# Item 8: Amending the San Diego Municipal Code to Increase Ethics Commission Fines

This item is noticed for discussion and possible action.

The Executive Director will present draft language to amend the San Diego Municipal Code to increase the amount of the maximum fine per count that the Ethics Commission may impose in an enforcement matter. Among other amendments, the language would increase the maximum fine per count from \$5,000 to \$15,000. This would be the same amount, with the proposal to use the same language, as that now proposed for the Los Angeles Ethics Commission. Amendments would also allow for other options for further increased fines, depending on the facts of a given case.

Amendments to the San Diego Municipal Code regarding fines were also introduced by the City Attorney in her Ethics Reform package in March 2024.
