Wednesday, July 16 from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Participants will meet at Morley Field Day two will take participants to Morley Field where they'll be able to take a class or enjoy a walk, followed by a picnic and enjoy picnic games.

A DAY IN THE GARDEN

Thursday, July 17 from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Participants will meet at Park de la Cruz

The final day will close out camp in the Park de la Cruz garden, creating plant crafts, harvesting produce, and creating delicious and healthy snacks.
