Gentlemen:

Col. Ed Fletcher informs us that it will not be possible for telephone service to Torrey Pines Lodge to be taken from the private line serving Santa Fe Ranch, Del Mar Reservoir and other interests over which he has charge.

As it is of vital importance that the Torrey Pines Lodge have telephone service, we are compelled to urge that you interest yourself in our behalf, in order that some means of providing this service be found.

We wish to present for your consideration a suggestion received by this office to the effect that a line might be run to the Lodge from the City Farm. Whether this plan is practical or not we have no means of knowing.

The Lodge will be formally opened within a short time, probably during January of 1923, and lack of telephone facilities would greatly hamper the service which we hope to render the public at this point.

Mr. Morley, superintendent of parks, the park commissioners or the executive secretary will be pleased at any time to meet you in regard to this matter, in order that this department may co-operate with you in the finding of a solution to the problem confronting us.

Thanking you for your interest in the matter, and trusting that you may find it possible to furnish service at Torrey Pines Lodge at an early date, we are,
