


Update: Child and Youth Plan

Positive Youth Development Framework

A number of focus areas of the San Diego Child and Youth Plan are aligned with the Positive Youth Development (PYD) framework. PYD is a prosocial approach that focuses on youth within their communities, schools, organizations, peer groups, and families with the purpose to construct, recognize, and leverage young people's strengths.

OCYS will partner with a consulting firm to provide information, resources, and professional learning about PYD to City of San Diego staff from different departments whose work is relevant to youth and youth development. The intention is to support City staff to learn about PYD and reflect on how services and programs for youth align with the framework.



The PYD framework aims to achieve the vision of healthy, productive, and engaged youth, programs, practices, and policies to work with youth to improve their agency, assets, contribution, and enabling environment. (YouthPower)
