## City of San Diego Invites Visitors to Fire Stations During Fire Prevention Week

SAN DIEGANS CAN TOUR FIRE STATIONS IN SCRIPPS RANCH AND SAN YSIDRO, LEARN ABOUT FIRE SAFETY

SAN DIEGO – This weekend the City of San Diego Fire-Rescue Department will kick off Fire Prevention Week with open houses at two fire stations: Station 37 in Scripps Ranch and Station 29 in San Ysidro on Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 5 and 6. Each station will be open to the public on the indicated day. Everyone is invited to meet neighborhood firefighters, tour the stations and take photos. The first 300 visitors to Station 29 will receive a free smoke alarm.

## "Every year our firefighters look forward to meeting community members at our Fire Prevention Week events," said Fire-Rescue Chief Robert Logan. "Our teams will share fire safety information and show off the apparatus and rescue tools they use."

This year's theme is "Smoke alarms: Make them work for you!" <u>Fire Prevention Week</u> has been a national observance since 1925 and is the longest-running public health observance in the U.S. It's observed each year in early October in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire, which happened on Oct. 8, 1871.

Recruiters, fire inspectors and representatives from the Burn Institute will have tables with giveaways and safety information. No live fire exercises will take place.
