NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit - PanCAN PurpleStride

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Mission Bay Park

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 2

LOCATION: De Anza Cove and surrounding pathways in Mission Bay Park

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a 1-mile and 5K Run/Walk event that would include the temporary use of the run/walk routes, children's activities, vendors, a stage, generators, sound amplification, entertainment, pre-packaged food, inflatables, trash/recycling containers, portable restrooms, tents/canopies, temporary structures, tables, and chairs that would occur at De Anza Cove Park and on the pathways and East Mission Bay Drive around De Anza Cove in Mission Bay Park on April 26, 2025. Sound amplification from performances and announcements would occur from 7:30 AM until 11 AM on April 26, 2025. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur between 7 AM on April 25, 2025, until 5 PM on April 26, 2025. Set-up would occur from 7 AM until 5 PM on April 25, 2025, and from 5 AM until 7:30 AM on April 26, 2025. The event would occur on April 26, 2025, from 7:30 AM until 11 AM, and dismantling would occur from 11 AM until 5 PM. The festival site would be located at De Anza Cove between the NE and NW parking lots on the grass.

Road closures associated with this event would occur from 8 AM until 10:30 AM and would include full closure of Mission Bay Drive from De Anza Cove to Playa Pacifica.

Parking closures associated with this event would occur from 8 AM until 5 PM on April 25, 2025, and would include bottom (southern) most row of 19 parking spaces in the NW De Anza Parking Lot.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section

15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

The appeal filing fee must be United States Postal Service (USPS) postmarked) before or on the final date of the appeal.

Bring the fully completed appeal application DS-3031 (including grounds for appeal and supporting documentation) to the City Administration Building— Public Information Counter (Open 8:00am to 5:00pm Monday through Friday excluding City approved holidays), 1st Floor Lobby, located at 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101, by 5:00pm on the last day of the appeal period. The completed appeal form shall include the required appeal fee, with a check payable to: City Treasurer.

ROUTE RULES

- Participants to exit the event site passed the east side of the east De Anza Lot, cutting through the grass and entering Mission Bay.
- Head south on Mission Bay/E Mission Bay
- 1mi Turn-around option at boat launch (3mi participants continue on)
- Exit the road at Playa Pacifica Park
- Follow parking lot road until entering the Bikeway to the west of the 1093 E Mission Bay Parking Lot
- Follow Bikeway north until finish line at Event Site

ROUTE RULES

- Mission Bay Drive between Event Site at De Anza Cove and Playa Pacifica Park is FULLY CLOSED.
- Exit the event site passed the east side of East De Anza Lot, cutting through the grass to enter Mission Bay (700 feet)
- Head south on Mission Bay/E Mission Bay (0.35mi)
- 1mi Turn-around option at boat launch
 - 3mile participants continue on for 0.843mi to Playa Pacifica Park
 - Optional Early Turnaround: Right turn off Mission Bay into Boat Launch, right turn onto Bikeway – return to event site (0.42mi)
- 3mile participants Exit Mission Bay Drive at Playa Pacifica Park
 - Follow parking lot road until entering the Bikeway to the west of the 1093 E Mission Bay Parking Lot (1,120 feet)
- Follow Bikeway north until finish line at Event Site (1.56mi)
