My dear Mr. Klauber:-

I hand you herewith copy of a letter from Mr. Jackson dated the 21st inst. in reply to mine of the 16th to him, of which I sent you a copy. The Park Board employed Mr. Jackson and I think that it should settle who should pay the extra cost of taking out the flush valve toilets and installing tank closets. Miss Scripps should not be asked to pay it; that much seems clear to me.

The flush valve toilets which were taken out should not be a total loss. Probably Mr. Jackson can help you obtain a salvage thereon and thereby reduce the net loss caused by the change.

Anyway, I ask you to have this matter promptly adjusted and advise me what is done.
