Gentlemen:

We hand you herewith;

- (1). "A plot plan for the treatment of the Torrey Pines Refectory and its site", by Ralph D. Cornell, of Los Angeles.
- (2). A four-page letter from Mr. Cornell to Mr. J.C. Harper, La Jolla, Cal., describing in some detail the "plot plan" and Mr. Cornell's idea of the manner in which the proposed refectory or Torrey Pines Lodge, as our office has designated it in the past, and surrounding landscape should be treated.

The Park Commissioners desire that your firm, as architects for the proposed Lodge, be familiar with Mr. Cornell's ideas on this subject as set forth in his plot plan and letter, and that, in the preparation of plans, you follow out his general scheme as nearly as is possible and consistent with your own ideas.

Doubtless you will not agree with him in all details, especially as Mr. Cornell states that he has had only meagre data with which to work. It also is probable that the more comprehensive plan suggested by Mr. Cornell will increase the cost of the building. In these cases, it is suggested that items of disagreement be submitted to this Board and through us to Mr. J.C. Harper.
