Dear Mr. Crandall:

Referring to our recent conversation about the 4-inch water main to Torrey Pines Lodge, I called on Mr. F. A. Rhodes and he verified the information you gave me.

The Park Department will in addition to Mr. Rhodes' portion of the cost add \$1900.00 to same, - this is all the funds we can spare, as the Art Gallery and the San Diego Museum have to be taken care of from now on from park funds. This has left the income for park maintenance in a very deplorable condition, with no money whatever for betterments. In fact, at the present time we are working with \$14,000.00 less than for year 1925, therefore you can realize our condition.

When Mr. Rhodes is ready to do his share, our contribution is available. In talking the pipe question over with Mr. Rhodes, he favored 4-inch wrought iron threaded pipe, as it is somewhat cheaper. I believe it is a mistake, as the little added cost for cast iron pipe will provide a more permanent water line for a location near the sea.

Excuse me for not writing sooner, - it had slipped my memory until Mr. Fleming mentioned it today.
