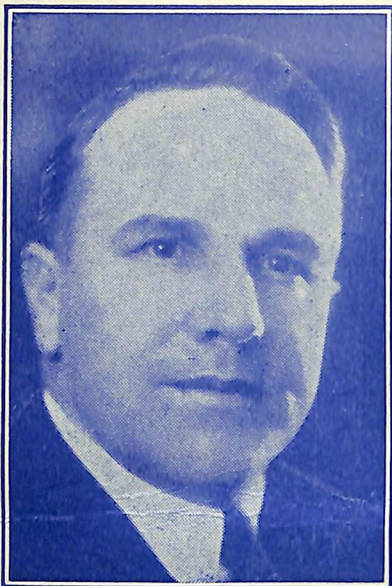

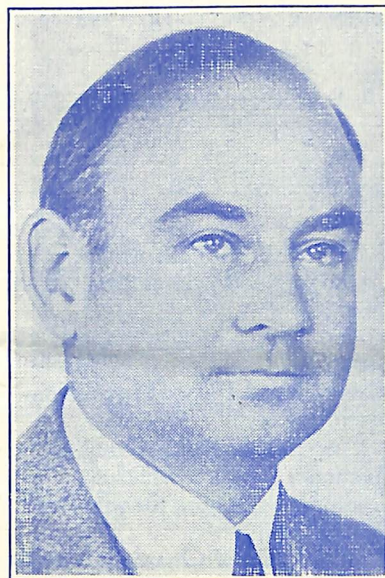
Greetings to the Members of the California Sewage Works Association on the occasion of their Tenth Annual Spring Conference.

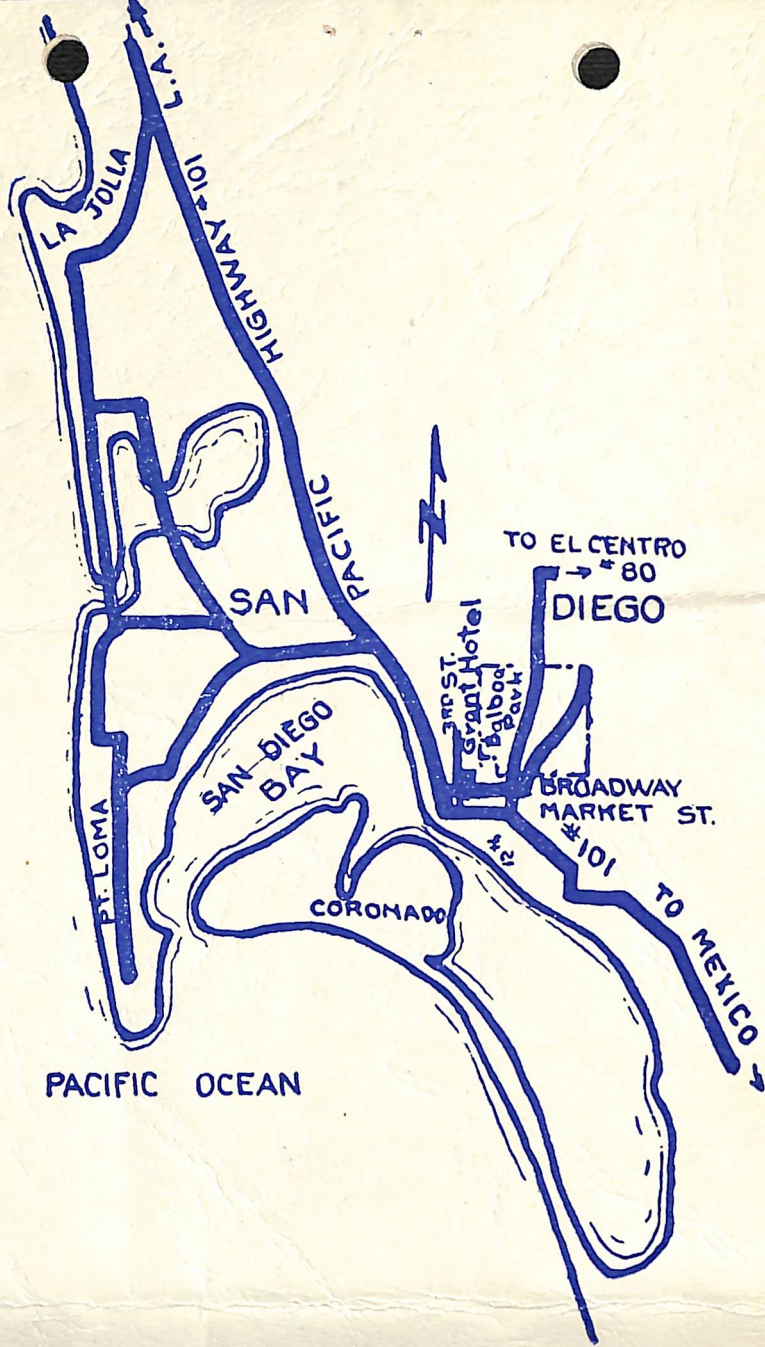
