


Safety Tip: Office Ergonomics



Open Space and the San Diego River Park Foundation





On January 30, Open Space park staff joined the San Diego River Park Foundation in counting and interviewing individuals experiencing homelessness in and along the San Diego River. The Regional Task Force on Homelessness (RTFH) compiles the data from the federally mandated Point-in-Time count to aid in local decision-making and planning. This annual census is vital to bringing more social services to individuals experiencing homelessness in our community, including the riverbed.

Rescue at Black Mountain Trail





Rangers were paged by the Fire Department for an open space rescue. Rangers secured a landing zone suspending recreational activities and clearing the baseball field for an air to ground extrication. First responders assisted the nonambulatory patient out of the helicopter and loaded them onto an ambulance.

Park Rangers: Large Cleanup at South Shores



Teamwork makes the dream work! On **January 22nd Mission Bay Park** Rangers partnered with SDPD, Beach Mechanized who provided loaders and dump trucks and Grounds Maintenance staff to remove over a ton of trash and debris from an open space area near South Shores Park. A drone operator from the Silent Electric Flyers Club, who maintain a model aircraft flight area at South Shores, observed a large dump site via his aircraft camera that was almost undetectable from the ground. The operator provided Rangers with the photos and some directions to the sites and thus we were able to easily locate and remove the debris. Thanks to all of our coworkers for lending a hand!
