SAN DIEGO POLICE DEPARTMENT

- On 5/21/24 is coffee with a cop event per flyer.
- Gun buyback drive through program will be held on 6/8/24 at the Jacobs Center from 10 am 2 pm. Gift cards will be provided until they run out of \$100 for hand guns and \$200 for assault rifles. Total of 184 gift cards right now. 302 guns were recovered (including 15 assault rifles) at the last gun buyback in 2019.
- 12 shootings in SE in 2024 so far, including 1 homicide, but none in April 2024.
 There was 1 shooting in May at an unoccupied vehicle. 48 guns have been recovered in 2024.

 City Budget: The May Revise was released and the budget also provides funding for the following programs:

Parks and Recreation: Teen center programming in Districts 4, 8 and 9 (\$758,000), youth swimming (\$421,000) and Come Play Outside (\$78,000), an initiative launched by Mayor Gloria in 2021 that helps provide low- or no-cost programs and events in historically disadvantaged communities.

SD Access 4 All: Wi-Fi access (\$500,000), library hotspot checkouts (\$227,000), digital literacy programming (\$57,000)

Libraries: Youth service librarian positions (\$382,000), after-school programs (\$250,000), library materials donation match program (\$300,000)

Climate Equity Fund: Traffic-signal upgrades to improve safety in Barrio Logan and traffic-calming measures on 47th Street in Chollas View (\$1.1 million)

No Shots Fired, a collaborative effort to provide outreach and resources to known gang members in specific communities and offer them an opportunity for them to exit gang life (\$250,000). **San Carlos Library** construction planning (\$4.7 million)

San Diego Police Department: Juvenile Services Team (\$1.6 million), front counter staffing (\$1.6 million)

New Business Items

- 1. Tara Ryan, Program Coordinator with the City of San Diego's Department of Child Care, presented a draft of the City's childcare placement concepts in compliance with Measure H. There is a proposal to place a prefabricated modular building for childcare on the north side of Mountain View Park which would cost about \$600,000, not including operating costs. Southcrest is another location which is planned, at the teen center, when funding is available. There is no funding available or budgeted at this time for any childcare at any park facilities.
- 2. Park & Rec community event recap
 - Earth Day was on 4/27/24 and well attended.
 - LAC and FEMA are done at the rec center
 - The Cooper Family Juneteenth event is on Saturday, 6/15/24, and Mountain View Park Juneteenth event will be on Saturday, June 22nd run by Lanell Brown and Jeffrey Hayes.
 - There will be a resource fair for homeless at Willie Hednerson Park on 5/17/24 from 9 am to 1:30 pm
- 3. For next meeting, CRG wanted to discuss priorities for 2024, such as Juneteenth on 6/22/24 and an OG Picnic on 9/2/24 during Labor Day

weekend. Imani Robinson proposed applying for another park grant, in addition to the \$2,300 she received last year that has not yet been implemented. She advised she would submit a proposal to the CRG for review so that it could be agendized.
