MISSION

The Urban Forestry Program plants, protects, promotes, and maintains trees for livable and sustainable communities.

VISION

Grow and maintain a world-class urban forest for San Diego.



Tree Maintenance Provided by Urban Forestry

- Over 250,000 street trees and ~600,000 park trees
- Prunes 50,000+ palm and shade trees each year
- 1,200 park and street trees planted in FY23
- 6,000 Get It Done street tree requests per year
- Emergency tree pruning/removals for public safety

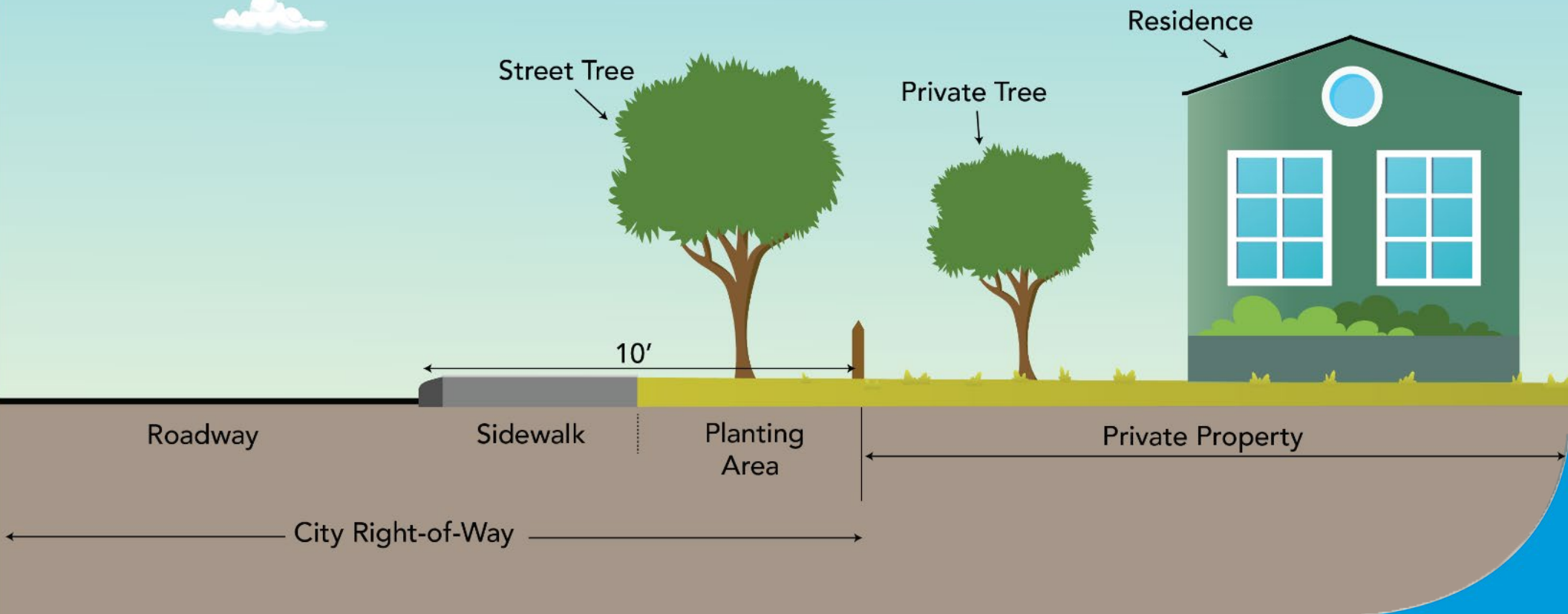

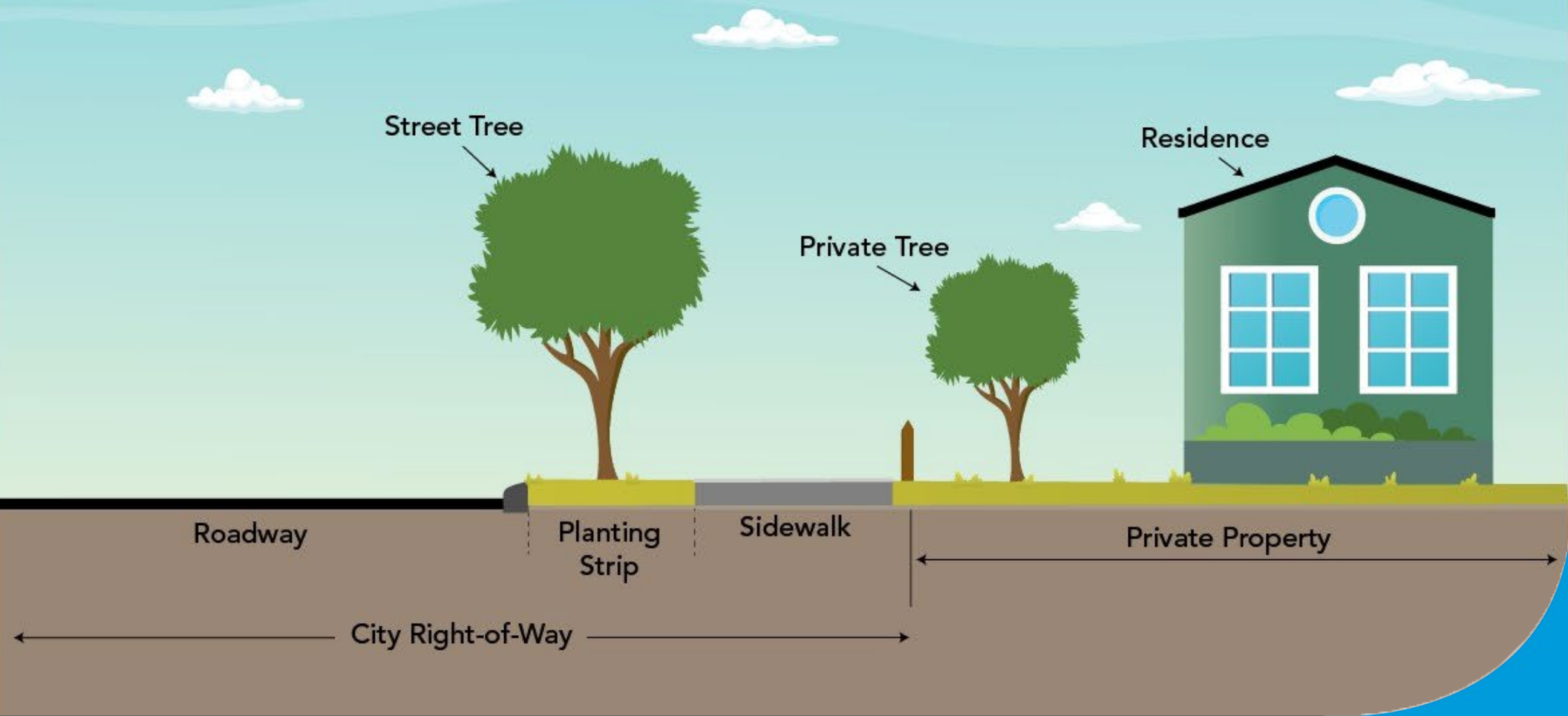
Understanding City Right-of-Way

Sidewalk Curb Adjacent

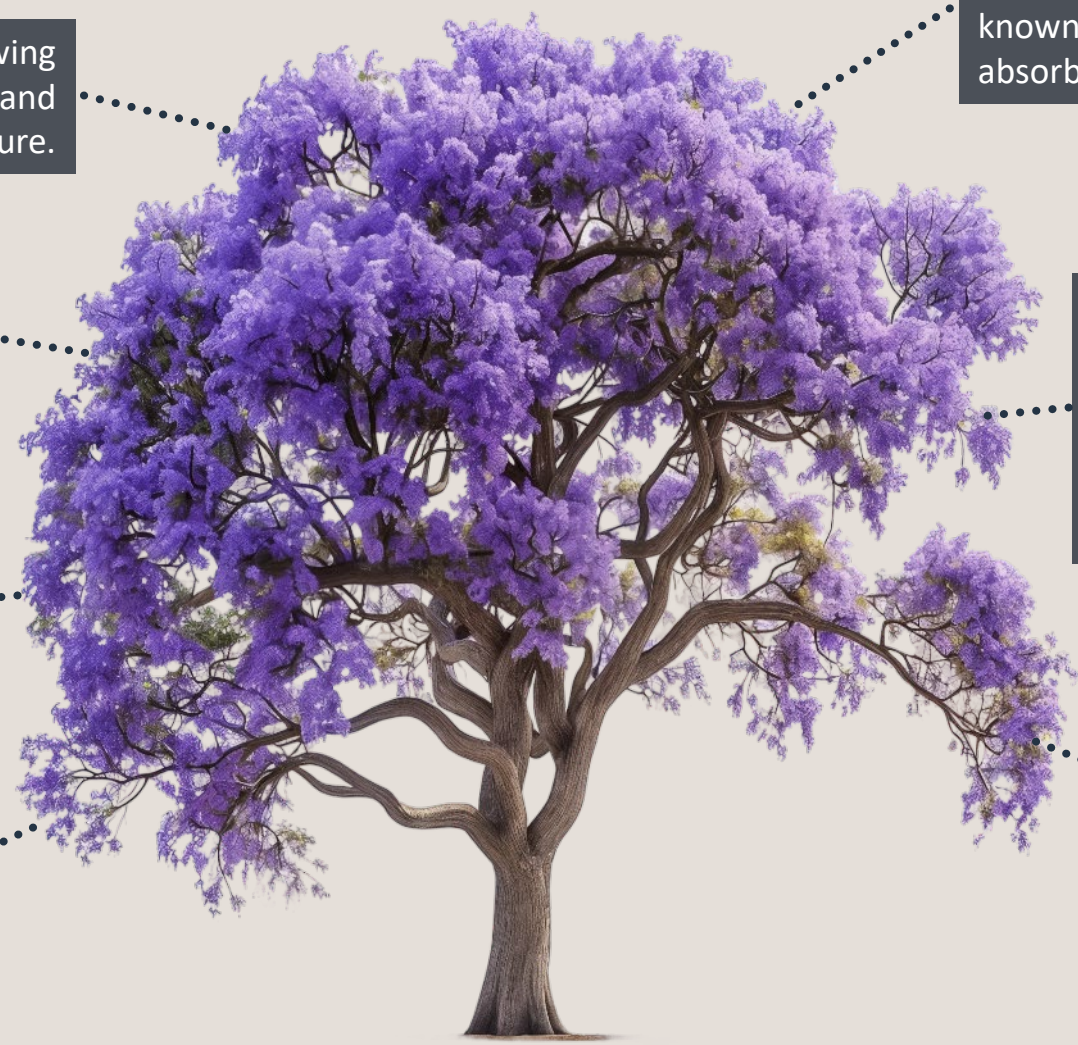


Understanding City Right-of-Way

Benefits of Trees



Provide shade, allowing more time outdoors and less sun exposure.

Water from roots is drawn up to the leaves where it evaporates, known as evapotranspiration, absorbing heat and cooling the air.

Filter dust and remove toxic pollutants from the atmosphere.

Intercept rainwater which aids soil absorption for gradual release into streams, preventing flooding, and extending water availability into dry months.

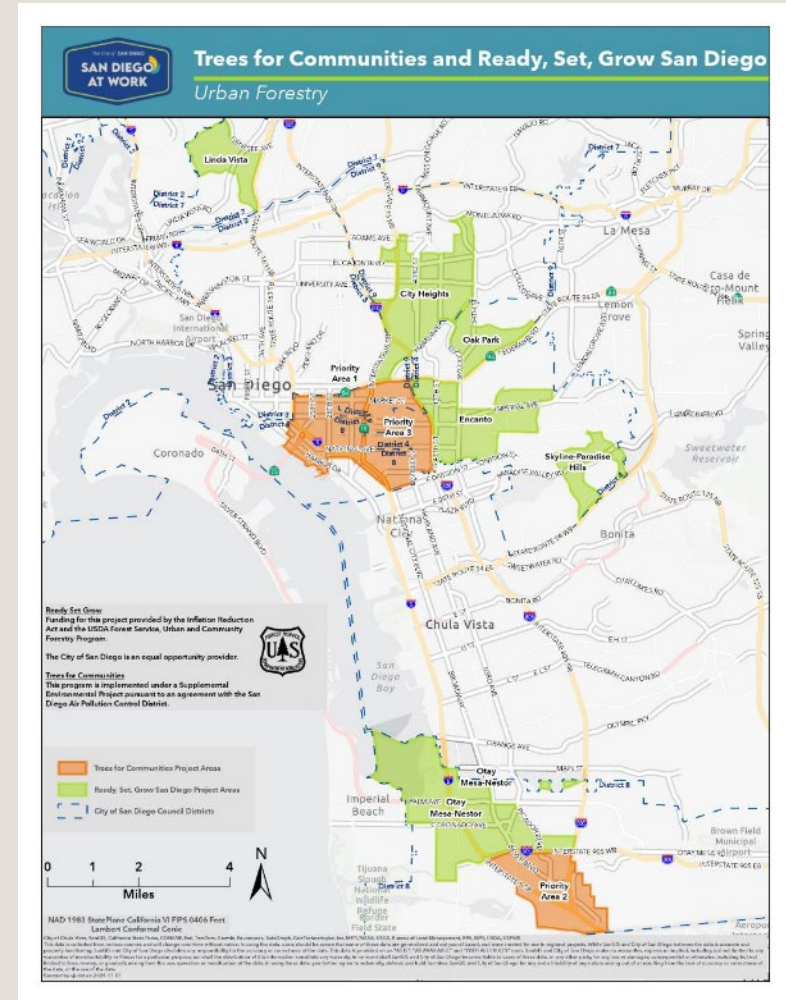
Improve the aesthetic environment, absorb noise, reduce stress, and decrease crime.

Ready, Set, Grow San Diego

- \$10 million in USDA Forest Service grant for multi-year planting program.
- Plant over 5,000 new trees, expand existing, and create new tree wells.
- Tree protection - Sidewalk repairs.
- 4 new positions to support projects
- Project kickoff - November 8, 2024
 - 11 trees planted
 - Over 150 volunteers
- South Bay communities: starting Winter 2025
