City of San Diego Celebrates King-Sized Success of Mattress Recycling Program

ILLEGAL DUMPING DOWN 34% AS MORE THAN 14,000 MATTRESSES AND BOX SPRINGS HAVE BEEN DIVERTED FROM THE LANDFILL

SAN DIEGO – After just one year, the City of San Diego is celebrating the success of its <u>Mattress Recycling</u> <u>Program</u> in helping divert items from the landfill. Over the past year, more than 14,000 unwanted mattresses and box springs have been diverted – lined up end to end, that's the equivalent of 311 football fields! Illegal dumping of these bulky items has decreased by 34%.

"We are thrilled about the public's enthusiastic participation in our Mattress Recycling Program," said Julie Sands, Recycling Program Manager, City of San Diego's ESD. "San Diegans are keeping our communities cleaner by helping us to reduce waste and keep these bulky items out of the landfill or, worse yet, on the side of the road."

San Diegans can drop off unwanted mattresses and box springs for free, Monday through Friday at the City's Mattress Collection Site just outside the Miramar Landfill entrance. The City collects the units and sends them to a processing facility in Ontario, where they are broken down into four main components (steel, foam, fibers and wood), which are used to make hundreds of new products such as construction rebar, carpet padding, insulation and mulch.

The program – which supports the City's <u>Climate Action Plan</u> and <u>Zero Waste Plan</u> goals - is made possible thanks to the <u>Mattress Recycling Council</u>, which recycles 1.4 million mattresses per year statewide.

Mattress collection hours are 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays (closed Saturdays and Sundays). Mattresses and box springs must not be severely damaged, wet, twisted, soiled or infested with bedbugs. Residents are allowed to drop off up to 10 units per trip, per day. More information is available at <u>RecyclingWorks.com</u>
