However, when this Agreement refers to an act or approval to be performed by City, that act or approval shall be performed by the Mayor or his designee, unless the Agreement specifies otherwise.

- Agreement, order changes in the Scope of Services by altering, adding to or deducting from the Professional Services to be performed. All such changes shall be in writing and shall be performed in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement. If any such changes cause an increase or decrease in the Construction Management Professional's cost of, or the time required for, the performance of any of the Professional Services, the Construction Management Professional shall immediately notify the City. If the City deems it appropriate, an equitable adjustment to the Construction Management Professional's compensation or time for performance may be made, provided that any adjustment must be approved by both Parties in writing in accordance with Section 9.1 of this Agreement.
- 1.4 Written Authorization. Prior to performing any Professional Services in connection with the Project, the Construction Management Professional shall obtain from the City a written authorization to proceed. Further, throughout the term of this Agreement, the Construction Management Professional shall immediately advise the City in writing of any anticipated change in the Scope of Services (Exhibit A), Compensation and Fee Schedule (Exhibit B), or Time Schedule (Exhibit C), and shall obtain the City's written consent to the change prior to making any changes. In no event shall the City's consent be construed to relieve the Construction Management Professional from its duty to render all Professional Services in accordance with applicable laws and accepted industry standards.
- Construction Management Professional, including but not limited to all drafts, data, correspondence, proposals, reports, and estimates compiled or composed by the Construction Management Professional, pursuant to this Agreement, are for the sole use of the City, its agents and employees. Neither the documents nor their contents shall be released to any third party without the prior written consent of the City. This provision does not apply to information that (a) was publicly known, or otherwise known to the Construction Management Professional, at the time that it was disclosed to the Construction Management Professional by the City, (b) subsequently becomes publicly known through no act or omission of the Construction Management Professional, or (c) otherwise becomes known to the Construction Management Professional other than through disclosure by the City. Except for Subcontractors covered by Section 4.4, neither the documents nor their contents shall be released to any third party without the prior written consent of the City.
  - 1.6 Competitive Bidding RESERVED.

#### ARTICLE II DURATION OF AGREEMENT

**2.1 Term of Agreement.** This Agreement shall be effective on the date it is executed by the last Party to sign the Agreement, and approved by the City Attorney in accordance with San Diego Charter Section 40. Unless otherwise terminated, this Agreement shall be effective for no more than sixty (60) months following the date of its execution by the City, unless said duration is modified in writing by an amendment to this Agreement. Any extension beyond sixty (60) months will require City Council approval via Ordinance.

Services shall be effective upon receipt of the notice by the Construction Management Professional. After termination of this Agreement, the Construction Management Professional shall complete any and all additional work necessary for the orderly filing of documents and closing of the Construction Management Professional's Professional Services under this Agreement. For services satisfactorily rendered in completing the work, the Construction Management Professional shall be entitled to fair and reasonable compensation for the Professional Services performed by the Construction Management Professional before the effective date of termination. After filing of documents and completion of performance, the Construction Management Professional shall deliver to the City all drawings, plans, calculations, specifications and other documents or records related to both the Project and to the Construction Management Professional's Professional Services on the Project. By accepting payment for completion, filing and delivering documents as called for in this paragraph, the Construction Management Professional discharges the City of all of the City's payment obligations and liabilities under this Agreement.

Professional fails to satisfactorily perform any obligation required by this Agreement, the Construction Management Professional's failure constitutes a Default. A Default includes the Construction Management Professional's failure to adhere to the Time Schedule. If the Construction Management Professional fails to satisfactorily cure a Default within ten calendar days of receiving written notice from the City specifying the nature of the Default, the City may immediately cancel and/or terminate this Agreement, and terminate each and every right of the Construction Management Professional, and any person claiming any rights by or through the Construction Management Professional under this Agreement. The rights and remedies of the City enumerated in this Section are cumulative and shall not limit, waive, or deny any of the City's rights under any other provision of this Agreement. Nor does this Section otherwise waive or deny any right or remedy, at law or in equity, existing as of the date of this Agreement or hereinafter enacted or established, that may be available to the City against the Construction Management Professional.

## ARTICLE III COMPENSATION

- 3.1 Amount of Compensation. The total compensation payable by the City to the Construction Management Professional for performance of all Professional Services rendered in accordance with this Agreement, including reasonably related expenses, shall not exceed \$11,000,000. The compensation for the Scope of Services shall not exceed \$10,496,713 and the compensation for Additional Services (described in Section 3.2), if any, shall not exceed \$503,287. Moreover, the total compensation to be paid to the Construction Management Professional by the City for all work performed under each phase of this Agreement shall not exceed the amount for each phase as specified in the Phased Funding Schedule in Section 3.1.1 unless said amount is modified in writing by an amendment to this Agreement.
- **3.1.1 Phased Funding Schedule.** The work to be performed under this Agreement shall be performed during the separate and specific phases identified in the following Phased Funding Schedule, and further defined in the Scope of Services [Exhibit A] for the not to exceed values listed in the Compensation and Fee Schedule [Exhibit B] and in accordance with the Time Schedule [Exhibit C].

e. The Phase Funding schedule may be amended as required by the City.

- 3.2 Additional Services. The City may require that the Construction Management Professional perform additional Professional Services [Additional Services] beyond those basic services described in the Scope of Services [Exhibit A]. Prior to the Construction Management Professional's performance of Additional Services, the City and the Construction Management Professional must agree in writing upon a fee for the Additional Services, including reasonably related expenses, in accordance with the Compensation and Fee Schedule [Exhibit B]. The City will pay the Construction Management Professional for the performance of Additional Services in accordance with Section 3.3.
- 3.3 Manner of Payment. The City shall pay the Construction Management Professional in accordance with the above Phased Funding Schedule and the Compensation and Fee Schedule [Exhibit B]. For the duration of this Agreement, the Construction Management Professional shall not be entitled to fees, including fees for expenses, that exceed the amounts specified in the Phased Funding Schedule and Compensation and Fee

sole discretion. This information shall be kept by the City in the strictest confidence allowed by law.

- **4.2.2 Audit.** The City's Right includes the right to examine any and all books, records, documents and any other evidence of procedures and practices that the City determines are necessary to discover and verify that the Construction Management Professional or Subcontractor is in compliance with all requirements under this Agreement.
- **4.2.2.1 Cost Audit.** If there is a claim for additional compensation or for Additional Services, the City's Right includes the right to examine books, records, documents, and any and all other evidence and accounting procedures and practices that the City determines are necessary to discover and verify all direct and indirect costs, of whatever nature, which are claimed to have been incurred, or anticipated to be incurred.
- 4.2.2.2 Accounting Records. The Construction Management Professional and all Subcontractors shall maintain complete and accurate records in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Practices in the industry. The Construction Management Professional and Subcontractors shall make available to the City for review and audit; all Project related accounting records and documents, and any other financial data. Upon the City's request, the Construction Management Professional and Subcontractors shall submit exact duplicates of originals of all requested records to the City.
- 4.2.3 City's Right Binding on Subcontractors. The Construction Management Professional shall include the City's Right as described in Section 4.2, in any and all of their subcontracts, and shall ensure that these sections are binding upon all Subcontractors.
- 4.2.4 Compliance Required before Mediation or Litigation. A condition precedent to proceeding with mandatory mediation and further litigation provided for in Article VII is the Construction Management Professional's and Subcontractors full compliance with the provisions of this Section 4.2 within sixty days of the date on which the City mailed a written request to review and audit compliance.
- Insurance. The Construction Management Professional shall not begin the Professional Services under this Agreement until it has: (a) obtained, and provided to the City, insurance certificates and endorsements reflecting evidence of all insurance required in Article IV, Section 4.3.1; and (b) confirmed that all policies contain the specific provisions required in Article IV, Section 4.3.4 of this Agreement. However, failure to obtain City approval of the required documents prior to the Professional Services commencing shall not waive Construction Management Professional's obligation to provide them. City reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements required by this Agreement, at any time. Construction Management Professional's liabilities, including but not limited to Construction Management Professional's indemnity obligations, under this Agreement, shall not be deemed limited in any way to the insurance coverage required herein. If Construction Management Professional maintains broader coverage or higher limits than the minimums shown below, City requires and shall be entitled to the broader coverage or the higher limits maintained by Construction Management Professional. Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to City. Except as provided for under California law, all policies of insurance required hereunder must provide that the City is entitled to thirty (30) days prior written notice (10 days for cancellation due to nonpayment of premium) of cancellation or non-renewal of the policy or policies. Maintenance of specified insurance coverage is a material element of this Agreement and Construction

described below, to procure and maintain Contractors Pollution Liability Insurance applicable to the Professional Services being performed, with a limit no less than \$1,000,000 per claim or occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate per policy period of one year.

Construction Management Professional shall obtain written approval from the City for any insurance provided by Construction Management Professional's Subcontractor instead of Construction Management Professional.

For approval of a substitution of Construction Management Professional's Subcontractor's insurance, the [Construction Management Professional shall certify that all activities for which the Contractors Pollution Liability Insurance will provide coverage will be performed exclusively by the Subcontractor providing the insurance. The deductible shall not exceed \$25,000 per claim unless the City has provided prior, written approval.

Occurrence based policies shall be procured before the Professional Services commence. Claims Made policies shall be procured before the Professional Services commence, shall be maintained for the duration of this Agreement, and shall include a 12-month extended Claims Discovery Period applicable to this Agreement or the existing policy or policies that shall continue to be maintained for 12 months after the completion of the Professional Services without advancing the retroactive date.

For consultant agreements where there is a pollution exposure and Construction Management Professional's manuscript Architects & Engineers Professional Liability policy affords pollution liability coverage, Construction Management Professional may, in lieu of providing separate Contractor's Pollution Liability Insurance, provide to City either; a.) the endorsement affording pollution liability coverage under the Architects & Engineers Professional Liability policy, or, b.) a copy of the Architects & Engineers Professional Liability policy language where this is stated. The Architects & Engineers Professional Liability policy limits must reflect a minimum of \$3,000,000 per claim and \$5,000,000 annual aggregate if the manuscript Architects & Engineers Professional Liability policy affords pollution liability coverage.

4.3.1.6 Contractors Hazardous Transporters Pollution Liability Insurance. Construction Management Professional shall procure and maintain at [Construction Management Professional's expense or require [Construction Management Professional's Subcontractor, as described below to procure and maintain Contractors Hazardous Transporters Pollution Liability Insurance, including contractual liability coverage to cover liability arising out of transportation of hazardous or toxic, materials, substances, or any other pollutants by [Construction Management Professional or any Subcontractor in an amount no less than \$1,000,000 limit per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate per policy period of one year.

All costs of defense shall be outside the limits of the policy.

[Construction Management Professional shall obtain written approval from the City for any insurance provided by [Construction Management Professional's Subcontractor instead of [Construction Management Professional.

To obtain City approval of a Subcontractor's insurance coverage in lieu of the [Construction Management Professional's insurance, the [Construction Management Professional shall certify that all activities under the Contractor's Hazardous Transporters

PRIMARY AND NON-CONTRIBUTORY COVERAGE. The policy or policies must be endorsed to provide that the insurance afforded by the Commercial General Liability policy or policies is primary to any insurance or self-insurance of the City of San Diego and its elected officials, officers, employees, agents and representatives as respects operations of the Named Insured. Any insurance maintained by the City of San Diego and its elected officials, officers, employees, agents and representatives shall be in excess of Construction Management Professional's insurance and shall not contribute to it.

# 4.3.4.2 Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance

**Endorsements.** 

WAIVER OF SUBROGATION. The Worker's Compensation policy or policies must be endorsed to provide that the insurer will waive all rights of subrogation against the City and its respective elected officials, officers, employees, agents and representatives for losses paid under the terms of this policy or these policies which arise from work performed by the Named Insured for the City.

### 4.3.4.3 Contractors Pollution Liability Insurance Endorsements.

ADDITIONAL INSURED. To the fullest extent allowed by law and consistent with the limiting provisions set forth at California Civil Code section 2782, California Insurance Code section 11580.04, and any applicable successor statutes limiting indemnification of public agencies that bind the City, the policy or policies shall be endorsed to include as an Additional Insured the City and its respective elected officials, officers, employees, agents, and representatives, with respect to liability arising out of: (a) ongoing operations performed by you or on your behalf, (b) your products, (c) your work, e.g., your completed operations performed by you or on your behalf, or d) premises owned, leased, controlled, or used by you.

PRIMARY AND NON-CONTRIBUTORY COVERAGE. The policy or policies shall be endorsed to provide that the insurance afforded by the Contractors Polluțion Liability Insurance policy or policies is primary to any insurance or self-insurance of the City and its elected officials, officers, employees, agents and representatives with respect to operations including the completed operations of the Named Insured. Any insurance maintained by the City and its elected officials, officers, employees, agents and representatives shall be in excess of the [Construction Management Professional's insurance and shall not contribute to it.

SEVERABILITY OF INTEREST. For Contractors Pollution Liability Insurance, the policy or policies shall provide that the Construction Management Professional's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability and shall provide cross-liability coverage.

4.3.4.4 Contractors Hazardous Transporters Pollution Liability Insurance Endorsements.

- **4.4.1 Subcontractor Contract.** All contracts entered into between the Construction Management Professional and any Subcontractor shall contain the information as described in Sections 4.6, 4.7, 4.10.2, and 4.18, and shall also provide as follows:
- **4.4.1.1** Construction Management Professional shall require the Subcontractor to obtain insurance policies, as described in Section 4.3.1, and those policies shall be kept in full force and effect during any and all work on this Project and for the duration of this Agreement. Furthermore, Subcontractor policy limits, and required endorsements shall be determined by the Construction Management Professional proportionate to the services performed by the Subcontractor.
- 4.4.1.2 The Construction Management Professional is obligated to pay the Subcontractor, for Construction Management Professional and City-approved invoice amounts, out of amounts paid by the City to the Construction Management Professional, not later than seven working days from the Construction Management Professional's receipt of payment from the City. Nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to impair the right of the Construction Management Professional and any Subcontractor to negotiate fair and reasonable pricing and payment provisions among themselves.
- 4.4.1.3 In the case of a deficiency in the performance of Subcontractor Services, the Construction Management Professional shall notify the City in writing of any withholding of payment to the Subcontractor, specifying: (a) the amount withheld; (b) the specific cause under the terms of the subcontract for withholding payment; (c) the connection between the cause for withholding payment and the amount withheld; and (d) the remedial action the Subcontractor must take in order to receive the amount withheld. Once the Subcontractor corrects the deficiency, the Construction Management Professional shall pay the Subcontractor the amount withheld within fourteen working days of the Construction Management Professional's receipt of the City's next payment.
- 4.4.1.4 In any dispute between the Construction Management Professional and Subcontractor, the City shall not be made a party to any judicial or administrative proceeding to resolve the dispute. The Construction Management Professional agrees to defend and indemnify the City as described in Article VI of this Agreement in any dispute between the Construction Management Professional and Subcontractor should the City be made a party to any judicial or administrative proceeding to resolve the dispute in violation of this position.
- **4.4.1.5** The Subcontractor is bound to the City's Equal Opportunity Contracting Program covenants set forth in Article IV, Section 4.6 and Exhibit D of this Agreement.
- **4.4.1.6** The City is an intended beneficiary of any work performed by the Subcontractor for purposes of establishing a duty of care between the Subcontractor and the City.
  - 4.5 Contract Records and Reports.

language shall be in contracts between the Construction Management Professional and any Subcontractors, vendors and suppliers.

- 4.6.3 Compliance Investigations. Upon the City's request, the Construction Management Professional agrees to provide to the City, within sixty calendar days, a truthful and complete list of the names of all Subcontractors, vendors, and suppliers that the Construction Management Professional has used in the past five years on any of its contracts that were undertaken within San Diego County, including the total dollar amount paid by the Construction Management Professional for each subcontract or supply contract. The Construction Management Professional further agrees to fully cooperate in any investigation conducted by the City pursuant to the City's Nondiscrimination in Contracting Ordinance (San Diego Municipal Code sections 22.3501-22.3517) The Construction Management Professional understands and agrees that violation of this clause shall be considered a material breach of the contract and may result in remedies being ordered against the Construction Management Professional up to and including contract termination, debarment, and other sanctions for violation of the provisions of the Nondiscrimination in Contracting Ordinance. The Construction Management Professional further understands and agrees that the procedures, remedies and sanctions provided for in the Nondiscrimination Ordinance apply only to violations of said Nondiscrimination Ordinance.
  - 4.7 Drug-Free Workplace. By signing this Agreement the Construction Management Professional agrees that it is aware of, and hereby certifies that it agrees to comply with, the City's Drug-Free Workplace requirements set forth in Council Policy 100-17, adopted by San Diego Resolution R-277952 and incorporated into this Agreement by this reference. Council Policy 100-17 is available online at <a href="https://www.sandiego.gov/city-clerk/officialdocs">https://www.sandiego.gov/city-clerk/officialdocs</a>.
  - **4.7.1 Construction Management Professional's Notice to Employees.** The Construction Management Professional shall publish a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance is prohibited in the workplace, and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of the prohibition.
  - 4.7.2 Drug-Free Awareness Program. The Construction Management Professional shall establish a drug-free awareness program to inform employees about: (1) the dangers of drug abuse in the workplace; (2) the policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace; (3) available drug counseling, rehabilitation, and employee assistance programs; (4) the penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations.
  - 4.7.3 Posting the Statement. In addition to Section 4.7.1 above, the Construction Management Professional shall post the drug-free policy in a prominent place.
  - 4.7.4 Subcontractor's Agreements. The Construction Management Professional further certifies that each contract for Subcontractor Services for this Project shall contain language that binds the Subcontractor to comply with the provisions of Article IV, Section 4.7 of this Agreement, as required by Sections 2.A.(1) through (3) of Council Policy 100–17. Construction Management Professionals and Subcontractors shall be individually responsible for their own drug-free workplace program.
    - 4.8 Title 24/Americans with Disabilities Act Requirements. RESERVED.

- 4.10.4 The Construction Management Professional's personnel employed on the Project shall not accept gratuities or any other favors from any Subcontractors or potential Subcontractors. The Construction Management Professional shall not recommend or specify any product, supplier, or contractor with whom the Construction Management Professional has a direct or indirect financial or organizational interest or relationship that would violate conflict of interest laws, regulations, or policies.
- **4.10.5** If the Construction Management Professional violates any conflict of interest law or any of the provisions in this Section 4.10, the violation shall be grounds for immediate termination of this Agreement. Further, the violation subjects the Construction Management Professional to liability to the City for attorneys' fees and all damages sustained as a result of the violation.
- 6.11 Mandatory Assistance. If a third party dispute or litigation, or both, arises out of, or relates in any way to the Professional Services provided under this Agreement, upon the City's request, the Construction Management Professional, its agents, officers, and employees agree to assist in resolving the dispute or litigation. The Construction Management Professional's assistance includes, but is not limited to, providing professional consultations, attending mediations, arbitrations, depositions, trials or any event related to the dispute resolution and/or litigation.
- Construction Management Professional for fees incurred for providing Mandatory Assistance as Additional Services under Section 3.2. If, however, the fees incurred for the Mandatory Assistance are determined, through resolution of the third party dispute or litigation, or both, to be attributable in whole, or in part, to the acts or omissions of the Construction Management Professional, its agents, officers, and employees, the Construction Management Professional shall reimburse the City. The City is then entitled to reimbursement of all fees paid to the Construction Management Professional, its agents, officers, and employees for Mandatory Assistance.
- 4.13 Attorney Fees related to Mandatory Assistance. In providing the City with dispute or litigation assistance, the Construction Management Professional or its agents, officers, and employees may incur expenses and/or costs. The Construction Management Professional agrees that any attorney fees it may incur as a result of assistance provided under Section 4.11 are not reimbursable. The Parties agree this provision does not in any way affect their rights to seek attorney fees under Article VIII, Section 8.8 of this Agreement.
  - 4.14 Energy Conservation Specifications. RESERVED.
  - 4.15 Notification of Increased Construction Cost. RESERVED.
  - 4.16 Sustainable Building Policy. RESERVED.
  - 4.17 Design-Build Competition Eligibility. RESERVED.
- 4.18 Storm Water Management Discharge Control. Construction Management Professional shall comply with Chapter 4, Article 3, Division 3 of the San Diego Municipal Code, Storm Water Management Discharge Control and the Municipal Storm Water Permit (MS4) Permit, California Regional Water Quality Control Board Order No. R9-2013-0001 (amended by R9-2015-0001 and R9-2015-0100), Storm Water Standards Manual, as

- 4.20.3 Payroll Records. Construction Management Professional and its subconsultants shall comply with California Labor Code section 1776, which generally requires keeping accurate payroll records, verifying and certifying payroll records, and making them available for inspection. Construction Management Professional shall require its subconsultants to also comply with section 1776. Construction Management Professional and its subconsultants shall submit weekly certified payroll records online via the City's web-based Labor Compliance Program. Construction Management Professional is responsible for ensuring its subconsultants submit certified payroll records to the City.
- **4.20.3.1** In addition to the requirements in 4.20.3, the Construction Management Professional and its subconsultants shall also furnish records specified in Labor Code section 1776 directly to the Labor Commissioner in the manner required by Labor Code section 1771.4.
- **4.20.4 Apprentices.** Construction Management Professional and its subconsultants shall comply with California Labor Code sections 1777.5, 1777.6 and 1777.7 concerning the employment and wages of apprentices. Construction Management Professional shall be held responsible for the compliance of their subconsultants with sections 1777.5, 1777.6 and 1777.7.
- **4.20.5 Working Hours.** Construction Management Professional and its subconsultants shall comply with California Labor Code sections 1810 through 1815, including but not limited to: (i) restrict working hours on public works contracts to eight (8) hours a day and forty (40) hours a week, unless all hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day are compensated at not less than 1½ times the basic rate of pay; and (ii) specify penalties to be imposed on Construction Management professionals and subcontractors of \$25 per worker per day for each day the worker works more than eight (8) hours per day and forty (40) hours per week in violation of California Labor Code sections 1810 through 1815.
- **4.20.6 Required Provisions for Subcontracts.** Construction Management Professional shall include at a minimum a copy of the following provisions in any contract they enter into with a subconsultant: California Labor Code sections 1771, 1771.1, 1775, 1776, 1777.5, 1810, 1813, 1815, 1860 and 1861.
- 4.20.7\_Labor Code Section 1861 Certification. Construction Management Professional in accordance with California Labor Code section 3700 is required to secure the payment of compensation of its employees and by signing this Agreement, Construction Management Professional certifies that "I am aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the California Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this Agreement."
- 4.20.8 Labor Compliance Program. The City has its own Labor Compliance Program authorized in August 2011 by the DIR. The City will withhold contract payments when payroll records are delinquent or deemed inadequate by the City or other governmental entity, or it has been established after an investigation by the City or other governmental entity that underpayment(s) have occurred.
- **4.20.9** Contractor and Subcontractor Registration Requirements. This project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the DIR. A Construction Management Professional or subcontractor shall not be qualified to bid on, be listed in a bid or proposal, subject to the requirements of section 4104 of the Public Contract Code, or

Professional will need to keep those records for at least three years following the completion of the Agreement. (Labor Code section 1771.4).

- **4.20.12.3 List of all Subcontractors.** The Construction Management Professional shall not be required to hire only registered subcontractors and is exempt from submitting the list of all subcontractors that is required in section 4.20.11 above. (Labor Code section 1773.3).
- **4.21 Davis-Bacon Wage Rates.** This Agreement shall be subject to the Davis-Bacon requirements in **Exhibit I** and Wage Decision set forth in **EXHIBIT J**.

#### ARTICLE V FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS

- **5.1** This Project is funded by Drinking Water State Revolving Fund [DWSRF] program. All Project work and Agreements will be subject to the review and approval of the State Water Board.
- 5.2 The Construction Management Professional and its Subcontractors shall maintain all books, documents, papers, employee time sheets, accounting records, and other evidence pertaining to costs incurred, and shall make such materials available at their respective offices at all reasonable times during the contract period and for three years from the date of final payment under the contract, for inspection by the City, State Water Board, the California State Auditor, the Bureau of State Audits, the United States Environmental Protection Agency [USEPA], the Office of Inspector General, the Internal Revenue Service, any member of Congress, the Governor, Caltrans, FHWA, the State Auditor, the Comptroller General of the United States, or their duly authorized representatives.
- 5.3 The cost principles and procedures for use in the determination of allowable elements of cost will be governed by the Federal Acquisition Regulations in 48 CFR, Chapter 1, Part 31. Said regulations are also applicable to Subcontracts in excess of \$25,000.00.
- 5.4 The Construction Management Professional warrants that he/she has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working for the Consultant, to solicit or secure this Agreement, and that he/she has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona fide employee, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or any other consideration, contingent upon or resulting from the award or formation of this Agreement. For breach or violation of this warranty, the City shall have the right to annul this agreement without liability, or at its discretion to deduct from the Agreement price or consideration, or otherwise recover, the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or contingent fee.
- 5.5 The Construction Management Professional shall comply with all Federal, State, and Local laws and ordinances applicable to the work. This includes compliance with prevailing wage rates and their payment in accordance with California Labor Code, including but not limited to Sections 1720 and 1771 (see Exhibit H).
- **5.6** Neither this Agreement or any part thereof shall be subcontracted, assigned, or transferred by the Construction Management Professional except as otherwise provided for in the Agreement.

requests for proposals or invitations for bids, independent cost estimates, or other pertinent documents when:

- (i) The City's or the Construction Management Professional's procurement procedures or operation fails to comply with the procurement standards in 49 CFR Section 18.36; or
- (ii) The procurement is expected to exceed the simplified acquisition threshold [currently fixed at \$100,000 by 41 U.S.C. 403(11)] and is to be awarded without competition or only one bid or offer is received in response to a solicitation; or
- (iii) The procurement, which is expected to exceed the simplified acquisition threshold, specifies a brand name product; or
- (iv) The proposed award is more than the simplified acquisition threshold and is to be awarded to other than the apparent low bidder under a sealed bid procurement; or
- (v) A proposed contract modification changes the scope of a contract or increases the contract amount by more than the simplified acquisition threshold.
- 5.11 The City will use procurement procedures which reflect applicable State and local laws and regulations, provided that the procurements conform to applicable Federal law and standards identified in 49 CFR Section 18.36.
- 5.12 Contract modifications are required for any modification in the terms of the original contract that change the cost of the contract; significantly change the character, scope, complexity, or duration of the work; or significantly change the conditions under which the work is required to be performed. A contract modification shall clearly outline the changes made and determine a method of compensation. State Water Board approval of contract modifications shall be obtained prior to beginning the work, except that in unusual circumstances the Construction Management Professional may be authorized to proceed with work prior to agreement on the amount of compensation and execution of the contract modification, provided the State Water Board has previously approved the work and has concurred that additional compensation is warranted.
- 5.13 The Construction Management Professional agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders, or requirements issued under section 306 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 1857(h)), section 508 of the Clean water Act (33 U.S.C. 1368), Executive Order 11738, and Environmental Protection Agency regulations (40 CFR part 15).

#### ARTICLE VI INDEMNIFICATION

**6.1 Indemnification.** Other than in the performance of Construction Management professional services which shall be solely as addressed in Section 6.2 below, to the fullest extent permitted by law, Construction Management Professional shall defend (with legal counsel reasonably acceptable to the City), indemnify and hold harmless the City and its officers, agents, departments, officials, and employees [Indemnified Parties] from and against all claims, losses, costs, damages, injuries (including, without limitation, injury

- 7.3 Selection of Mediator. A single Mediator that is acceptable to both Parties shall be used to mediate the dispute. The Mediator will be knowledgeable in construction aspects and may be selected from lists furnished by the AAA or any other agreed upon Mediator. To initiate mediation, the initiating Party shall serve a Request for Mediation on the opposing Party. If the Mediator is selected from a list provided by AAA, the initiating Party shall concurrently file with AAA a "Request for Mediation" along with the appropriate fees, a list of three requested Mediators marked in preference order, and a preference for available dates.
- 7.3.1 If AAA is selected to coordinate the mediation, within ten working days from the receipt of the initiating Party's Request for Mediation, the opposing Party shall file the following: a list of preferred Mediators listed in preference order after striking any Mediators to which they have any factual objection, and a preference for available dates. If the opposing Party strikes all of initiating Party's preferred Mediators, opposing Party shall submit a list of three preferred Mediators listed in preference order to initiating Party and Administrator. Initiating Party shall file a list of preferred Mediators listed in preference order, after striking any Mediator to which they have any factual objection. This process shall continue until both sides have agreed upon a Mediator.
- **7.3.2** The Administrator will appoint or the Parties shall agree upon the highest, mutually preferred Mediator from the individual Parties' lists who is available to serve within the designated time frame.
- **7.3.3** If the Parties agree not to use AAA, then a Mediator, date and place for the mediation shall be mutually agreed upon.
- 7.4 Conduct of Mediation Sessions. Mediation hearings will be conducted in an informal manner and discovery will not be allowed. All discussions, statements, or admissions will be confidential to the Party's legal position. The Parties may agree to exchange any information they deem necessary.
- **7.4.1** Both Parties must have an authorized representative attend the mediation. Each representative must have the authority to recommend entering into a settlement. Either Party may have attorney(s) or expert(s) present. Upon reasonable demand, either Party may request and receive a list of witnesses and notification whether attorney(s) will be present.
- **7.4.2** Any agreements resulting from mediation shall be documented in writing. All mediation results and documentation, by themselves, shall be "non-binding" and inadmissible for any purpose in any legal proceeding, unless such admission is otherwise agreed upon, in writing, by both Parties. Mediators shall not be subject to any subpoena or liability and their actions shall not be subject to discovery.

#### ARTICLE VIII INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

8.1 Work For Hire. original designs, plans, specifications, reports, documentation, and other informational materials, whether written or readable by machine, originated or prepared exclusively for the City pursuant to this Agreement (Deliverable Materials) is "work for hire" under the United States Copyright law and shall become the sole property of the City and shall be delivered to the City upon request. The Contractor, including its employees, and independent Subcontractor(s), shall not assert any common law or statutory patent,

- **8.6 Publication Design.** Professional may not publish or reproduce any Deliverable Materials, for purposes unrelated to Construction Management Professional's work on behalf of the City without prior written consent of the City.
- Intellectual Property Warranty and Indemnification. Construction Management Professional represents and warrants that any materials or deliverables, including all Deliverable Materials, provided under this contract are either original, not encumbered and do not infringe upon the copyright, trademark, patent or other intellectual property rights of any third party, or are in the public domain. If Deliverable Materials provided hereunder become the subject of a claim, suit or allegation of copyright, trademark or patent infringement, City shall have the right, in its sole discretion, to require Construction Management Professional to produce, at Construction Management Professional's own expense, new non-infringing materials, deliverables or Works as a means of remedying any claim of infringement in addition to any other remedy available to the City under law or equity. Construction Management Professional further agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City, its elected officials, officers, employees and agents from and against any and all claims, actions, costs, judgments or damages of any type alleging or threatening that any materials, deliverables, supplies, equipment, services, Deliverable Materials, or Works provided under this contract infringe the copyright, trademark, patent or other intellectual property or proprietary rights of any third party (Third Party Claims of Infringement). If a Third Party Claim of Infringement is threatened or made before Construction Management Professional receives payment under this contract, City shall be entitled, upon written notice to Construction Management Professional, to withhold some or all of such payment.
- 8.8 Enforcement Costs. The Construction Management Professional agrees to pay any and all costs the City incurs enforcing the indemnity and defense provisions set forth in Article 8, including but not limited to, attorneys' fees.

## ARTICLE IX MISCELLANEOUS

- 9.1 Notices. In all cases where written notice is required under this Agreement, service shall be deemed sufficient if the notice is deposited in the United States mail, postage paid. Proper notice shall be effective on the date it is mailed, unless provided otherwise in this Agreement. - **9.2 Headings.** All article headings are for convenience only and shall not affect the interpretation of this Agreement.
- 9.3 Non-Assignment. The Construction Management Professional shall not assign the obligations under this Agreement, whether by express assignment or by sale of the company, nor any monies due or to become due, without the City's prior written approval. Any assignment in violation of this paragraph shall constitute a Default and is grounds for immediate termination of this Agreement, at the sole discretion of the City. In no event shall any putative assignment create a contractual relationship between the City and any putative assignee.

statutes, ordinances, rules, or regulations. The laws of the State of California shall govern and control the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

- **9.10 Jurisdiction**. This Agreement and all rights and obligations created by this Agreement shall be in force and effect whether or not any Parties to the Agreement have been succeeded by another entity, and all rights and obligations created by this Agreement shall be vested and binding on any Party's successor in interest.
- 9.12 Integration. This Agreement and the Exhibits and references incorporated into this Agreement fully express all understandings of the Parties concerning the matters covered in this Agreement. No change, alteration, amendment, or modification of the terms or conditions of this Agreement, and no verbal understanding of the Parties, their officers, agents, or employees shall be valid unless made in the form of a written change agreed to in writing by both Parties. All prior negotiations and agreements are merged into this Agreement.
- **9.13 Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, which when taken together shall constitute a single signed original as though all Parties had executed the same page.
- 9.14 No Waiver. No failure of either the City or the Construction Management Professional to insist upon the strict performance by the other of any covenant, term or condition of this Agreement, nor any failure to exercise any right or remedy consequent upon a breach of any covenant, term, or condition of this Agreement, shall constitute a waiver of any such breach of such covenant, term or condition. No waiver of any breach shall affect or alter this Agreement, and each and every covenant, condition, and term hereof shall continue in full force and effect without respect to any existing or subsequent breach.
- **9.15 Severability.** The unenforceability, invalidity, or illegality of any provision of this Agreement shall not render any other provision of this Agreement unenforceable, invalid, or illegal.
- **9.16 Municipal Powers.** Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed as a limitation upon the powers of the City as a chartered city of the State of California.
- 9.17 **Drafting Ambiguities.** The Parties agree that they are aware that they have the right to be advised by counsel with respect to the negotiations, terms and conditions of this Agreement, and the decision of whether or not to seek advice of counsel with respect to this Agreement is a decision which is the sole responsibility of each Party. This Agreement shall not be construed in favor of or against either Party by reason of the extent to which each Party participated in the drafting of the Agreement.
- 9.18 Conflicts Between Terms. If an apparent conflict or inconsistency exists between the main body of this Agreement and the Exhibits, the main body of this Agreement shall control. If a conflict exists between an applicable federal, state, or local law, rule, regulation, order, or code and this Agreement, the law, rule, regulation, order, or code shall control. Varying degrees of stringency among the main body of this Agreement, the Exhibits,

It will be the Construction Management Professional's obligation to defend, at Construction Management Professional's expense, any legal actions or challenges seeking to obtain from the City any information requested under the California Public Records Act withheld by the City at the Construction Management Professional's request. Furthermore, the Construction Management Professional shall indemnify the City and hold it harmless for any claim or liability, and defend any action brought against the City, resulting from the City's refusal to release information requested under the Public Records Act withheld at Construction Management Professional's request.

Nothing in this Agreement creates any obligation for the City to notify the Construction Management Professional or obtain the Construction Management Professional's approval or consent before releasing information subject to disclosure under the California Public Records Act.

- 9.25 Equal Pay Ordinance. Unless an exception applies, Construction Management Professional shall comply with the Equal Pay Ordinance (EPO) codified in the San Diego Municipal Code (SDMC) at section 22.4801 through 22.4809. Construction Management Professional shall require all of its subconsultants to certify compliance with the EPO in their written subcontracts. Construction Management Professional must post a notice informing its employees of their rights under the EPO in their workplace or job site. By signing this Agreement with the City of San Diego, Construction Management Professional acknowledges the EPO requirements and pledges ongoing compliance with the requirements of SDMC Division 48, section 22.4801 et seq., throughout the duration of this Agreement
- 9.26 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Requirements. The City anticipates receiving financial assistance from the Federal Government and the State of California for this project. The requirements in Exhibit I [Drinking Water State Revolving Funds Requirements] are conditions of the receipt of financing from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) and the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) under the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund program. The firm contracting with the City (Construction Management Professional) shall comply with all of the requirements as listed in Exhibit I.

Contractor shall provide equal opportunity in all employment practices. Consultants shall ensure that their subcontractors comply with this program. Nothing in this Section shall be interpreted to hold a Consultant liable for any discriminatory practice of its subcontractors.
  - B. Work Force Report. If based on a review of the Work Force Report (Attachment BB) submitted an EOCP staff Work Force Analysis determines there are under representations when compared to County Labor Force Availability data, then the Consultant will also be required to submit an Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Plan to the Program Manager of the City of San Diego Equal Opportunity Contracting Program (EOCP) for approval.
  - C. Equal Employment Opportunity Plan. If an Equal Employment Opportunity Plan is required, the Program Manager of EOCP will provide a list of plan requirements to Consultant.
  - IV. Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Requirements. The City seeks to foster a business climate of inclusion and to eliminate barriers to inclusion. The City encourages Proposers to seek and use DBE firms for this solicitation. Proposers agree that they will cooperate and assist the City in fulfilling the DBE Good Faith Effort (GFE) Requirement achieving "fair share objectives" and will exercise the six affirmative steps to achieve such minimum participation of small, minority and women owned businesses.

#### A. Good Faith Efforts:

- 1. The Proposer shall demonstrate that efforts were made to attract DBEs on this contract. - 4. Based on the federal DBE program, CALTRANS maintains a database and provides directories of minority and woman-owned firms. Proposer must provide copy of search records with GFE documentation.

### **CALIFORNIA LABOR CODE**

### EXISTING LAW

### ' 1771. Payment of general prevailing rate

Except for public works projects of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or less, not less than the general prevailing rate of per diem wages for work of a similar character in the locality in which the public work is performed, and not less than the general prevailing rate of per diem wages for holiday and overtime work fixed as provided in this chapter, shall be paid to all workers employed on public works.

This section is applicable only to work performed under contract, and is not applicable to work carried out by a public agency with its own forces. This section is applicable to contracts let for maintenance work.

### AMENDMENT

### <sup>1</sup> 1720. Public works; use of public funds

As used in this chapter, "public works" means:

- (a) Construction, alteration, demolition, or repair work done under contract and paid for in whole or in part out of public funds, except work done directly by any public utility company pursuant to order of the Public Utilities Commission or other public authority. <u>For purposes of this subdivision</u>, "construction" includes work performed during the design and preconstruction phases of construction including, but not limited to, inspection and land surveying work.
- (b) Work done for irrigation, utility, reclamation, and improvement districts, and other districts of this type. "public works" shall not include the operation of the irrigation or drainage system of any irrigation or reclamation district, except as used in Section 1778 relating to retaining wages.
- (c) Street sewer, or other improvement work done under the direction and supervision or by the authority of any officer or public body of the state, or of any political subdivision or district thereof, whether the political subdivision or district operates under a freeholder's charter or not.
- (d) The laying of carpet done under a building lease-maintenance contract and paid for out of public funds.
- (e) The laying of carpet in a public building done under contract and paid for in whole or in part out of public funds.
- (f) Public transportation demonstration projects authorized pursuant to Section 143 of the Streets and Highways Code.

### DRINKING WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND REQUIREMENTS

- 2. Work or Travel Outside of California. No work or travel outside the State of California is permitted unless the City provides prior written authorization. Any reimbursement for necessary travel and per diem shall be at rates not to exceed those set by the California Department of Human Resources at <a href="http://www.calhr.ca.gov/employees/Pages/travel-reimbursements.aspx">http://www.calhr.ca.gov/employees/Pages/travel-reimbursements.aspx</a> as of the date costs are incurred by the Construction Management Professional. (DWSRF Agmt. Ex. B § B.1.7.i).
- 3. Records Retention. The Construction Management Professional shall maintain separate books, records and other material relative to the Project. Construction Management Professional shall also retain such books, records, and other material for itself and for each subcontractor who performed or performs work on this project for a minimum of thirty-six (36) years after Completion of Construction. The Construction Management Professional shall require that such books, records, and other material are subject at all reasonable times (at a minimum during normal business hours) to inspection, copying, and audit by the State Water Board, the California State Auditor, the Bureau of State Audits, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA), the Office of Inspector General, the Internal Revenue Service, the Governor, or any authorized representatives of the aforementioned. The Construction Management Professional shall allow and shall require its subcontractors to allow interviews during normal business hours of any employees who might reasonably have information related to such records. The Construction Management Professional agrees to include a similar duty regarding audit, interviews, and records retention in any subcontract related to the performance of this

- c. The Construction Management Professional and its subcontractors shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act and the applicable regulations promulgated thereunder. (Gov. Code, §12990, subds. (a)-(f) et seq.; Cal. Code Regs.,tit. 2, § 7285 et seq.) Such regulations are incorporated into this Agreement by reference and made a part hereof as if set forth in full.
- d. The Construction Management Professional and its subcontractors must comply with all applicable federal civil rights regulations, including statutory and national policy requirements. (2 CFR § 200.300). This includes, to the greatest extent practicable and to the extent permitted by law, the requirement to respect and protect the freedom of persons and organizations to engage in political and religious speech. (Executive Order 13798).
- e. The Construction Management Professional and its subcontractors shall give written notice of their obligations under this clause to labor organizations with which they have a collective bargaining or other agreement.
- f. The Construction Management Professional must include the nondiscrimination and compliance provisions of this clause in all subcontracts to perform work under this Agreement.

(DWSRF Agmt. Ex. C § C.3.22(e)-(i)).

- 8. Insurance. For any policy of general liability insurance concerning the construction of the Project, the Construction Management Professional will cause, and will require its subcontractors to cause, a certificate of insurance to be issued showing the State Water Board, its officers, agents, employees, and servants as additional insured; and must provide the City with a copy of all such certificates prior to the commencement of construction of the Project. (DWSRF Agmt. Ex. C § C.3.26).
- 9. Excluded Parties. The Construction Management Professional shall not contract with any party who is debarred or suspended or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in any work overseen, directed, funded, or administered by the State Water Board program for which this funding is authorized. For any work related to this Agreement, the Construction Management Professional shall not contract with any individual or organization on the State Water Board's List of Disqualified Businesses and Persons that is identified as debarred or suspended or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in any work overseen, directed, funded, or administered by the State Water Board program for which funding under this Agreement is authorized. - 10. Prevailing Wages. The Construction Management Professional shall comply with all California State and federal prevailing wage laws. The Construction Management Professional shall include in its subcontracts the full the language provided in Attachment 2 to this Exhibit regarding federal prevailing wages. (DWSRF Agmt. Ex. C § C.3.29).

- 12. Compliance with Directives and Orders in the Division 7 of the Water Code. The Construction Management Professional and subcontractors shall comply with directives or orders issued pursuant to Division 7 of the Water Code, (DWSRF Ex C § C.4.2.xi).
- 13. Russian Sanctions. The Construction Management Professional represents that the Construction Management Professional is not a target of economic sanctions imposed in response to Russia's actions in Ukraine imposed by the United States government or the State of California. The Contract Construction Management Professional or is required to comply with the economic sanctions imposed in response to Russia's actions in Ukraine, including with respect to, but not limited to, the federal executive orders identified in California Executive Order N-6-22, located at <a href="https://www.gov.ca.gov/wpcontent/uploads/2022/03/3.4.22-Russia-Ukraine-Executive-Order.pdf">https://www.gov.ca.gov/wpcontent/uploads/2022/03/3.4.22-Russia-Ukraine-Executive-Order.pdf</a> and the sanctions identified on the United States Department of the Treasury website (<a href="https://ofac.treasury.gov/sanctions-programs-and-country-information/ukraine-russia-related-sanctions">https://ofac.treasury.gov/sanctions-programs-and-country-information/ukraine-russia-related-sanctions</a>). The Construction Management Professional is required to comply with all applicable reporting requirements regarding compliance with the economic sanctions, including, but not limited to, those reporting requirements set forth in California Executive Order N-6-22 for all Recipients with one or more agreements with the State of California with an aggregated value of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) or more.

For Construction Management Professional and subcontractors with an aggregated agreement value of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) or more with the State of California, the Construction Management Professional is required to report to the City on an annual basis to include, but is not limited to, information related to steps taken in response to Russia's actions in Ukraine, including but not limited to:

- 3. Wage Rate Requirements (Davis-Bacon). The Construction Management Professional shall include in its subcontracts the full the language provided in Attachment 2 to this Exhibit regarding federal prevailing wages. (CWSRF Agmt. Ex. E § A(2); DWSRF Agmt. Ex. C § C.4.3.ii; WIFIA Agmt. §§ 12(j), 14(l)).
- 4. Copyright and Patent. USEPA and the State Water Board have the right to reproduce, publish, use and authorize others to reproduce, publish and use copyrighted works or other data developed pursuant to this Agreement. Where an invention is made with Project Funds, USEPA and the State Water Board retain the right to a worldwide, nonexclusive, nontransferable, irrevocable, paid-up license to practice the invention owned by Construction Management Professional. Construction Management Professional must utilize the Interagency Edison extramural invention reporting system at <a href="http://iEdison.gov">http://iEdison.gov</a> and shall notify the State Water Board when an invention report, patent report, or utilization report is filed. - 5. Materials Developed for Public Distribution. The Construction Management Professional agrees that any reports, documents, publications or other materials developed for public distribution supported by this Agreement shall contain the following statement (DWSRF Agmt. Ex. C § 4.3.xii):

- 6. Trafficking and Forced Labor. The Construction Management Professional, its employees, its subcontractors and their employees may not engage in severe forms of trafficking in persons during the term of this Agreement, procure a commercial sex act during the term of this Agreement, or use forced labor in the performance of this Agreement. Contractor must include this provision in its subcontracts under this Agreement. The Construction Management Professional must inform the City immediately of any information regarding a violation of the foregoing. The Construction Management Professional understands that failure to comply with this provision may subject the State Water Board to loss of federal funds, and the loss of funding for this Project. The contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the contracting agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance: Provided, however, That in the event the contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the contracting agency, the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States."
- 7. Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (40 CFR Part 33). Contractor agrees to comply with the requirements of USEPA's Program for Utilization of Small, Minority and Women's Business Enterprises. WSRF Agmt. Ex. C § 4.3.xviii).

- D. Secure Connection. The Construction Management Professional agrees that if its network or information system is connected to USEPA networks to transfer data using systems other than the Environmental Information Exchange Network or USEPA's Central Data Exchange, it will ensure that any connections are secure. (DWSRF Agmt. Ex. C § C.4.3.xxi).
- E. Geospatial Data Standards. All geospatial data created pursuant to this Agreement that is submitted to the State Water Board for use by USEPA or that is submitted directly to USEPA must be consistent with Federal Geographic Data Committee endorsed standards. Requirements Under Section 1452(a)(5) of the Safe Drinking Water Act For Sub recipients That Are Governmental Entities

1. Applicability of the DB prevailing wage requirements.

DB prevailing wage requirements apply to the construction, alteration, and repair of treatment works carried out in whole or in part with assistance made available by a State water pollution control revolving fund and to any construction project carried out in whole or in part by assistance made available by a drinking water treatment revolving loan fund. If a sub recipient encounters a unique situation at a site that presents uncertainties regarding DB applicability, the sub recipient must discuss the situation with the recipient State before authorizing work on that site.

- 2. Obtaining Wage Determinations.
- (a) Sub recipients shall obtain the wage determination for the locality in which a covered activity subject to DB will take place prior to issuing requests for bids, proposals, quotes or other methods for soliciting contracts (solicitation) for activities subject to DB. These wage determinations shall be incorporated into solicitations and any subsequent contracts. Prime contracts must contain a provision requiring that subcontractors follow the wage determination incorporated into the prime contract.
- (i) While the solicitation remains open, the sub recipient shall monitor <a href="https://sam.gov">https://sam.gov</a> weekly to ensure that the wage determination contained in the solicitation remains current. The sub recipients shall amend the solicitation if DOL issues a modification more than 10 days prior to the closing date (i.e. bid opening) for the solicitation. If DOL modifies or supersedes the applicable wage determination less than 10 days prior to the closing date, the sub recipients may request a finding from the State recipient that there is not a reasonable time to notify interested contractors of the modification of the wage determination. The State recipient will provide a report of its findings to the sub recipient.
- (ii) If the sub recipient does not award the contract within 90 days of the closure of the solicitation, any modifications or supersedes DOL makes to the wage determination contained in the solicitation shall be effective unless the State recipient, at the request of the sub recipient, obtains an extension of the 90 day period from DOL pursuant to 29 CFR 1.6(c)(3)(iv). than quarterly) under plans, funds, or programs which cover the particular weekly period, are deemed to be constructively made or incurred during such weekly period. Such laborers and mechanics shall be paid the appropriate wage rate and fringe benefits on the wage determination for the classification of work actually performed, without regard to skill, except as provided in § 5.5(a)(4). Laborers or mechanics performing work in more than one classification may be compensated at the rate specified for each classification for the time actually worked therein: Provided that the employer's payroll records accurately set forth the time spent in each classification in which work is performed. The wage determination (including any additional classification and wage rates conformed under paragraph (a)(1)(ii) of this section) and the DB poster (WH-1321) shall be posted at all times by the contractor and its subcontractors at the site of the work in a prominent and accessible place where it can be easily seen by the workers.

Sub recipients may obtain wage determinations from the DOL website, <a href="https://sam.gov">https://sam.gov</a>.

- (ii) (A) The sub recipient(s), on behalf of EPA, shall require that any class of laborers or mechanics, including helpers, which is not listed in the wage determination and which is to be employed under the contract shall be classified in conformance with the wage determination. The State award official shall approve a request for an additional classification and wage rate and fringe benefits therefore only when the following criteria have been met:
- (1) The work to be performed by the classification requested is not performed by a classification in the wage determination; and
- (2) The classification is utilized in the area by the construction industry; and
- (3) The proposed wage rate, including any bona fide fringe benefits, bears a reasonable relationship to the wage rates contained in the wage determination.
- (B) If the contractor and the laborers and mechanics to be employed in the classification (if known), or their representatives, and the sub recipient(s) agree on the classification and wage rate (including the amount designated for fringe benefits where appropriate), documentation of the action taken and the request, including the local wage determination shall be sent by the sub recipient (s) to the State award official. The State award official will transmit a completed conformance request form (SF-1444 or similar) and supporting materials to WHD-CBACONFORMANCE INCOMING@dol.gov and to the EPA DB Regional Coordinator concurrently. The DOL Administrator, or an authorized representative, will approve, modify, or disapprove every additional classification request within 30 days of receipt and so advise the State award official or will notify the State award official within the 30-day period that additional time is necessary.
- (C) In the event the contractor, the laborers or mechanics to be employed in the classification or their representatives, and the sub recipient(s) do not agree on the proposed classification and wage rate (including the amount designated for fringe benefits, where appropriate), documentation of the action taken and the request, including the local wage determination, shall be sent by the sub recipient(s) to the State award official. The State award official will transmit a completed conformance request form (SF-1444 or similar) which indicates the State award

the Secretary of Labor has found under 29 CFR 5.5(a)(1)(iv) that the wages of any laborer or mechanic include the amount of any costs reasonably anticipated in providing benefits under a plan or program described in section 1(b)(2)(B) of the Davis-Bacon Act, the contractor shall maintain records which show that the commitment to provide such benefits is enforceable, that the plan or program is financially responsible, and that the plan or program has been communicated in writing to the laborers or mechanics affected, and records which show the costs anticipated or the actual cost incurred in providing such benefits. Contractors employing apprentices or trainees under approved programs shall maintain written evidence of the registration of apprenticeship programs and certification of trainee programs, the registration of the apprentices and trainees, and the ratios and wage rates prescribed in the applicable programs.

(ii) (A) The contractor shall submit weekly, for each week in which any contract work is performed, a copy of all payrolls to the sub recipient, that is, the entity that receives the sub-grant or loan from the State capitalization grant recipient. Such documentation shall be available on request of the State recipient or EPA. As to each payroll copy received, the sub recipient shall provide written confirmation in a form satisfactory to the State indicating whether or not the project is in compliance with the requirements of 29 CFR 5.5(a)(1) based on the most recent payroll copies for the specified week. The payrolls shall set out accurately and completely all of the information required to be maintained under 29 CFR 5.5(a)(3)(i), except that full social security numbers and home addresses shall not be included on the weekly payrolls. Instead, the payrolls shall only need to include an individually identifying number for each employee (e.g., the last four digits of the employee's social security number). The required weekly payroll information may be submitted in any form desired. Optional Form WH-347 is available for this purpose from the Wage and Hour Division website at <a href="http://www.dol.gov/whd/forms/wh347instr.htm">http://www.dol.gov/whd/forms/wh347instr.htm</a> or its successor site.

The prime contractor is responsible for the submission of copies of payrolls by all subcontractors. Contractors and subcontractors shall maintain the full social security number and current address of each covered worker, and shall provide them upon request to the sub recipient(s) for transmission to the State or EPA if requested by EPA, the State, the contractor, or the Wage and Hour Division of the DOL for purposes of an investigation or audit of compliance with prevailing wage requirements. It is not a violation of this section for a prime contractor to require a subcontractor to provide addresses and social security numbers to the prime contractor for its own records, without weekly submission to the sub recipient(s).

- (B) Each payroll submitted shall be accompanied by a "Statement of Compliance," signed by the contractor or subcontractor or his or her agent who pays or supervises the payment of the persons employed under the contract and shall certify the following:
- (1) That the payroll for the payroll period contains the information required to be provided under § 5.5 (a)(3)(ii) of Regulations, 29 CFR part 5, the appropriate information is being maintained under § 5.5 (a)(3)(i) of Regulations, 29 CFR part 5, and that such information is correct and complete;
- (2) That each laborer or mechanic (including each helper, apprentice, and trainee) employed on the contract during the payroll period has been paid the full weekly wages earned, without

program shall be observed. Every apprentice must be paid at not less than the rate specified in the registered program for the apprentice's level of progress, expressed as a percentage of the journeymen hourly rate specified in the applicable wage determination. Apprentices shall be paid fringe benefits in accordance with the provisions of the apprenticeship program. If the apprenticeship program does not specify fringe benefits, apprentices must be paid the full amount of fringe benefits listed on the wage determination for the applicable classification. If the Administrator determines that a different practice prevails for the applicable apprentice classification, fringes shall be paid in accordance with that determination. In the event the Office of Apprenticeship Training, Employer and Labor Services, or a State Apprenticeship Agency recognized by the Office, withdraws approval of an apprenticeship program, the contractor will no longer be permitted to utilize apprentices at less than the applicable predetermined rate for the work performed until an acceptable program is approved.

- Trainees. Except as provided in 29 CFR 5.16, trainees will not be permitted to work at (ii) less than the predetermined rate for the work performed unless they are employed pursuant to and individually registered in a program which has received prior approval, evidenced by formal certification by the DOL, Employment and Training Administration. The ratio of trainees to journeymen on the job site shall not be greater than permitted under the plan approved by the Employment and Training Administration. Every trainee must be paid at not less than the rate specified in the approved program for the trainee's level of progress, expressed as a percentage of the journeyman hourly rate specified in the applicable wage determination. Trainees shall be paid fringe benefits in accordance with the provisions of the trainee program. If the trainee program does not mention fringe benefits, trainees shall be paid the full amount of fringe benefits listed on the wage determination unless the Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division determines that there is an apprenticeship program associated with the corresponding journeyman wage rate on the wage determination which provides for less than full fringe benefits for apprentices. Any employee listed on the payroll at a trainee rate who is not registered and participating in a training plan approved by the Employment and Training Administration shall be paid not less than the applicable wage rate on the wage determination for the classification of work actually performed. In addition, any trainee performing work on the job site in excess of the ratio permitted under the registered program shall be paid not less than the applicable wage rate on the wage determination for the work actually performed. In the event the Employment and Training Administration withdraws approval of a training program, the contractor will no longer be permitted to utilize trainees at less than the applicable predetermined rate for the work performed until an acceptable program is approved.
- (iii) Equal employment opportunity. The utilization of apprentices, trainees and journeymen under this part shall be in conformity with the equal employment opportunity requirements of Executive Order 11246, as amended and 29 CFR part 30.
- (5) Compliance with Copeland Act requirements. The contractor shall comply with the requirements of 29 CFR part 3, which are incorporated by reference in this contract.
- (6) Subcontracts. The contractor or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses contained in 29 CFR 5.5(a)(1) through (10) and such other clauses as the EPA determines may by appropriate, and also a clause requiring the subcontractors to include these clauses in any

- Violation; liability for unpaid wages; liquidated damages. In the event of any violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (a)(1) of this section the contractor and any subcontractor responsible therefore shall be liable for the unpaid wages. In addition, such contractor and subcontractor shall be liable to the United States (in the case of work done under contract for the District of Columbia or a territory, to such District or to such territory), for liquidated damages. Such liquidated damages shall be computed with respect to each individual laborer or mechanic, including watchmen and guards, employed in violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (a)(1) of this section, in the sum of \$29 for each calendar day on which such individual was required or permitted to work in excess of the standard workweek of forty hours without payment of the overtime wages required by the clause set forth in paragraph (a)(1) of this section.
- (3) Withholding for unpaid wages and liquidated damages. The sub recipient, upon written request of the EPA Award Official or an authorized representative of the DOL, shall withhold or cause to be withheld, from any moneys payable on account of work performed by the contractor or subcontractor under any such contract or any other Federal contract with the same prime contractor, or any other federally-assisted contract subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, which is held by the same prime contractor, such sums as may be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such contractor or subcontractor for unpaid wages and liquidated damages as provided in the clause set forth in paragraph (a)(2) of this section.
- (4) Subcontracts. The contractor or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in paragraph (a)(1) through (4) of this section and also a clause requiring the subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts. The prime contractor shall be responsible for compliance by any subcontractor or lower tier subcontractor with the clauses set forth in paragraphs (a)(1) through (4) of this section.
- (b) In addition to the clauses contained in Item 3, above, in any contract subject only to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act and not to any of the other statutes cited in 29 CFR 5.1, the Sub recipient shall insert a clause requiring that the contractor or subcontractor shall maintain payrolls and basic payroll records during the course of the work and shall preserve them for a period of three years from the completion of the contract for all laborers and mechanics, including guards and watchmen, working on the contract. Such records shall contain the name and address of each such employee, social security number, correct classifications, hourly rates of wages paid, daily and weekly number of hours worked, deductions made, and actual wages paid. Further, the Sub recipient shall insert in any such contract a clause providing that the records to be maintained under this paragraph shall be made available by the contractor or subcontractor for inspection, copying, or transcription by authorized representatives of the EPA and the DOL, and the contractor or subcontractor will permit such representatives to interview employees during working hours on the job.

### 5. Compliance Verification

(a) The sub recipient shall periodically interview a sufficient number of employees entitled to DB prevailing wages (covered employees) to verify that contractors or subcontractors are paying the appropriate wage rates. As provided in 29 CFR 5.6(a)(3), all interviews must be

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF A PHASE-FUNDED CONSULTANT AGREEMENT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$11 MILLION WITH RICHARD BRADY & ASSOCIATES, INC. FOR CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT PROFESSIONAL SERVICES FOR THE ALVARADO 2ND EXTENSION PIPELINE PROJECT AND RELATED ACTIONS.

## **RECITALS**

The Council of the City of San Diego (Council) adopts this Resolution based on the following:

- A. The City seeks to provide redundancy in the water system and efficient delivery of water treated at the Alvarado Water Treatment Plant to the coastal communities by completing the Alvarado 2nd Extension Pipeline project (Project), which will complete a water transmission system through Mission Valley by connecting the Alvarado 2nd Pipeline with both the Morena and Pacific Beach Pipelines.
- B. The Project will install a new transmission main approximately 6.44 miles in length, and replace approximately 3.78 miles of existing distribution mains, which run parallel to the transmission main. Other Project work will include pedestrian curb ramps, street resurfacing, and the replacement of in-kind bike lane facilities within the Project's footprint and in accordance with the current Bike Master Plan.

- C. On January 4, 2024, the City advertised a Request for Proposal (RFP) for construction management services for the Project. Three firms submitted timely proposals in response to the RFP. City staff selected Richard Brady & Associates, Inc. based on its qualifications in accordance with Council Policy 300-07.
- D. The City now desires to retain Richard Brady & Associates, Inc. to provide professional construction management services for the Project, including but not limited to construction management resident engineer, survey, inspection, hazardous materials monitoring, environmental and waste management coordination, equipment and system testing, and Project closeout services. The City and Richard Brady & Associates, Inc. negotiated a Consultant Agreement, included in the docket materials accompanying this Resolution. The Consultant Agreement is for a term of five years and an amount not to exceed \$11 million, including up to \$1,383,964 for Funding Phase 1 and up to \$9,616,036 for all subsequent phases.
- E. The Office of the City Attorney prepared this Resolution based on the information provided by City staff (including information provided by affected third parties and verified by City staff), with the understanding that this information is complete and accurate.
