Hello neighbors,

Well, it's official: May Gray and June Gloom are gone, and the summer is officially here! I hope this beautiful San Diego weather is treating you well and that you are able to enjoy some quality time with your loved ones.

The changing weather is also bringing a new budget. On June 11, the City Council approved the City of San Diego's budget for the 2024–2025 fiscal year. Simply put, the theme of this final budget was protecting programs proven to work! The City Council voted to reverse proposed cuts and grow funding for vital housing, homelessness, and community programs. Our neighborhoods rely on these services — and we fought to protect them.

As Chair of the City Council's Budget Committee, I also worked this year to make public input easier — and these modifications reflect the feedback you gave us. Our final budget amendments focused on:

- Expediting pothole repairs
- Fixing some of San Diego's most dangerous intersections
- Youth care & development centers
- Library materials
- Rent assistance to prevent San Diegans from becoming homeless
- Outreach to reduce street homelessness
- Expansion and replacement of emergency shelter
- Direct support for victims of the January 2024 floods
- Community projects to help address climate change impacts
- \$1 million for small business grants and support
- \$900,000 for small nonprofit grants
- \$150,000 for long-awaited streetlights in District 6



I'm grateful to City Council President Sean Elo-Rivera for introducing these final budget amendments with me, and to my City Council colleagues for unanimously supporting it. These additions are on top of many of the positive recommendations from Mayor Gloria, including major investments in road repair, infrastructure, public safety, and reducing homelessness. I look forward to seeing this budget in action in Fiscal Year 2025, which just began on July 1.

My family and our office look forward to seeing you at the various 4th of July celebrations happening in our district! From the Mira Mesa picnic and fireworks on July 3rd, to the Scripps Ranch 4th of July Parade and the University City 4th of July Celebration (details below!), make sure to stop by and say hello!

COASTER Connection Update

We recently celebrated the expansion of the North County Transit District (NCTD) Sorrento Valley COASTER routes with the COASTER Connection. This service isn't just a convenience; it's crucial for San Diego's economy, helping thousands of workers commute by providing a much-needed last-mile connection.



NCTD has stepped up in a big way and will not only continue service that was scheduled to be discontinued but also expand routes from the COASTER to improve connectivity to major employment hubs serving University City, Torrey Pines, Sorrento Mesa, and UC San Diego — including many of San Diego's largest employers in the life sciences and technology industries. This change also promotes cleaner, greener transportation for our region.
