SIGNIFICANT EVENTS, PEOPLE AND PLACES

On September 14, 1984, three San Diego Police officers were shot at Grape St. Park. Officer Timothy Ruopp encountered two adults with two underage girls where alcohol present. Officer Ruopp requested back up and Officer Kimberly Tonahill responded. As Officer Tonahill was patting down one of the suspects he opened fired, shooting her 4 times. The suspect then walked up and execution style, shot Officer Ruopp. Office Gary Mitrovich was on his way to the park when he heard gunshots, he was seriously wounded having been shot in the shoulder. Officer Tonahill died that night, Officer Ruopp died two days later. Officer Mitrovich survived. Officer Tonahill was a rookie officer with eight months on the job. She was 24yrs old. Officer Ruopp was 31yrs old, married with four young children. A community effort is underway to erect a Fallen Officers' Memorial in honor of Officers Ruopp and Tonahill. After an extensive overnight search, the suspect who had been hiding in the brush nearby, was found, apprehended & taken into custody.

OUTSTANDING INDIVIDUALS

Kimberly S. Tonahill, Timothy J. Ruopp, Gary Mitrovich, along with all the brave men and women San Diego Police Officers who risked their lives looking the armed suspect. Would like to have the park renamed "Tonahill – Ruopp Park" along with information pertaining to the events which occurred at the park on Sept. 14th, 1984, to include Officer Gary Mitrovich's name.

<mark>HONORING THE FALLEN OFFICERS - WHY DO WE WANT THE PARK</mark> <u>RENAMED</u>

The following is why we feel so strongly about renaming the Park to "Tonahill-Ruopp Park"

<u>Kathleen Ruopp, widow of Officer Tim Ruopp</u> – Tim wanted to become a K-9 officer, so the dog park is appropriate. Tim and I fell in love in Balboa Park, and he had a little apartment there near Grape Street.

Tamee Tonahill, sister of Officer Kimberly Tonahill - Kim aimed to make San Diego a safer place for EVERYONE, no matter their race, gender, or socio-economic background. She strived to make a positive difference in the lives of all who are lucky enough to call this beautiful city home. Kim's family, friends, as well as those of Officer Ruopp, and all who loved them want to make sure Kim and Timothy are remembered in a positive light. We want people to remember their names and remember the sacrifices they made for this city and all who reside. What better way to honor the two brave souls who gave their lives protecting the people of San Diego than to rename the park.

<u>Gary Mitrovich, surviving SDPD Officer</u> - It's important that Tim and Kim be recognized, so the citizens of San Diego can appreciate and honor their loss and their sacrifice. The officers' unselfish commitment to the people and city in which they served requires they be remembered. Tim and Kim made a selfless choice to become police officers and do the job required of them – to help people and the community. They knew the risks but did their jobs in a professional and humanistic manner.
