## Following Councilmember Campillo's Leadership to Eliminate Red Tape, Father Joe's Villages to Announce New Detox Facility at Downtown Site

WHAT: At the site of Father Joe's Villages' new detox facility, which specifically serves

San Diegans experiencing homelessness, Councilmember Raul Campillo will explain the need for additional behavioral health capacity in San Diego and walk reporters through the policy changes that he championed that led to this point. Deacon Jim Vargas will enumerate the specifics of the new facility and discuss why Father Joe's Villages is making this change. Councilmember Whitburn, whose Council District this facility is in, and Marisa Varond will give additional

context on homelessness and behavioral health.

**WHY:** Councilmember Raul Campillo led the effort to update the Land Development

Codes (LDC) to eliminate barriers and red tape for building behavioral health facilities across San Diego. Because of these changes, Father Joe's Villages is able to provide 45 detox beds at their new facility for low-income patients. These beds are sorely needed in San Diego; since 2019, over 1772 people have died of fentanyl-related deaths in San Diego County. The 45 new beds at the Father Joe's

site represent a 2250% increase on the current number of Medi-Cal eligible beds

(2) in the City of San Diego.
