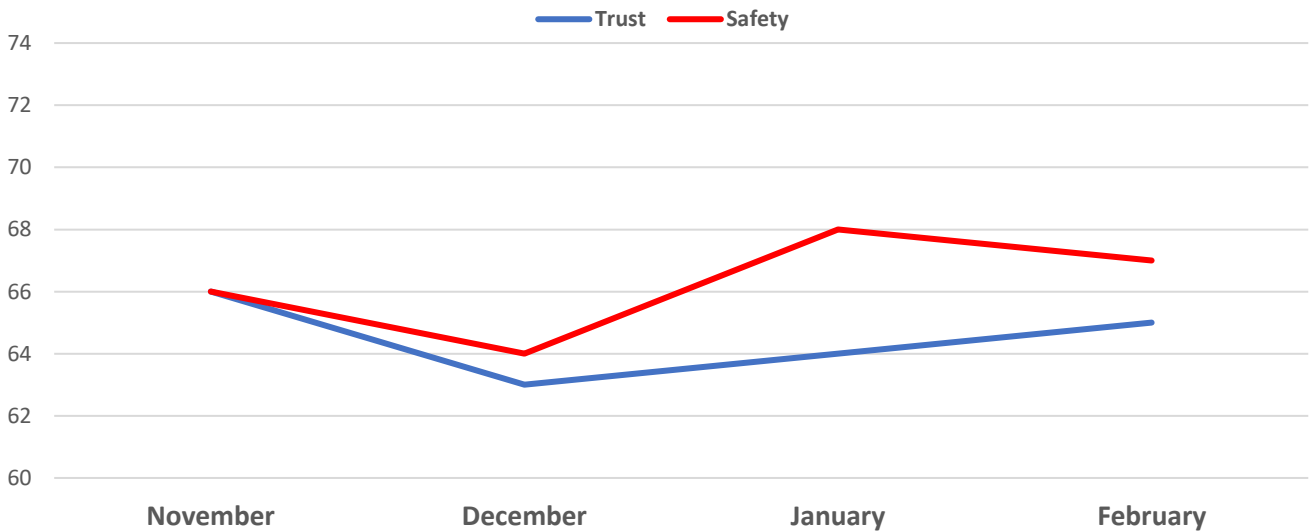

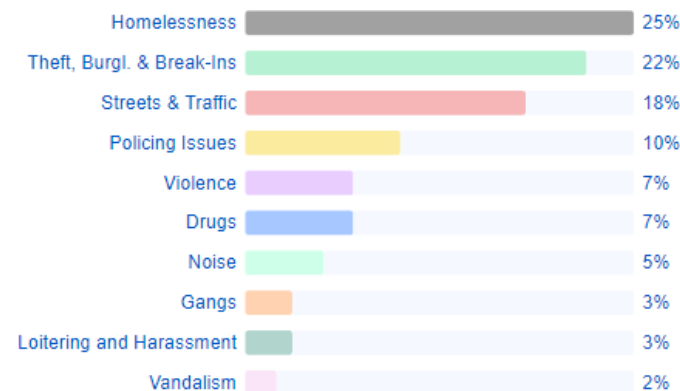

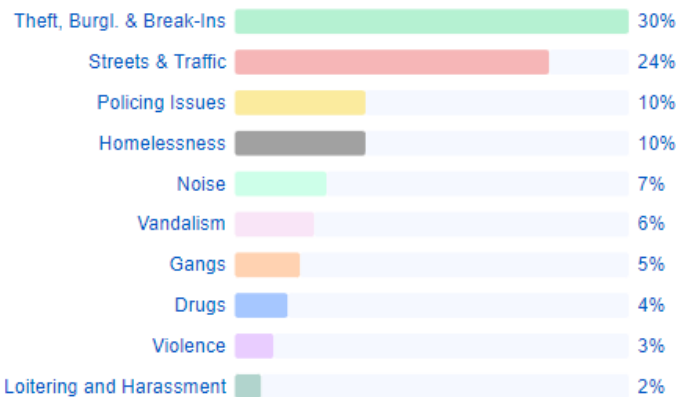

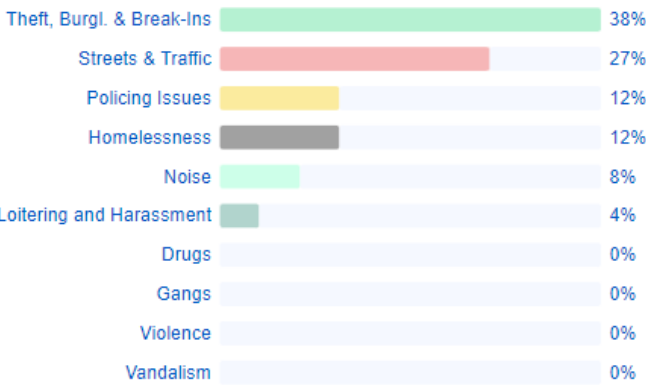

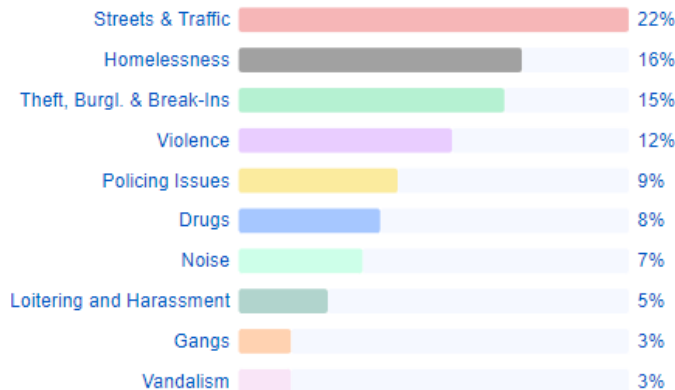

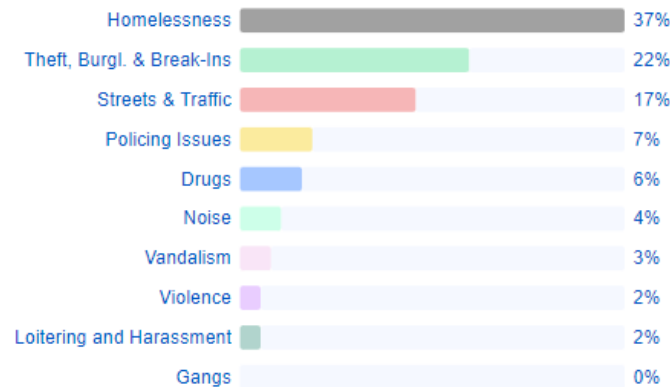
