Replying to yours of Oct. 26th regarding letter of J. W. Wilson, wish to advise that we have taken the matter up with the architects, Messrs. Regua & Jackson, who state that Mr. Wilson merely placed his proposition in competition with others who wanted the work, and that there was absolutely no obligation on the part of the architects or the City to employ him or to use his equipment.

The part of the construction work which would embrace Mr. Wilson's plan is being done by Miss Ellen Scripps direct, and this question should be taken up with her representative, Mr. J. C. Harper of LaJolla, in case you feel that it should be taken further.

We feel sure that the City has no obligation, and are equally confident that Mr. Wilson has no claim upon Miss Scripps.
