Update on Point Loma Shooting; Suspect Identification

San Diego – A man and woman were found dead as a result of a shooting that occurred in the 3600 block of Zola St. in the Point Loma area on Wednesday afternoon. A third victim was found at the residence suffering from gunshot wounds. A 60-year-old male suspect was taken into custody as San Diego Police Homicide Unit investigates the incident.

On August 21, 2024, at approximately 3:55 p.m. the San Diego Police Communications Center received a report of the shooting. SDPD Western Division officers responded and located three victims suffering from gunshot wounds at a residence. Unfortunately, two of the victims were pronounced deceased at the scene. They appear to be a white woman approximately in her 60s and a white man approximately in his 30s. Detectives are working with the Medical Examiner to identify these victims. There will be no confirmed identifications any earlier than Friday, August 23, 2024.

The third victim is described as a white female in her 80s. She had walked out to the street as officers arrived. Officers began rendering medical aid until paramedics arrived and transported her to a local hospital with serious injuries. At this point, this victim is in stable condition and is expected to survive her injuries.

As officers arrived, there was a 60-year-old white man at the front of the house, who was taken into custody by officers. Near the front of the house where he was contacted, officers located what appears to be a shotgun. No other suspect was believed to be involved in this incident. This suspect is now identified as William Bushey. He was booked into County Jail for two counts of murder and one count of attempted murder. Bushey is the son of the surviving victim and they both live at the residence.
