- License Plate Recognition



San Ysidro Parking Study

Existing Parking Inventory

- 2,216 total parking spaces observed in parking study
 - 504 on-street spaces (23%)
 - Includes long-term and short-term spaces (15- and 30- minute time limit, taxi only, commercial loading)
 - 1,712 off-street spaces (77%)
 - Paid parking ranged from \$6 \$14 per hour



San Ysidro Parking Study

On-Street Parking Occupancy – Weekend (Saturday)

- Higher percentages are observed in early morning (8-10 am) and afternoon (2-4 pm)
- 9 segments were observed with 100% occupancy within five observed periods
- Locations with short-term (15-30 mins) parking and taxi designated spaces were observed to be <50% occupied throughout the day
- Average vehicle duration in study area: 3hrs 14 mins





Parking Management Recommendations

- Re-evaluate short term parking needs (15-minute, passenger loading zone, designated taxi areas)
- Improve education and enforcement
- Parking meters in areas where time limit parking is not effective
- Streetscape and pedestrian improvements
- Mobility hub amenities (secure bike parking, wayfinding, etc.)





Timeline

- Resolution to assign Advisory Board was approved December 2023.
- Working closely with EDD to identify a non-profit entity to oversee the CPD.
- Execute operating agreement and start scoping budget and program priorities for the area.
