





Trails, Overlooks, and Trailhead Pocket Parks


- Proposed overlooks & greenways to complement existing trails

Open Space and Conservation

- Charter 55 dedications to add additional protection
- 160+ acres proposed for dedication











Public Space Requirements

- Development on a premise over 25,000 sq. ft. required to provide public space
- Must provide amenities based on size
- Must be publicly accessible
