• **Anne Fege**: Urban Foresty advisory met last night, community needs being shared; feedback: City needs to advertise tree-planting contracts, initiatives to the community.



- **Olivia Mabee**: A quick debrief on our Arbor Day event at Memorial Community Park in Logan Heights 246 volunteers planted 114 trees, exceeding our goal of 100.
- Alix Aceituno: Registration is open until May 21 for UCP & Maxx Moses Shine 4ever program for youth, ages 16-24, creatives and artists; May 16 is Bike Anywhere Day, UCP is partnering with City San Diego Sustainability and Mobility Department for a pit stop at Malcom X Library, free SANDAG shirt and raffle for 3 e-bikes, can also sign up online; UCP will host a Regional Decarbonization Framework workshop on Thursday, June 13 from 5:30-7:30 pm at Malcolm X/Valencia Park Library.

## Kelly Wilkinson: San Diego Foundation, kwilkinson@sdfoundation.org

 Received \$6 million from ARPA to support communities most impacted by COVID-19. In March 2023 we awarded 43 grants to CBOs, incl. nine projects serving the San Diego Promise Zone. Based on recommendations from the County, community engagement sessions, and steering committee with FSA, \$\$\$ allocated for food production, community gardens, and parks with the goal to strengthen and scale community-led strategies to address food and nutrition insecurity with local solutions.

## Christina Abuelo: Leah's Pantry, School Garden Equity Initiative, garden@leahspantry.org

- Goals: Install or upgrade 15-20 school gardens, including 14 in the Promise Zone, and "backbone" support garden maintenance i.e. irrigation, growing beds (working with coharvest), provide garden education to students, "Swiss Chard in Your Yard" backyard gardening initiative, trainings for classroom teachers and garden educators.
- Elements: systems-thinking framework, deep engagement with schools, volunteer coordination, partnerships, unsexy back-end work.

## Izzy Rosado: Project New Village, Growers Network, izzyrosado@projectnewvillage.org

• Moving away from the current health systems to a collective. The Growers Network has monthly meetings where experts share information with community and neighborhood members and focus on climate-friendly practices, i.e. soil blocking.



• Mobile pantry truck has given away 2,120 pounds of hyper-locally grown food thus far in 2024. Opening up three garden spaces and greenhouse to add capacity for mobile pantry.

## Elisa Sabatini: Via International, Food Security, Elisa@viainternational.org

- 50 years of nutrition programs along border; this is the first time we have had funds accessible in San Diego. We are hosting a Spanish culinary course with Mountain View K-8 School done through outreach with mothers, partnered w/ Sherman Heights. Fifty parents registered, could only accept 15, expect to have another cohort soon. Many participants wanted to learn to open small businesses, started a business course.
- Pan y Paz Bakery Collective at Bread & Salt building, target April 2025, can create pipeline from culinary class to bakery.

Karen Clay: I Love to Glean, Chef De Cuisine – Education Foundation, info@ilovetoglean.org

• Commercial kitchen at 3708 Ocean View Blvd, expected completion date in Summer 2025. Will create holistic food hub, can store food, incl. for Fish to Families program, purchasing \$35,000 flash freezer and specialized cleaning to rapidly store and process fish to get to people who need it.

## Kayla Thompson: San Diego Food Bank, kthomson@sandiegofoodbank.org

• Collective action, funding local food producers, esp. farmers and fishers. Focus is on sustainability and creating more sustainable food systems, e.g. the cold chain. Get food in the hands of our community members and get direct feedback at distribution events, including Food Shed co-op.
