San Diego Commission for Arts & Culture Advocacy Committee Advocacy Priorities 2025-2026

VISION: Expanding our world by celebrating creativity on San Diego

PURPOSE: The City of San Diego Commission for Arts and Culture serves in an advisory capacity to the Mayor and City Council on promoting, encouraging and increasing support for the region's artistic and cultural assets, integrating arts and culture into community life and showcasing San Diego as an international tourist destination.

PUBLIC FUNDING FOR THE ARTS

We advocate for equitable funding for the arts, and the maintenance of existing funding. We support increased funding and resources for public arts and culture agencies, nonprofit arts organizations, and individual artists, to advance and drive an equitable and inclusive creative economy; specifically:

- Increase Arts & Culture Funding from the city's Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) to equal 1 cent out of the 10.5 cent TOT, as described in the "Penny for the Arts Five Year Blueprint" approved by the City Council in 2012.
- Provide and expand a variety of Arts & Culture funding mechanisms, such as Impact, to support emerging artists, expand access to arts and culture throughout the city, address systemic challenges in arts and culture ecosystems and transform historically underserved communities through the arts.
- Increase funding to support administrative oversight and program management to extend program reach and help community organizations applying for funds.

ADVOCACY PLAN

Communicate Commission advocacy priorities to the mayor and members of the City Council:

• Meet with councilmembers and mayor formally and informally throughout the city budget process.

Identify and engage with artists and cultural organizations, both City funded and independently funded, in our neighborhoods, council district and city-wide, to seek advice, receive input and participate in the advocacy process.

Participate in advocacy actions with other local and state arts advocacy organizations such as San Diego Art Matters, San Diego Arts+Culture, Californians for the Arts, California Arts Council, and National Council for the Arts.

NOTE:

We anticipate the Mayor's Creative City Cultural Plan will provide a funding priority framework when it is presented in winter 2024.
