APPEAL THE DECISION OF THE HEARING OFFICER FOR SHELL OIL PRODUCTS COMPANY. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT 96-0714 TO ALLOW THE ADDITION OF A 900 SQUARE FOOT CAR WASH TO AN EXISTING AUTOMOBILE SERVICE STATION LOCATED AT 2485 CORONADO AVENUE.

Patrick Hooper presented the status of this project since it was last continued from September 11, 1997.

Testimony in favor of the project by:

Stephen Hogie, representing Shell Oil. Stated that he was surprised there was no individual finding that is required by the Supreme Court and that there is reliance on the 1979 Council policy that predates not only Dolan but also Nolan. It appears that staff is refusing or unable to make such a finding and it appears that this condition is illegal and unconstitutional. Requested that the appeal be denied and the project approved with all the other conditions.

Testimony in favor of the project:

Mark Linman, representing Nasland Family Trust. Gave background on this facility and that this was originally proposed in response to the Telecommunications Policy. Nasland has been approached by a number of providers requesting antenna or tower space at this location. In lieu of

processing individual applications, they elected to file for this facility which would accommodate a number of users, some of whom are already committed to the site.

Mindy Bruckner, representing Nextel Communications. Advised that Nextel needs to locate their antennas in this area and this facility will meet Nextel's coverage objective for this area and enhance their coverage. Space is extremely limited in this area. Understands that the City is encouraging consolidation of facilities and they feel this facility creates the harmony to do that.

Norman Stausell, representing JNB Telecommunications, Inc. Read a list of his company's clients into the record, and how this facility and its utilization will affect them. Spoke about deregulation and how these facilities will be metered wirelessly and they will need facilities like this to do this.

Public testimony was closed.
