NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit - San Diego Veterans Day Parade

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Downtown

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 3

LOCATION: W Grape & N Harbor Drive

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for that portion within the City's right-of-way jurisdiction of the annual Veterans' Day Parade that would include marching veterans' organizations, military units, civic organizations, bands, floats, stages, tents, temporary structures, bleachers, sound amplification, performances, animals, portable restrooms, trash/recycling containers, and youth organizations that would occur along Harbor Drive on November 11, 2024. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/ dismantling would occur from 8 AM on November 10, 2024, until 5:30 PM on November 11, 2024. Set-up would occur from 8 AM until 7 PM on November 10, 2024, and from 5 AM until 10:55 AM on November 11, 2024. The event would occur from 11 AM until 12:30 PM, and dismantling would occur from 12:30 PM until 5:30 PM on November 11, 2024. The expected number of attendees would be approximately 10.000. Parade would start in front of the County Admin Building near the corner of W Grape & Harbor Drive. The parade would travel southbound going past the USS Midway Museum before making a left on Pacific Highway. The parade would disband on W. E, F & G Streets off Pacific Highway.

Road and parking closures would be associated with the event and would include N Harbor Drive between Grape and Pacific Highway, and Pacific Highway between Harbor and Broadway, from 8:30 AM until 1:30 PM on November 11, 2024.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing,

licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.
