To the Voters of the
City of San Diego.

At the General Election to be held on November 4th, two propositions will appear on the ballot which have received the careful consideration of the members of the Park Commission of the City of San Diego; and the members concur in and endorse these two propositions.

Proposition No. 1 will abandon a portion of Torrey Pines Park for the location of a new grade at Torrey Pines. This new location is on the east side of Torrey Pines Park and has been located so as to conform to the recommendations of Mr. Ralph Connell, Landscape Architect, and also conform to the specifications necessary for the location of a State Highway.

In addition to the portion to be abandoned by the city, a strip has been given by Miss Ellen B. Scripps from lands owned by her, which will connect the road between Torrey Pines Park and City Lands to the north.

All parties who have been interested in the location of this road have agreed; and in conformance with the general agreement, we have approved, concurred in and endorsed this location and urge that each voter VOTE YES on the measure.

Proposition 2 has been endorsed by the members of the Park Commission as a necessary procedure to pave the unpaved portion of Sixth Street and Date Street.

At the present time, Sixth Street extends only to the eastern edge of the paved portion of the street and Date Street extends only to the northern edge of the paved portion of the street; and this abandonment will permit the City to pave the remainder of the streets.

This abandonment will not destroy any portion of the developed park area. The walk on the east side of Sixth Street lined by Cocco Plumosa Palms will remain under the jurisdiction of the park board and will not be given up for street purposes.

For the best interests of the City of San Diego we, therefore, urge upon the San Diego Voters to VOTE YES on this proposition.
