Police Investigate Suspicious Death on North Harbor Drive

San Diego — On Wednesday, April 2, 2025, at approximately 01:29 a.m., a security guard working at the Maritime Museum called 911 and reported an unidentified female stated she heard a gunshot and then observed a male on the ground. Officers from the San Diego Harbor Police Department responded to check the area. While searching the area of 1700 N. Harbor Drive, they located a White male in his 40's with an apparent gunshot wound to his upper body. Paramedics responded and ultimately pronounced the male deceased at 02:00 a.m.

There was a firearm recovered at the scene, and based on Harbor Police Department's initial observations it was believed the male's injuries were likely self-inflicted. The male has been identified however his name is not being released at this time pending family notifications.

The San Diego County Medical Examiner's Office responded. During their preliminary investigation, and out of an abundance of caution, the Medical Examiner Investigator requested the San Diego Police Department's Homicide Unit respond to investigate what led up to the man's death. The cause of death is still under investigation and will be determined by the Medical Examiner.

The investigation is ongoing and there is no suspect information to release at this time.
