## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

## **SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT**

**PROJECT NAME:** Special Event Permit - 6th Annual Scoop San Diego Ice Cream Festival

**COMMUNITY PLAN AREA:** North Park

**COUNCIL DISTRICT: 3** 

LOCATION: North Park Mini Park, North Park Way, 29th St, 3812 29th St, San Diego, CA 92104

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Special Event Permit for an ice cream event that would include the temporary use of food vendor booths, entertainment, portable restrooms, tents, canopies, generators, recycling/trash containers, and tables, that would occur on North Park Way between 30th Street and Granada Avenue and would take place on June 23, 2024. A VIP Ice Cream Lounge (canopy tent) would be located in the North Park Mini Park on 29th Street next to the main festival on North Park Way on June 23, 2024. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 6 AM until 6 PM on June 23, 2024. Set-up for the event would occur from 6 AM until 10 AM, the event would occur from 11 AM until 4 PM, and dismantling would occur from 4 PM until 6 PM. There would be entertainment and sound amplification would occur from 10:30 AM until 4 PM.

Road and parking closures would occur on North Park Way between 30<sup>th</sup> Street to Granada Avenue, limited access 29<sup>th</sup> Street at North Park Way north to entrance of parking garage to 100 feet south from intersection of North Park Way, and limited access Granada Avenue at North Park Way from 6 AM until 6 PM on June 23, 2024.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

**ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:** Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee

**STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:** The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use

of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.
