



CHICANO POP-UP ART EXHIBIT

On Sept. 16th, San Diego City Clerk Diana J.S. Fuentes invited the public to a pop-up art exhibit to showcase the Chicano Movement in San Diego. The exhibit, "Telling Our Stories: The Chicano Movement in San Diego," is a collaboration between the City Clerk Archives and The Chicano Park Museum and Cultural Center. The exhibit was shown in the lobby of the City Administration Building in Downtown San Diego.

The exhibit included documentarian-style photographs taken during the historic 1970 Chicano Park Takeover. Also on display were minisculptures of the Chicano Park mural freeway pillars. The murals of Chicano Park are one of San Diego's crown jewels in public art and one of the largest collections of Chicano art in the U.S. The exhibit wrapped up Oct. 18th.

CITY HALL UPDATES



#ONEJOBSHOULDBEENOUGH

On Sept. 17th, I voted in favor of Item S506 Resolution Supporting UNITE HERE! Local 30 Workers in their fight for fair and just negotiations for hotel and food service workers. Sept. 17th also marked day 17 of their labor strike for better wages in San Diego. As you may know, hospitality workers are the backbone of San Diego's tourism economy.

GET IT DONE/ SALESFORCE PLATFORM APPLICATION CONTRACT

On Sept. 10th, Council heard an item on the First Amendment to the Get It Done/Salesforce Application Contract. During the presentation, the Performance & Analytics Department (PandA) shared they would conduct outreach as they work on improvements for the system. I urged PandA to conduct more community outreach in District Four. The Get It Done app serves as the system of record for constituent requests and, therefore, must be user-friendly and a high-performing tool that can deliver data on our City's most pressing needs such as potholes, street repair, brush abatement and much more. Additional input on this app will help to prioritize the needs of the app's users. The Council voted to extend and expand the contract with Deloitte Consulting, which supports the Get It Done app.

2020 DISPARITY STUDY IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE

Also, on Sept. 10th, the Council received an update from the Purchasing and Contracting Department on the implementation of the 2020 Disparity Study Recommendations. The disparity study was commissioned to further address the disparities in city contracting with minority-owned firms and women-owned firms. Historically, the City of San Diego has awarded less than 1% of its contracts to African American firms. During the hearing, I strongly expressed my concerns with the delays in fully implementing the recommendations of the disparity study, specifically the unbundling of projects to allow greater opportunity and inclusion of our minority-owned and women-owned businesses. I also requested the Independent Budget Analyst provide an analysis of the resources needed to fully implement the recommendations. My office is committed to ensuring that leadership and staff remain focused on implementing these recommendations and ensuring economic opportunity for all.

THE LIBRARY PARKING MANAGEMENT CONTRACT


On Sept. 23rd, the Council heard an item on the Extension of the Parking Management Contract for the Central Library. Due to the underrepresentations noted in the proposed contractor's workforce report, I voted no on the contract and requested a compliance review be conducted. With my no vote, the item did not pass and was returned to staff. I strongly expressed concern regarding the lack of oversight of the City's Equal Employment Opportunity Outreach Program and indicated we must take the program seriously. The City of San Diego is obligated to ensure we are not doing business with firms that actively or passively participate in discriminatory hiring practices.

THE 2024 ANNUAL REPORT ON HOMES

Also, on Sept. 24th, the 2024 Annual Report on Homes was presented the City Council. The report provides a detailed update on the City of San Diego's progress in meeting housing needs citywide. It also monitors building permit activity and documents the affordability and location of new housing units coming online by income level.

I requested City staff return with a more defined plan to mitigate the concentration of poverty, specifically in District Four, as most housing units received are 100% deed-restricted affordable units. I stand committed to ensuring we continue to build a balanced and sustainable District. We must provide more housing opportunities for working families, such as our teachers and first responders. I look forward to working with all stakeholders on solutions for fair and equitable development in San Diego, especially in District Four.


