Victim Identified in Suspicious Death of Male in Oak Park

San Diego – On June 17, 2024, at approximately 12:25 a.m., Officers from Southeastern Division responded to 2500 Euclid Avenue on a report of an injured male down on the sidewalk at that location. Upon arriving, they located a male suffering from at least one stab wound to his upper body as well as a female who was apparently attempting to assist the injured male and a citizen who called 9–1–1 after seeing the male on the ground bleeding. Officers and Medics from the San Diego Fire-Rescue Department immediately began first aid on the male before he was transported to a local hospital for treatment. Unfortunately, despite the best efforts of officers and medical personnel, the male was pronounced deceased at the hospital a short time later. Due to unusual circumstances surrounding the death of the male and in an abundance of caution, San Diego Police Homicide Detectives were called to the scene to investigate.

It is still early in the investigation, and little is known about the circumstances leading up to the male's death. However, Detectives have learned there was some type of argument between the male and a female that occurred in a vehicle they were in. During that argument, a knife was present, and the male suffered a fatal stab wound. However, it is still unclear at this time what the exact events were that led up to the male being stabbed.

At this time, Detectives are still in the process of examining physical evidence from the scene, attempting to locate and interview witnesses and canvassing the area for surveillance footage that might provide more insight into the events leading up to the male's death. The male has been identified as Son Dinh of San Diego. He is described as a 50-year-old Asian male. The female that was involved in the argument has been identified but her identity is not being released at this time. Currently, the female's role in this incident is still being evaluated.
