- 2. ALL CONDOMINIUM AND OFFICE OWNERS BE PROVIDED A DISCLOSURE ADVISING OF THE PROXIMITY OF MIRAMAR'S FLIGHT PATH;
- 3. PRIOR TO ISSUANCE OF ANY OCCUPANCY PERMIT, THE OWNER/PERMITTEE SHALL SUBMIT FOR REVIEW AND APPROVAL A TRANSPORTATION DEMAND MANAGEMENT PROGRAM WITH MORE THAN BIKE RACKS AND SIDEWALKS TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE CITY MANAGER;
- 4. TO ENCOURAGE THE APPLICANT TO UTILIZE THE GREEN BUILDING TECHNOLOGY IN THE PROJECT DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION WHERE FEASIBLE;

- 5. ADD A FOOTNOTE TO THE UNIVERSITY COMMUNITY PLAN INDICATING THE TRANSFER OF ADT'S FROM THE REGENTS PARK SITE TO THE LA JOLLA COMMONS SITE;
- 6. INCLUDE ADDITIONAL FINDINGS TO THE STATEMENT OF OVERRIDING CONSIDERATIONS AS FOLLOWS: "BECAUSE THE PROJECT IS SUPERIOR PLANNING AND ARCHITECTURE, LANDSCAPING, A BUILDING PATTERN ESTABLISHED IN THE COMMUNITY AND CONTINUATION OF THAT PATTERN, PROVISION OF PUBLIC OPEN SPACE, PEDESTRIAN CONNECTIONS TO LA JOLLA VILLAGE DRIVE; PROVISION FOR THE LIGHT RAIL TRANSIT STOP; AND ADDITION OF EMPLOYMENT SPACE IN A MARKET THAT DEMANDS IT".
