Construction Highlights

North City Pure Water Pipeline (NCPWP), Dechlorination Facility and Subaqueous Pipeline

In the Scripps Ranch & Miramar area for the North City Pure Water Pipeline (NCPWP), Dechlorination Facility and Subaqueous Pipeline project, pipeline construction is ongoing in Scripps Ranch on Businesspark Avenue, and on Miramar Road between Kearny Villa Road and Black Mountain Road and between Camino Ruiz and Miramar Mall. Additionally, the Pure Water Subaqueous Pipeline (or underwater pipeline) has been under construction at Miramar Reservoir. In January 2024, crews sunk the "spine" of the pipeline to the lakebed. Assembly of the "arms" and "legs" of the pipeline will continue underwater by specialized divers. On-water recreation at the reservoir is expected to reopen by September 2024.

University City

In University City for the <u>Morena Pipelines</u> <u>Northern Alignment and Tunnels</u> <u>project</u>, more than 50% of the pipelines for this project have been installed. Construction continues southbound between Renaissance Avenue and Nobel Drive. Work is ongoing during the day, Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and occasionally on Saturday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. This schedule is contingent on unforeseen circumstances like inclement weather.

Work is also continuing during the day on Genesee Avenue between Governor Drive and Centurion Square. Looking ahead on Genesee Avenue, once the base pavement has settled, crews will finish trench paving. Then the road will be striped according to standards set by the City of San Diego Transportation Department.


At the North City Water Reclamation

Plant, crews are making great progress on the secondary clarifier basins and the new Flow Equalization Basin, which will add 2.5 million gallons of storage to help equalize flow through the NCWRP treatment processes. Across the street, construction of the North City Pure Water Facility's 30,000 LEED-certified Operations Building is moving along. Once completed, the building will feature lab space and a Discovery Center for the public!

Clairemont, Bay Park & Morena

In Clairemont, Bay Ho, Bay Park & Morena for the <u>Morena Pump Station project</u>, the contractor has poured concrete for the lower levels of the pump station and will begin to form the walls for the lower levels of the structure. The contractor has also started a soil freezing operation at the diversion structure located at the Friars Road and Napa Street intersection. Soil freezing is an innovative technique that stabilizes soil and improves site condition to ensure continued progress on the project.

For the Morena Conveyance South & Middle and Bike Lanes project, crews

installed a new traffic control alignment and have a second crew working on Clairemont Drive. Two separate crews are installing one 48-inch wastewater pipeline and one 30-inch brine pipeline along Clairemont Drive, near Dakota Drive and near Hartford Street. In early March, work began at the intersection of Morena Boulevard and Sherman Street. Crews will be working at night to install the 48-inch and 30-inch pipelines under the roadway, moving north from the intersection along West Morena Boulevard.

Community Events


