

LIVE EVENTS

March 2025 - The City Council passed a new ordinance regulating complex live events at City-owned facilities and parks.

The amendments require live event vendors at City-owned facilities and parks to certify that live event workers have completed the relevant Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) 10-hour course, and supervisors have completed the relevant OSHA 30-hour course and are certified through the Entertainment Technician Certification Program (ETCP) for the work performed within the applicable trade. It would require live event vendors to certify that all employees involved in the setup, operation or teardown of these events have completed the applicable OSHA course. The law does not impact events happening in the Right of Way. It will go into effect **July 1, 2025**. The Special Events & Filming Office's online permitting system (Eproval) will be updated to reflect this change and to request compliance verification.
