Gentlemen:

Your proposal to furnish plans and specifications for the proposed Torrey Pines Lodge for a sum equal to five percent (5%) of the cost of the work, and to supervise the work for an additional sum equal to one percent (1%) thereof, has been accepted by the Board of Park Commissioners, who have authorized your employment in the capacity official architects.

Owing to the fact that a definite agreement in regard to the exact location of the proposed Lodge has not yet been reached by the several parties interested, and because the topography of the site eventually selected will be a factor in consideration of the type of structure desired, it is not possible to go ahead with the work at this time. It is hoped, however, that a site satisfactory to all will be found as soon as Mr. J.C. Harper returns to the city, probably within a few weeks.

A definite agreement relative to your professional services will be considered as soon as the final site is chosen.
