# ITEM-1: ANNOUNCEMENTS/PUBLIC COMMENT - ISSUES WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE COMMISSION NOT PREVIOUSLY HEARD:

Matthew Adams with the Building Industry Association spoke to Assembly member Ducheny's bill, AB 2310. This bill speaks to development and infrastructure creation inside the coastal zone and the problems that litigation determination recently caused. Commissioner Skorepa requested that staff schedule a workshop to discuss this issue and invite the BIA and the environmentally-concerned community.

# ITEM-2: REQUESTS FOR CONTINUANCE.

Derrick Johnson, on behalf of the applicant, requested that Item No. 9, La Pacifica RV Park CUP be continued to August 10, 2000 to have an opportunity to meet with the property owners, specifically to speak to the time limit on the permit.

## ITEM-4: DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Angeles Leira spoke to the Vice-Chairperson Anderson's recent request regarding the City's historical designation process and historical sites within the City and how they related to national "landmark" designation. After discussion, staff suggested that a joint workshop with the Historical Resources Board and the Planning Commission potentially would be a good venue to discuss the incentives and disincentives issue further.

Commissioner Skorepa advised that the national conference of La Raza is holding their convention this weekend and will be conducting many workshops of interest, one of which is home ownership.

Chairperson Steele advised that he and Commissioner Stryker attended the Strategic Plan Framework workshop held on June 23, 2000 which they felt was very successful and encouraged everyone to attend a second workshop on this topic to be held on Friday, June 30. 2000.

Commissioner Butler reported that she was invited to attend the Housing Committee meeting of the San Diego Chamber of Commerce, along with Commissioner Stryker. Ms. Butler was specifically invited to brief their Housing Committee on the Strategic Framework planning process, and its status, more specifically how the City is addressing housing issues.
