Telling Our Stories and Preserving Our Histories: The Chicano Movement in San Diego

September 16-October 18, 2024

This was our sixth year celebrating this significant month and this year we combined both "American Archives Month" as well as "Hispanic/Latino Heritage Month" for the first time! Our exhibit highlighted the oldest neighborhood in San Diego, "Barrio Logan", by exploring change over time. The compelling stories of the Chicano Movement in San Diego was introduced and realized through the land takeover and the establishment of Chicano Park. We feature the impact of change on the various communities that comprise our City's history and provide a window into community responses to change encounters. As the title of our exhibit affirms – our overarching objective was to tell these stories of change to document and preserve our collective history within the Chicana and Chicano Context.

History of Chinese Fishermen in San Diego

The display consists of several panels that describe different aspects of the Chinese fishing industry in San Diego, from its heyday in the 1860s to its fall amidst anti-Chinese sentiment in the early 1900s. Around the late 1850's, the Chinese came to San Diego from San Francisco after the Gold Rush. At the peak of the Chinese fishing industry, there were as many as 15 Chinese sailboats in the harbor.

Historical Firsts of the San Diego Police Department

This exhibit highlights the historical significance and cultural impact of the 135-year legacy of the San Diego Police Department, which has exemplified diversity, innovation, and numerous historical milestones. The exhibit aims to enrich lives by educating citizens about the historical role of our government and sharing stories from all of our communities..

SIGNIFICANCE

This collection is widely utilized by both our internal and external customers, particularly in the processing of Public Records Act requests, and has proven to be a beneficial resource in case law and the on-going demands of legal research.

We are gaining momentum since the project kicked off in 2016, ensuring all Resolutions produced by the City have made a return to the City Clerk Archives for safe keeping and ongoing preservation efforts by digitizing our City's official statehood records.

This is one of the City Clerk Archives most comprehensive projects to date.

From the City Clerk Archives: 1968



Take a look at this photo of Data Processing personnel in the City Administration Building basement in 1968. IBM 360 computer, teletype interface and hard drives were in use. The IBM System 360 was a mainframe computer system announced by IBM in 1964 and delivered between 1965 and 1978. It was the first family of computers designed to cover a complete range of applications, both commercial and scientific.

Nearly 60 years later, the City of San Diego has its own Information Technology department that handles innovative computer systems and applications to ensure that various departments are safe and secure.



Elizabeth and Prince Philip.


The photo was taken in 1983 when the royal couple arrived in San Diego on the Royal Yacht Britannia for their 10-day West Coast tour. President Ronald Reagan hosted the visit, which was called 'The Scuba Tour' because of the almost constant rain.

Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip visited San Diego, Palm Springs, Los Angeles, Sierra Madre, Duarte, Santa Barbara, San Francisco, Sacramento, Stanford, Palo Alto, Yosemite and Seattle.

From the Archives: Mission Bay Bathtub Races




Take a look at this photo of participants preparing to launch in the 1973 Bathtub Races in Mission Bay. The races were held at Crown Point Shores as part of activities celebrating San Diego's America's Finest City Week, Aug. 24-31, 1973.

The boats were small watercraft designed around bathtubs or close facsimiles. The rules restricted the engine to 8 horsepower and the weight to a minimum of 350 pounds, including the driver.




