CALL TO ORDER – Chairperson, Jeff Johnson called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES – February 4, 2025

A motion was made by G. Ingolia and seconded by J. Gross to approve the February 4, 2025 Mission Bay Park Committee meeting minutes as written. The motion carried 8–0 with 1 abstention (J. Munoz)

CHAIRPERSONS REPORT – Jeff Johnson

Chair Johnson stated that he met with City officials regarding the South Shores GDP Amendment and shared his concerns about the old toxic landfill under that area. He recommended that a study be conducted to verify if the land is safe to develop as a park prior to moving forward with a GDP amendment. Perhaps a sub-committee will be needed to initiate the study?

STAFF REPORTS

San Diego Lifeguard Service – Brian Clark reported that Lifeguards are preparing for Spring Break by onboarding seasonal lifeguards for weekends until summer. The boating safety unit will add staff as well

San Diego Police Department – no report

Parks and Recreation

Karolynn Estrada provided a brief update on the Park Ranger Program for coastal communities. Volunteer clean-ups occurred at Fiesta Island Youth Camp and Sunset Cliffs. Rangers as assisting to prepare sites for Last Tern breading season. Lots of special events during the Spring months. Karolynn briefly described the BACC program to perform volunteer community service at the park in lieu of minor citation penalty

Note: Beach Area Community Court started in 2005 as a pilot project funded by a \$200,000 federal grant from the Bureau of Justice Assistance. It is now run by the \$40 fee received from the offenders for admin costs for this alternative court. Park Rangers work with the City Attorney's Office, Discover PB, SDPD, Scripps and the community. Restorative Justice Model emphasizes education and making amends, and is often credited with reducing recidivism and improving the quality of life of communities that embrace it

Mike Rodrigues reported that a contractor has been selected for Crown Point Shores improvement project, expect to start seeing activity at end of March. The Sunset Point and DeAnza Northwest parking lot projects are complete and open to the public

Cris Amezcua reported on upcoming turf aerification and tree trimming throughout Mission Bay Park

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301. Tsunami on the Bay – Free Music Event

Reuben Atkatz requested approval and support to conduct a live entertainment music event at Fiesta Island's beach area across from OTL fields on October 26, 2025 from 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. No road closures or alcohol. There will be food vendors and art exhibitors. Estimated attendance is 275 through the day. Load in at 10:00 a.m., out by 8:00 p.m.

Staff recommendation is to approve the request with the following requirements. All park rules and regulations must be adhered to. No alcohol, glass containers or smoking at any time. Desired location must be secured in advance with signs and barricades. Fiesta Island Rd must remain clear at all times. Fencing and additional portable toilets required. All trash must be removed off site by the organizer. FIDO must be notified in advance. Citywide special event permit required for on-site vendor sales

MOTION: MOVED/SECONDED

A motion was made by J. Johnson and seconded by J. Munoz to approve the request with staff recommendations and moving the event to the north away from the fenced dog area parking area or across the road at the OTL courts. The motion carried 9–0

302. RunThrough USA

Brandon Gillingham, head of US Operations RunThrough USA requested approval and support to conduct a 5K & 10K running event at Crown Point Shores on Saturday, October 18, 2025 from 9:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m., load in at 6:00 a.m., out by 1:00 p.m. Estimated attendance is 1500 participants, amplified music with announcements beginning at 7:30 a.m. No alcohol or vendors sales. No road closures, a portion of the Crown Point parking lot will be used

Staff does not recommend using Bayside Walk between Crown Point and El Carmel for a competitive run at 9:00 a.m. on a Sunday morning

This item failed to receive a motion. It was recommended for the organizer to revise the route with earlier start times and re-visit the Committee at a later date for consideration

Public Electric Vehicle Charging Program Overview – Anna Lowe, Program Manager from Zero Emissions Vehicles, Sustainability and Mobility Department provided and overview of the new Public EV Charging Program with incudes a 10-year service agreement for swap outs and additional charging stations

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There were some questions about revenue and where it goes. Anna replied that a special account will be set up to bank the revenues generated during this agreement term and these revenues may be used for future upgrades after 10 years
