

## **Parking Lot Restoration Planned for Miramar Reservoir**

Nov. 1, 2024

From sunset on Monday, Nov. 4, to the early morning of Wednesday, Nov. 6, the City of San Diego's contractor will be performing paving and striping work in the main parking lot at Miramar Reservoir as part of the City's Subaqueous Pipeline project. All vehicles must be removed from the parking lot when the Miramar Reservoir gate closes at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, Nov. 4. For everyone's safety, pedestrian and bike access will not be available during this time.

**When:** Work will begin after the reservoir closes at sunset on the evening of Monday, Nov. 4. All reservoir access, including the parking lot, will be closed to the public on Tuesday, Nov. 5. Miramar Reservoir is closed on the first Tuesday of each month. Work has been scheduled with this in mind, so as not to heavily impact daily activities.

Please be advised that the parking lot restoration will take place around the clock from the evening of Monday, Nov. 4, through the morning of Wednesday, Nov. 6. Miramar Reservoir is expected to reopen on the morning of Wednesday, Nov. 6 after work concludes. This timing is subject to change, pending completion of the paving work.

**What to Expect:** All vehicles must be removed from the parking lot when the Miramar Reservoir gate closes at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, Nov. 4. Any vehicle left in the parking lot after this time will be towed. For everyone's safety, pedestrian and bike access will not be available during the paving process. Please follow all posted No Parking signage. Properties near the reservoir may experience overnight construction noise as part of this work. The City is committed to minimizing impacts to the greatest extent possible.

**Why:** This project is part of Pure Water San Diego, the City of San Diego's phased, multi-year program that will provide nearly half of San Diego's water supply locally. The Pure Water Program will use proven water purification technology to clean recycled water to produce safe, high-quality drinking water. The Program offers a cost-effective investment for San Diego's water needs and will provide a reliable, sustainable water supply.
