Section 1. That the Board of Fire Commissioners of the City of San Diego be, and are hereby authorized to appoint a Superintendent of the Fire Alarm System and that said Fire Alarm System shall be kept in repair at the expense of the Superintendent of the Fire Alarm System.

Section 2. That the salary of the Superintendent of the Fire Alarm System be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of fifty (\$50<sup>00</sup>) dollars per month, said salary to be paid from the Fire Department Fund.

An Ordinance for the protection of the Fire Alarm  
wires and Bases in the City of San Diego, and fixing the  
penalty for cutting or sending a malicious false alarm  
from any of the Bases to the Fire Department.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City  
of San Diego, as follows:-

Section 1 It shall be unlawful for any person or persons  
to cut or in any manner disable or make inop-  
erative any of the wires, guy wires, Bases Bell Tower or  
any other appliances connected with the Fire Alarm Sys-  
tem of the City of San Diego.

Section 2 That it shall be unlawful for any person or  
persons engaged in removing houses or other struc-  
tures when it becomes necessary to cut any of the wires or  
guy wires of the fire alarm to let such houses or structures  
pass, to cut any such wires for such purpose without first  
having giving a notice of not less than twenty-four to  
the Chief Engineer of the Fire Department and the Superinten-  
dent of the Fire Alarm, of their intention to cut said  
wires for said purpose, and said wires shall not be so  
cut except under the direction of the Chief of the Fire Depart-  
ment and Superintendent of Fire Alarm and such  
person or persons so cutting any of the main wires or guy wires  
of the fire alarm shall not permit them to remain cut for a  
longer period than one hour, provided that any person  
or persons having said wires cut for their accommodation  
must at their own expense have the wires or guy wires  
repaired to the satisfaction of the Chief of the Fire Department  
and Superintendent of the Fire Alarm

Section 3 It shall be unlawful for any person or persons  
to send in from any Box or Bell a malicious  
false alarm for the purpose of calling out the Fire Depart-  
ment for their own amusement

Section 4 It shall be unlawful for any person to  
wilfully or maliciously remove the Key  
to any Alarm Box from the place in which it is kept

for the use of the public.

Section 5. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and fined in a sum not exceeding one hundred (\$100.00) dollars and not less than fifty dollars, or imprisonment in the City jail for a period not exceeding three months nor less than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval and one publication in the San Diego Daily Sun,

III. That the track shall be four feet eight and one half inches within the rails; and shall have a space between them, and between side tracks, turnouts and switches, of not exceeding six feet four inches, being sufficient to allow the cars to pass each other freely.

Dougherty and A. C. Younkis, Commissioners appointed by the Common Council of said City to assess the benefits and damages incurred in changing the grade of "D" Street from the East line of 15<sup>th</sup> Street to the East line of 22<sup>d</sup> Street, had been published for the period of ten days from the 28<sup>th</sup> day of April 1892 to the 8<sup>th</sup> day of May 1892, to wit: upon the 28, 29 & 30<sup>th</sup> days of April 1892 and upon the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>d</sup>, 3<sup>d</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> days of May 1892. Dougherty and A. C. Younkis, Commissioners appointed by the Common Council of said City to assess the benefits and damages incurred by reason of the change of grade of "D" Street from the East line of 15<sup>th</sup> Street to the East line of 22<sup>d</sup> Street. Said affidavit was received and filed.

The Report of the Commissioners appointed to assess benefits and damages in the Matter of the Change of grade of "D" Street from 15<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>d</sup> Streets was read and on Motion of Alderman Christian said Report was confirmed and adopted and is as follows, to wit:

To the Common Council of the City of San Diego:

We the undersigned Commissioners appointed by your Honorable body respectfully submit the following report, to-wit: On the 4<sup>th</sup> day of January 1892 and on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of January 1892 a Resolution of Intentions was passed your body, of which the following is a copy:

Resolution of Intentions

To change the grade of "D" Street from 15<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>d</sup> Streets,

Resolved that it is the intention of the Common Council of the City of San Diego, State of California, to order the following Street work to be done, to-wit:

To change the grade of "D" Street from the east line of 15<sup>th</sup> Street to the east line of 22<sup>d</sup> Streets as follows, to-wit:

At the southwest corner of "D" and 16<sup>th</sup> Streets from 50.0 to 56.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof from 50.0 to 56.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof from 50.0 to 56.0 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof from 50.0 to 56.0 feet.

At the southwest corner of "D" and 17<sup>th</sup> Streets from 53.0 to 64.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof, from 53.0 to 64.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof from 54.0 to 65.0 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof from 54.0 to 65.0 feet.

At the southwest corner of "D" and 20<sup>th</sup> Streets from 93.0 to 95.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof from 93.0 to 95.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof from 95.0 to 96.0 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof from 95.0 to 96.0 feet.

At the southwest corner of "D" and 21<sup>st</sup> Streets from 112.0 to 116.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof from 112.0 to 116.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof from 114.0 to 117.0 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof from 114.0 to 117.0 feet.

At the southwest corner of "D" and 22<sup>d</sup> Streets from 141.0 to 139.0 feet; at the northwest corner thereof from 141.0 to 139.0 feet; at the southeast corner thereof from 143.0 to 140.0 feet; and at the northeast corner thereof from 143.0 to 140.0 feet.

And the grade of said "D" Street, between the points fixed hereby (from 15<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>d</sup> Streets) shall be of uniform ascent and descent as shown by the grade map made by the City Engineer and on file in his office; and that the damages costs and expenses of making said improvement shall be assessed in proportion to benefits upon a District the extreme boundaries of which are hereby fixed as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point one hundred and (150) feet south of the southwest corner of "D" and Twenty<sup>(24)</sup> sixth Street, thence running westerly westerly producing a line 150 feet from and



parallel with the south line of "II" Street to a point on the east line of 15<sup>th</sup> Street, thence north along the east line of 15<sup>th</sup> Street to a point one hundred and fifty (150) feet north of the north line of "II" Street; thence east or easterly producing a line one hundred and fifty (150) feet from and parallel with the north line of "II" Street to a point on the west line of 26<sup>th</sup> Street; thence south along the west line of said 26<sup>th</sup> Street three hundred and eighty (380) feet to the point of beginning.

The Daily Sun is hereby designated as the Daily Newspaper, published and circulated in the City, in which this Resolution of Intention shall be published for ten days, and the notice of the passage thereof as often as said newspaper is issued therein.

The Clerk of this City is hereby directed to publish and post this resolution in the manner prescribed by law.

S. Martha at San Diego his post office address, that said notice was so deposited in said post office more than five

days prior to the date for the hearing on said petition and more than 30 days after the date of the first publication of said notice of intention. That after such qualification they together with a Committee of said City Council on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of March 1892 proceeded to view the lands described in said Resolution of Intention and examined all property affected by said proposed change of grade within the described district. That after viewing said premises the Commissioners examined witnesses and proofs offered, and after

Considering the same, they proceeded to determine the value and amount of damages and benefits to the property affected, and also the amount of the expenses incident to said change of grade and assessed the same upon the district of lands declared benefited the exterior boundaries of which were fixed by said Resolution of Intentions.

To the Honorable the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California:

The San Diego Electric Railway Company, a corporation, petitions the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California for authority to construct, and maintain and operate for the period of twenty five years in junction with the railway track already constructed, an additional street railway track along and upon the following named streets in the City of San Diego, California, to wit: on and along Arctic Street from the center line of "H" Street to the center line of "D" Street.

Upon the following conditions and limitations, viz:

#### I.

That cars upon said railway shall be propelled by electricity, but if at any time the said railway cannot be operated by electricity, owing to accident to the machinery or appliances, horses or mules may be used to propel cars thereon during the time necessary to repair such machinery or appliances.

#### II.

That the grantor or its assigns shall plank, pave, or macadamize, as the said Council may direct, the entire length of that portion of said street used by said railway tracks, between

the rails and for two feet on each side thereof, and between the tracks; and keep the same constantly in repair, furnished with the stuts, and with good crossings.

III.

That the track shall be, four feet eight and one half inches within the rails and shall have a space between them, and between side tracks, turnouts and switches, of not exceeding six feet four inches being sufficient to allow the cars to pass each other freely.

IV.

That work on the construction of said railway shall commence within two days after the granting of the franchise therefor, and the same shall be wholly completed within fifty days thereafter; and electric shall be in operation thereon within ninety days thereafter.

Section 1 It shall be unlawful for any Proprietor Manager or Keeper of any public place where the games of Billiards or Pool are carried on or conducted to permit any Minor under the age of 16 years to play either of said games of Billiards or Pool in said place or to allow said Minor to remain in said place while said games of Billiards or Pool, is being played or carried on, unless said Minors are accompanied by parents or guardian.

Section 2 Every person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined in a sum not less than Twenty five (\$25<sup>00</sup>) dollars or more than three hundred dollars (\$300<sup>00</sup>) or by imprisonment in the City jail of the City of San Diego for a term not exceeding three months or by such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval and one publication in the San Diego Daily Sun.

An Ordinance granting a Franchise to the San Diego Electric Railway Company for authority to construct, and maintain and operate for the period of twenty five years an additional street railway track along and over Arctic Street, from the center of "H" Street to the center of "D" Street, in the City of San Diego, California.

Be It Ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the San Diego Electric Railway Company, a corporation, have, and it is hereby granted authority to construct, and maintain and operate for the period of twenty five years, an additional street railway track along and upon the following street in the City of San Diego California, to wit:

On Arctic Street, from the center of "H" Street to the center of "D" Street.

Upon the following conditions and limitations, viz:

I. That the cars upon said railway shall be propelled by electricity, but if at any time the said railway cannot be operated by electricity owing to accident to the machinery or appurtenances horses or mules may be used to propel cars thereon during the time necessary to repair such machinery or appurtenances.

II. That the grantee or its assigns shall plank, pave, or macadamize, as the said Council may direct, the entire length of that portion of said street, used by said railway tracks between the rails and for two feet on each side thereof, and between the track, and keep the same constantly in repair, flush with the street and with good crossings.

III. That the track shall be four feet eight and one-half inches within the rails; and shall have a space between them, and between sidetracks, turnouts, and switches, of not exceeding six feet four inches, being sufficient to allow the cars to pass each other freely.

IV. That work on the construction of said railway shall commence within two days after the granting of the franchise therefor and the same shall be wholly completed within sixty days thereafter, and Electric Cars shall be in operation thereon within ninety days thereafter.

**IV.** That the right to grade, sewer, pave, macadamize or otherwise improve, or alter or repair the said streets shall be reserved to the City of San Diego: such work to be done so as to obstruct the said railway as little as possible. The grantee or its assigns shall shift and reshift its rails so as to avoid the obstructions created thereby.

**V.** That the laying of said tracks, and all side tracks, turn-outs, switches or crossovers shall conform in all cases with the grades of said streets which have been graded, and in all other cases as near to the natural grade of such street as practicable and when at any time any part of said route shall be graded, or the grade thereof altered or changed by the said Common Council, the bed of the road and the tracks thereon shall be made to conform therewith by the grantee or its assigns. The said tracks shall be so constructed and laid that each track on said Arctic Street shall be of equal distance from the curb lines of said streets.

**VI.** No switch shall be constructed or maintained within fifty feet of any cross street, and the location of such switches and all turnouts shall be changed at the expense of the grantee or its assigns whenever so ordered by said Common Council.

**VII.** That the City Engineer shall under the direction of the Common Council, give the established grade of the streets along the line of construction of said railway, and set stakes indicating the said grade; he shall see that the said railway is constructed and maintained in conformity to the terms and requirements of the franchise; and for his services as herein required he shall receive such fees as are provided therefor, and the same shall be paid by the grantee or its assigns.

**VIII.** That the failure to comply with any of the conditions of the franchise shall work a forfeiture of the rights and privileges granted thereby.

An Ordinance Regulating the Manner of the erection and Maintenance of the poles; and the Trolley, Guide, Guard, and Board Wires, of Electric Street Railways in the City of

San Diego, State of California,

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California as follows:

Section 1. That the poles of all Electric Street Railways for supporting the trolley and feeder wires shall be at least twenty three (23) feet in height above the curb line of the Street of said City, over and along all Streets on which Franchises for the operation of an electric Street railway have been or may hereafter be granted in said City. The said poles shall be of sound, straight pieces of wood, dressed to present a neat appearance and pointed. The said poles shall extend into the ground at least five (5) feet below the curb line, and shall be set on both sides of the Street within the curb and as near thereto as practicable; and shall be set with such inclination as will allow them to come to and assume a vertical position when the strain of the span wire is applied.

The said poles shall not be placed at a further distance apart than one hundred and twenty (120) feet, nor nearer together than eighty five (85) feet, except that extra poles may be used as pull-off poles at switches, curves and cross-overs, as may be necessary.

Section 2. That the trolley wire used by any electric Street railway shall be an uncovered wire of suitable size to conduct an electric current of not exceeding five hundred (500) volts to the Motor cars, and shall be supported over the center of each track by cross suspension wires attached to the poles, and shall be not less than nineteen (19) feet above the rails at the points of suspension. The cross suspension wires shall be galvanized iron or other suitable wire, and shall support the trolley wire by means of insulated hangers.

The strain or pull-off wires shall be similar to cross suspension wires. The feeder wires shall be insulated, and shall be supported on the poles. Ground wires of ample strength shall be placed above the trolley wires whenever telephones, telegraph or electric light wires cross the trolley wires. Such bond wires as are necessary to connect the rails to complete the circuit may be used below the surface of the Street.

Section 3. There is hereby reserved to the City of San Diego the right to run and maintain a wire on the top of all of said poles for Fire Alarm purposes.

Section 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in

At their first meeting they shall organize as a Board by electing one of their number as President, and one as Secretary, who shall each hold their office as such for the term of one year, and until his successor is elected. If they fail from any cause to so elect for more than ten days, after at least two have qualified, the Mayor shall designate the President and Secretary. The Secretary shall be at the office of the Board during regular office hours, excepting when absent on official duties required of him as Commissioner. The Board shall establish rules and regulations governing its proceedings and for the regulation and conduct of its officers, clerks, and employees, and may require bonds from any of its subordinates for the faithful performance of their duties. Such bonds must be approved by at least two of said commissioners, and filed with the Auditor.

SECTION 3. Section nine of Chapter one is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 9. The Board shall appoint a competent Civil Engineer, who shall be designated City Engineer, and shall hold his office at the pleasure of the Board. He shall perform all the civil engineering and surveying required in the prosecution of public works and improvement done under the direction of the Board, and shall certify to the progress and completion of the same, and do such other work pertaining to his profession as may be directed by the Board, or by the Common Council, or by the general laws of the State of California. He shall possess the same power in the city in making surveys, plats, and certificates, as is or may be from time to time given by law to the County Surveyor; and his official acts, and all plats, surveys and certificates made by him shall have the same validity and be of the same force and effect as are or may be given by law to those of the County Surveyor. With the consent and approval of the Board the City Engineer may appoint such deputies, not exceeding the number that may be fixed by the Common Council, as the duties of his office may require. The deputies so appointed shall receive such salaries or compensation as may be fixed by the Common Council upon the recommendation of said Board, and they or any of them may be removed at pleasure by the City Engineer or by said Board.

SECTION 4. Section thirteen of Chapter one is hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. Section twenty-four of Chapter one is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 24. No contract for lighting streets, public buildings, places or offices, shall be made for a longer period than five years, nor less than one year, nor shall any contract to pay for gas, electric light, or any illuminating material at a higher rate than is charged to any other consumer, be valid. Demands for lighting public buildings shall be presented monthly to the Board or department using or having charge thereof, and shall specify the amount of gas, electric light or illuminating material consumed in such building during the month.

SECTION 6. A new section to be designated as section twenty-six of Chapter one is hereby added so as to read as follows:

SECTION 26. On and after the first Monday in May in the year 1893, or as soon thereafter as they are organized, the Board of Public Works shall assume control and take charge of the water system, if any such system shall then, or thereafter be owned or leased by, or in any manner be under the control of the city. And the Board of Public Works shall then and thereafter have full control and management of the water system of the city and the collection of the revenue therefor, under such regulations, by ordinance, as the Common Council may from time to time enact. But the fixing of water rates shall remain in the Common Council. All contracts for work and materials shall be made by said Board. And all payrolls and all accounts for the same shall first be passed upon by the Board, who shall certify them to the Auditing Committee.

CHAPTER II.

Chapter two of Article five is hereby repealed, and a new Chapter two of said Article five inserted instead thereof as follows:

CHAPTER II.

SECTION 1. The provisions of the general laws of the State relating to work upon streets, lanes, alleys, places, courts, sidewalks and construction of sewers, shall apply to and govern the same within the limits of the City of San Diego, except where otherwise especially provided in this charter.

CHAPTER III.

SECTION 1. Chapter three of Article five is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER VI.

SECTION 1. Section one of Chapter six is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 1. On the first Monday of May, in the year 1893, or as soon thereafter as the Board of Public Works shall have organized and entered upon its duties, the Board of Water Commissioners shall be abolished, and the former Board, or any member thereof who may then be in office, or if none of them then in office, the Common Council shall turn over to the Board of Public Works the Water System, if any such be owned, leased, or in any way controlled by the city, and everything connected therewith, or relating thereto. And the Board of Public Works shall thereafter control such Water System, and perform the duties, and have the powers which have up to that time rested with the Board of Water Commissioners, subject to the supervision of the Common Council.

SECTION 2. Section two of Chapter six is hereby repealed.

ARTICLE VI.

DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE.

Repeal section fifteen of Chapter two. Amend section one of Chapter Two of said Article VI.

CHAPTER II.

SECTION 1. Section one of Chapter Two is hereby amended, so as to read as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby created an Auditing Committee, which shall consist of the Mayor, President of the Board of Aldermen, President of the Board of Delegates, City Attorney and Auditor. The Mayor shall be Chairman of this Committee, the Auditor shall be Secretary of the same, but in the absence of either at meetings of the committee, a temporary chairman and secretary can be chosen by the committee to act. The Auditing Committee shall hold stated meetings once in each month, and can adjourn from time to time. It shall be the duty of this committee to examine, allow, and order paid, or reject and disallow all claims, demands and bills of whatever nature, (except monthly salaries of city officers, when the same are due, and a just and legal claim against the city) which may be presented against the city, and the Auditor shall not draw a warrant for any bill, unless the same has been approved by a majority of the whole Auditing Committee. Three members of this committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but a less number can meet and adjourn from time to time. Provided, that any bill, or claim against the allowance of which two members of the committee shall vote, and demand that it be referred for action to the Common Council, shall be so referred immediately, and not allowed, or paid, unless it be approved by a majority vote of both boards of the Common Council, otherwise it shall be rejected.

SECTION 2. Section fifteen of Chapter Two is hereby repealed.

ARTICLE VIII.

SAN DIEGO PUBLIC LIBRARY.

Amend section three of article eight.

SECTION 1. Section three of article eight is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 3. The Mayor shall, immediately after his qualification under this charter, appoint a Board of five Directors, subject to confirmation by the Board of Delegates, for said library, who shall serve without compensation, and be known as the Board of Directors of the San Diego Public Library; and who shall be chosen from the citizens at large, male or female, without regard to their political opinions, but with reference to their fitness for said office, and not more than one member of the Common Council shall be at any one time a member of said Board. Said Directors shall hold office for the term of four years; provided that of the board appointed in the year 1893, two members shall be appointed to serve for a short term of two years; and their places be filled at the end of that time for a term

of four years, so that thereafter the members of the Board will not all go out of office at once. Any vacancy occurring shall be filled by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by the Board of Delegates, for the balance of the unexpired term.

ARTICLE X.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

Amend section two of article ten.

SECTION 1. Section two of article ten is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 2. Every officer, deputy and clerk, except the City Engineer and City Superintendent of Schools, and except where otherwise provided in this charter, must have been at the time of his election or appointment, both an elector of the city and an actual resident therein, for one year next preceding his election or appointment.

SCHEDULE.

Add a new section, to be designated as section three of schedule.

SECTION 1. A new section to be designated as section three of Schedule is hereby added, so as to read as follows:

SECTION 3. The amendments to this charter and the charter as amended thereby, shall take effect from and after its approval by the legislature.

2. That on all streets with a ten (10) foot sidewalk all trees shall be planted eight and one half (8 1/2) feet from the property line of the street.
3. That on all streets with a twelve foot (12) sidewalk all trees shall be planted ten (10) feet from the property line of the street.
4. That on all streets with a fourteen (14) foot sidewalk all trees shall be planted eleven and one half (11 1/2) feet from the property line of the street.
5. That on all streets with a sixteen (16) foot sidewalk all

trees shall be planted thirteen (13) feet from the property line of the street

Section 2. It is hereby made the duty of the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego whenever they deem it advisable on the written application of the owner or agent of any property situated on any of the graded streets of the City of San Diego setting forth that such person wishes to plant trees thereon, and that the grade of said street is unknown to him, to order the City Engineer to furnish the established grade to any such person or persons.

Section 3. That the City of San Diego shall furnish free water for the purpose of watering all trees planted in the streets of the city during the time it shall own or control the water supply of the city.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to cut, girdle, mutilate, or in any other manner damage or injure any tree or trees planted in any of the streets of the City of San Diego, provided nothing herein contained shall prevent the owner or agent of the property in front of which such trees are planted from properly trimming such trees.

Section 5. Every person who shall violate any of the provisions of Section (4) of this ordinance shall be fined in a sum of not less than five (5) or more than one hundred (100) dollars, or be imprisoned in the city jail of the City of San Diego for a term not exceeding thirty (30) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after its passage and approval, and one publication in the San Diego Union.

The Special Committee on the Matter of the Water Lease submitted the following report which was read and adapted and is as follows, to wit:-

To the Hon The Common Council of the City of San Diego,  
Gentlemen

Your special committee to whom was referred a Joint Resolution instructing them to investigate all the facts to be obtained, relating to a lease of the San Diego water distributing system by the San Diego Water Company to the City of San Diego, beg leave to make the following report. After due and careful investigation and deliberation we are fully convinced that all parties concerned in the present lease between the San Diego Water Company and the City of San Diego are dissatisfied with its present status, as neither the Water Company or the City has complied with the terms of the Lease, and all desire a change. We believe that any new agreement for the future to be satisfactory and lasting should be based upon the undivided ownership and control of the water distributing system either by the Water Company or the City. We are decidedly in favor of the City owning its water distributing system as soon as possible and therefore



recommend that a special election be called at once submitting to the voters of the City the issue of bonds in the sum of six hundred and sixty five thousand dollars (\$665,000) for the purpose of constructing and acquiring a water distributing system for the City. The proposition to vote bonds, when submitted to the people will give every voter an opportunity to express his opinion, instead of leaving so important a decision to the few members of the Common Council. We also herewith submit the report of the City Engineer and Board of Water Commissioners referred to us, containing plans, specifications and estimates for a Water Distributing System for the City.

And we further submit a proposition from the San Diego Flume Company containing terms and prices at which said company will furnish the City with water for a term of years which proposition was furnished your committee at its own request, all of which is herewith made a part of our report and respectfully submitted.

### Estimates of the Cost of a Water Plant

In accordance with instructions as per Joint Resolution No 176, we present for your consideration the following estimates, showing sizes, lengths and cost of a distributing system for the City covering only such portions as is already covered by the pipes of the San Diego Water Company, as leased to the City of San Diego, and shown on the maps filed in the office of the Board of Water Commissioners. The character of pipe is entirely of cast iron except the two inch wrought iron pipe and is estimated to stand a pressure of 300 lbs per square inch.

The character of the pipe of the San Diego Water Company as now in use is of sheet iron, cast iron, galvanized and wrought iron pipe. An increase in the lengths of pipe is shown both in 6 and 8 inch pipes. All one inch, one and 1/4 inch, and one and one half inch pipes are increased to two inch, and all two and one half, and three inch pipes are increased to four inch.

The Reservoir as provided for in the estimate, should be at least of fifteen Million gallons Capacity and located

within the limits of the City Park Reservoir.

All inlets for fire Hydrants are increased from four inches to six inches; The main from the Meter house to head of 5<sup>th</sup> Street is increased from fifteen inch sheet Iron to twenty four inch Cast Iron. The total length of the system as estimated is 75 Miles, and four hundred and seventy feet; divided in length and sizes as follows:

The only apparent difficulty the holding over of loaded wagons in the yard while the scow is out, or dumping the garbage to lay for half a day or more until the scow returns. Until other and better arrangements can be made, garbage kept in the yard should be disinfected by sprinkling gas lime over it the expense of which is small, and then covering it with oil cloth, to do which the Scavenger and his assistant have agreed, and the health officer will see that it is done

Whereas, the people of the State of California, represented in the Senate and Assembly, did, by an Act approved March 19<sup>th</sup> 1889, enact a general law entitled "an act authorizing the incurring of indebtedness by Cities, Towns and Municipal Corporations, incorporated under the laws of this State; for the constructions of waterworks, sewers and all necessary public improvements, or for any purpose whatever, and to repeal the Act approved March 9<sup>th</sup> 1885, entitled 'an Act to authorize Municipal Corporations of the fifth class, containing more than three thousand and less than ten thousand inhabitants, to obtain waterworks;' also to repeal an Act approved March 15<sup>th</sup> 1887, entitled 'an Act authorizing the incurring of indebtedness by Cities, Towns and Municipal Corporations, incorporated under the laws of the State' which act took effect immediately; and Whereas, the City of San Diego is duly organized, existing and incorporated under and in pursuance with Section 8 of Article XI of the Constitution of the State of California and

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of San Diego deems it to be required by the public interest and necessity that the City should construct, acquire, own and control its own system of waterworks; and

That it shall be unlawful for any locomotive, engine, tender car or train of cars, drawn or propelled by steam to move in any direction within the limits of the City of San Diego, between First Street and 18<sup>th</sup> Street, also between 18<sup>th</sup> and 52<sup>nd</sup> Street from the north side of "N" Street to the south side of Newtor and Grand Avenues, at a rate of speed faster than fifteen miles an hour.

Section 2. Any Engineer, Driver, Brakeman, Conductor or other person causing or allowing any such locomotive, engine, tender, car or train of cars to move in any direction within the said limits of said City between First Street and 18<sup>th</sup> Street, also between 18<sup>th</sup> and 52<sup>nd</sup> Street from the north side of "N" Street to the south side of Newtor and Grand Avenues, at a rate of speed faster than fifteen miles an hour, shall upon conviction, pay a fine of not less than fifty nor more than three hundred dollars, or be imprisoned not less than thirty nor more than sixty days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

law entitled "An Act to authorize the Common Council, Board of Trustees, or other governing body of any incorporated City or town, other than Cities of the first Class, to refund its indebtedness, to issue bonds therefor, and provide for the payment of the same" and

Whereas, the City of San Diego is an incorporated city other than a city of the first class, duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the provisions of Section 8 of Article XI of the Constitution of the State of California; and Whereas the City of San Diego did, under the provisions of Chapter six, of title three, of part four of the Political Code of California, and in conformity with a resolution of the Board of Trustees, dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of September 1885, fund a portion of its bonded indebtedness, and issued its bonds therefor in the amount of sixty thousand dollars, bearing interest at the rate of seven per cent per annum; and

Whereas the City of San Diego did, in conformity with an ordinance duly passed by the Board of Trustees of the City of San Diego on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of March 1887, and under authority conferred upon said Board by the provisions of an act of the legislature of the State of California entitled an "act to provide for work upon the streets, alleys, courts, places and sidewalks, and for the construction of sewers within municipalities," approved March 18<sup>th</sup> 1885, duly and legally issued its bonds for the construction of a sewer system for said City, in the amount of four hundred thousand dollars bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum; and

Section 2. That the Common Council of said City of San Diego deem it for the public interest to refund and fund a portion of said bonded indebtedness in the amount of three hundred and Eighty Thousand dollars; and to issue bonds of the said City of San Diego therefor, each bond to be issued in the sum of Five hundred dollars, and to run for the period of twenty years from the date thereof unless paid before the expiration of that period; that said bonds shall draw interest at the rate of four and one half per cent per annum, payable annually; that the bonds and interest coupons shall be in the form prescribed by an act of the legislature of the state of California, entitled "An act to authorize the Common Council, Board of Trustees, or other governing body of any incorporated City or town, other than Cities of the first class, to refund indebtedness, to issue bonds therefor, and provide for the payment of the same," approved March 15<sup>th</sup> 1883 (Statutes of California 1883, page 870); that the blanks shall be filled in conformity with this resolution; that said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor of the City of San Diego and attested by the City Clerk, and sealed with the seal of said City, and shall be numbered consecutively beginning with number one (1); that the coupons shall be each be for the interest accruing annually upon the bond to which it is attached, and there attached to each bond shall be numbered consecutively from number one (1) to number twenty (20), and shall contain the number of the bond to which it is attached, the bond shall be dated on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1893 and the coupons shall be payable on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January in the year of their respective maturities.

Section 3. The advertisement shall state the time when the sealed proposals will be opened at the office of said City Treasurer, and that no proposal will be accepted either for the purchase or exchange of said bonds for a less sum than the face value of said bonds and the accrued interest thereon, and that the right is reserved to reject any and all proposals and bids.

Section 5. That any proposal for such purchase or exchange of bonds which may be accepted by said City Treasurer, shall be accepted subject to the approval of the Common Council of the City of San Diego, and that all of the money that may be received upon or for the sale of said bonds shall be applied to the payment of the bonds mentioned in section 1 of this resolution, aforesaid, until the same shall be satisfied and paid.

<p>To the honorable the members of the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States, in Congress assembled—GENTLEMEN: The citizens of Southern California, in a representative meeting assembled, would respectfully ask your attention to the following facts, in the matter of the deep-water harbor for Southern California, as recommended in the recent report of the Board of Government Engineers:</p> <p>First—That this is not a matter of mere local importance, but that owing to the contour of the continent, and the lines of easy grade and low mountain passes, the proposed deep-water harbor at San Pedro, like that of Galveston, of which it is the natural and necessary complement, is of national importance.</p> <p>Second—That the line between this harbor and the proposed deep-water harbor at Galveston is the shortest and most available for transcontinental commerce of all the possible routes within American territory.</p> <p>Third—That two transcontinental lines of railroad now reach the sea at this point, besides a number of local roads, and are forced for lack of a deep-water harbor to handle their freight through unsheltered roadsteads, exposed to all the dangers of the open sea.</p>	<p>Fourth—That with the completion of the Nicaragua Canal the traffic of these railroads, and the new roads centering at this point will be vastly increased, as this must then, by the law of shorter lines and lighter grades, become the supply port of the southwest interior, and of the great inland plateau embracing that vast territory which lies between the Rocky Mountains and the Sierra.</p> <p>Fifth—That while the Atlantic seaboard of the United States is even lavishly supplied by nature with good harbors, the Pacific Coast is singularly destitute of them, and the people of this coast must appeal to the General Government to help them in securing outlet to the sea.</p> <p>Sixth—That the mountain chains and the natural passes of the Pacific Coast have fixed three great transcontinental outlets to the sea westward. One at the mouth of the Columbia and Puget Sound; one at the bay of San Francisco; one through Southern California. At the first two named outlets nature has furnished good harbors; for Southern California only open roadsteads. It is to correct this defect that we ask the aid of the General Government.</p>	<p>Seventh—That the population now seeking the sea at this point is only a small fraction of the numbers which must, within a few years hence, seek commercial outlet. The territory immediately tributary to this point has a capacity of supporting and making wealthy a population numbering into the millions. This territory is rapidly filling with people, and already their sea traffic is checked and strangled for lack of adequate harbor facilities.</p> <p>The facts with regard to the proposed deep-water harbor are placed before you in the report of the board of Government engineers. We would only add that this is the fifth survey made officially by officers of the Government during a period of some twenty-five years, and that all have concurred in the same judgment as to the location and importance of the work.</p> <p>The Government has already expended some \$800,000 upon the inner harbor, but even before its completion the needs of commerce have far outgrown its capacity.</p>	<p>In consideration of the foregoing facts we earnestly pray that you will order the appropriation of such sum of money as in the judgment of the department may be necessary to at once begin, and vigorously push, the work upon the outer, or deep-sea, harbor at San Pedro that we may, equally with our brethren upon the Atlantic Coast, have opportunity to share in the great possibilities of development of this, our common land.</p> <p>Resolved, that the State Board of Trade be urgently requested to use their influence in Congress to assist the people of Southern California in securing an adequate appropriation for the commencement of a deep-sea harbor at San Pedro, in conformity with the reports of the several boards of Government engineers upon that subject.</p> <p>M. All upon the following conditions and limitations. Viz:

I.

That the Cars upon said railway shall be propelled by electricity; but if at any time the said railway cannot be operated by electricity owing to accident to the machinery or apparatus or other causes horses or mules may be used to propel cars thereon during the time the same cannot be operated by electricity.

II.

That the grantee or its assigns shall plank, pave or macadamize, as the Council may direct the entire length of that portion of said street used by said railway tracks, between the rails and for two feet on each side thereof, and between the tracks, and keep the same constantly in repair, flush with the street and with good crossings.

III.

That the track shall be four feet eight and one half inches within the rails; and shall have a space between them and between side tracks, turnouts and switches, of not less than four feet three inches, being sufficient to allow the cars to pass each other freely.

IV.

That said railway shall be constructed and maintained in the manner provided by Ordinance 174 of said city, approved August 30 1892.

V.

That the right to grade, sewer, pave, macadamize or otherwise improve or alter or repair the said street shall be reserved to the City of San Diego; such work to

be done so as to obstruct the said railway as little as possible. The grantee or its assigns shall shift and re-shift its rails so as to avoid the obstructions created thereby.

#### VI.

That the laying of said tracks, and all side tracks, turnouts, switches or curves shall conform in all cases with the grade of said street, where the same has been graded, and in all other cases as near to the natural grade as practicable.

And when at any time any part of said route shall be graded, or the grade thereof altered or changed by the said Common Council, the bed of the road and the tracks thereon shall be made to conform therewith by the grantee or its assigns. The tracks shall be so constructed and laid that each of them shall be of equal distance from the curb line of said street.

#### VII.

No switch shall be constructed or maintained within fifty feet of any cross street, and the location of such switches and all turnouts shall be changed at the expense of the grantee or its assigns whenever so ordered by said Common Council.

#### VIII.

That the City Engineer shall under the direction of the said Common Council, give the established grades of the streets along the line of construction of said railway, and set stakes indicating the said grade; he shall see that the said railway is constructed and maintained in conformity to the terms and requirements of the franchise, and for his services as herein required he shall receive such fees as are provided therefor, and the same shall be paid by the grantee or its assigns.

#### IX.

That the failure to comply with any of the conditions of the franchise shall work a forfeiture of the rights and privileges granted thereby.

Resolved, That the Common Council of the City of San Diego California, deems it to be required by the public interest and convenience and hereby **declares its** intention to order the straightening of Logan Avenue in said City, through Fractional Block 4 of Reed and Hubbell's Addition, for which purpose it is deemed necessary to take and appropriate the property bounded and described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a point on the North line of Logan Avenue eighty nine and fifty-hundredths (89.50) feet East from the South west corner of Fractional Block 4 in Reed & Hubbell's Addition thence west or westerly along the North line of Logan Avenue to the East line of Twenty sixth Street, thence north or northerly along the east line of said Twenty sixth Street seventy four and eight-hundredths (74.58) feet, thence south easterly one hundred and sixteen and seventy three-hundredths (116.73) feet to the point of beginning: and that the damages, costs and expenses, of making



said improvement shall be assessed in proportion to benefits upon a district, the exterior boundaries of which are hereby fixed as follows, to wit: beginning at a point on the easterly line of twenty sixth street, one hundred and forty (140) feet north from the north line of Logan Avenue, thence running East or Easterly producing a line one hundred and forty (140) feet from and parallel to the north line of Logan Avenue, the west line of thirty second street, thence south or southerly along the west line of thirty second street to a point one hundred and forty (140) feet south of the south line of Logan Avenue thence running west or westerly one hundred and forty (140) feet from and parallel to the south line of Logan Avenue to the East line of twenty sixth street, thence north or northerly along said East line of Twenty sixth street to the point of beginning.

The Daily Sun is hereby designated as the daily newspaper, published and circulated in this City in which this resolution of intention shall be published for ten days as often as said newspaper is issued thereon.

We the undersigned Commissioners appointed by your honorable body, respectfully submit the following report, to wit; on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of February 1892 and on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of March 1892 a resolution of intention was passed by your honorable body of which the following is a copy

Resolution of Intention

To open Irving Avenue from North line of Maunara & Schiller's Addition, Northwestwardly through Fractional Block 64 of Sherman's Addition.

Resolved, that the Common Council of the City of San Diego, deems it to be required by the public interest and convenience and hereby declares its intention to order the opening and extension of Irving Avenue from the north line of Maunara and Schiller's Addition through Fractional Block 64 of Sherman's Addition for which purpose it is deemed necessary to take and appropriate the property bounded and described as follows, to wit;

Beginning at a point on the north line of line of Maunara and Schiller's Addition with its intersection with the North Eastwardly line of Irving Avenue, thence westwardly along said north line of Maunara & Schiller's Addition to its intersection with the south westwardly line of Irving Avenue, thence North Westwardly along a projection of the south westwardly line of Irving Avenue to the East line of Twenty Second Street, thence Northwardly along the East line of Twenty Second Street to the south line of "N" Street, thence Eastwardly along the south line of "N" Street to a point where a projection North Westwardly of the North Eastwardly line of Irving Avenue would intersect the said South line of "N" Street, thence South Eastwardly along said projecting North Eastwardly line of Irving Avenue to the point of beginning; and the damages, costs, and expenses of making said improvement shall be assessed in proportion to benefits upon a district, the exterior boundaries of which are hereby fixed as follows, to wit;

The Street Superintendent of this City is hereby directed to publish and post this resolution, in the manner prescribed by law.

That said resolution of intention was by the direction of the Common Council of the said City of San Diego, published in the San Diego Daily Sun (it being the newspaper in which the official notices of the said City Council are usually published and printed for a period of ten days, to wit: on the sixteenth day of April to the twenty fifth day of April 1892 inclusive said days being the regular days of issue of said newspaper,

That thereafter to wit on the fourth day day of May 1892 The Street Superintendent of said City Coured to be

Conspicuously posted along the line of said street at not more than three hundred feet in distance apart, but not less than three in all and within the boundaries designated in said resolution of intention, notices of the passage of said resolution. Gowen, Ed Dougherty, and John Sherman be and they are hereby appointed Commissioners to assess benefits and damages, and to have general supervision of all the work pertaining to the opening and extension of Irving Avenue in the City of San Diego, California, as the same is particularly described in the resolution ordering said street opened.

That the Compensation of each of said Commissioners hereby appointed is hereby fixed at \$4<sup>00</sup> per day during the time said Commissioners shall be actually engaged in said work.

That said Commissioners shall before entering on said work qualify and file such bond as is by law required.

That immediately after receiving notice of their said appointment the undersigned duly qualified and filed their bonds as such Commissioners, and now are and ever since have acted as such.

That after such qualification the Commissioners proceeded to view the lands described in the Resolution of Intention and examined witnesses and improvements and property affected by said opening and extension and considered the testimony presented, and have determined the value of the land to be taken for public use, by reason of said proposed opening and extension of said street and the damages occasioned by the segregation

thereof, and also the expenses incident to said improvement or extension, and have assessed the same upon the district of lands declared benefitted, the exterior boundaries of which were fixed by the resolution of intention in proportion to the benefit to be derived from said opening and extension, so far as the Commissioners can reasonably estimate the same.

Ordinance No.

An Ordinance to determine that the public interest and necessity requires and demands the Construction and acquisition of waterworks and a distributing System for the City of San Diego, the Cost of which is too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of the City.

Whereas, the people of the State of California, represented in the Senate and Assembly, did by an Act approved March 19<sup>th</sup> 1889, enact a general law entitled

"an act authorizing the incurring of indebtedness by cities, towns and municipal corporations, incorporated under the laws of this state; for the construction of water works, sewers, and all necessary public improvements, or for any purpose whatever, and to repeal the act approved March 9<sup>th</sup> 1885, entitled 'An act to authorize municipal corporations of the fifth class, containing more than three thousand and less than ten thousand inhabitants, to obtain water works; also to repeal an act approved March 15<sup>th</sup> 1887, entitled 'an act authorizing the incurring of indebtedness by cities, towns and municipal corporations, incorporated under the laws of the state,' which act took effect immediately; and

Whereas, the City of San Diego is duly organized, existing, and incorporated under and in pursuance with Section 8 Article XI of the Constitution of the State of California and Whereas, the Common Council of the City of San Diego deems it to be required by the public interest and necessity that the City should construct, acquire, own and control its own system of water works; and

Whereas, in pursuance of said act of March 19<sup>th</sup> 1889 and the Amending acts thereof, approved March 11<sup>th</sup> 1891 and March 19<sup>th</sup> 1891, respectively, the Common Council of the City of San Diego do determine that the public interest and necessity requires and demands the construction and acquisition of water works and distributing system for the City; and

Whereas, the cost of constructing and acquiring water works sufficient to supply the wants of the City is \$65,000 which is too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of the City.

Now Therefore: Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That it hereby determined by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, that the public interest and necessity requires and demands the construction and acquisition of a system of water works to be owned and controlled by the City of San Diego, for the purpose of supplying said City and the inhabitants thereof with water for domestic and irrigation purposes; such system of water works to be built and constructed according to the plans and specifications now on file in the office of the City Engineer of said City.



Section 2. That it is hereby determined that the cost of constructing and acquiring a system of waterworks sufficient to supply said City of San Diego and its inhabitants thereof with water is \$665,000 - which is too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of the City of San Diego; and that it is the intention of the Common Council to have said system of waterworks constructed and acquired.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, and approval by the Mayor of the City of San Diego, and two weeks publication in the San Diegoan Sun, a daily newspaper issued and published in the City of San Diego, and in general circulation therein; and being the official newspaper of said City.

Resolution of Intent to open Milton Avenue

Resolved That the Common Council of the City of San Diego, California, deems it to be required by the public interest and convenience and hereby declares its intention to order the opening and extending of Milton Avenue in said city from the south line of Harton's & Shermans Addition to the south line of "N" Street, for which purpose it is deemed necessary to take and appropriate the following described property, to wit: Beginning at the south line of Harton's Addition, where said south line intersects the south westerly line of Milton Avenue, thence northwesterly producing said southwesterly line of Milton Avenue to its

intersection with the south line of "N" Street, thence easterly along said south line of "N" Street to a point where the north easterly line of Miller Avenue produced north westerly would intersect said south line of "N" Street, thence south easterly along said produced north easterly line of Miller Avenue to the south line of Sherman's Addition, thence westerly along south line of Sherman's & Barton's Addition to the point of beginning; and that the damages costs and expenses of making said improvement shall be assessed in proportion to benefits upon a district the Exterior boundaries of which are hereby fixed as follows, to wit: beginning at the intersection of the west line of Manname & Schiller's Addition with the north easterly line of Alley in Fractional Block 133 of Manname & Schiller's Addition, thence northerly along said west line of Manname and Schiller's Addition to the south line of Sherman's Addition to the intersection of said south line of Sherman's Addition with the south westerly line of Alley in Block 137 of Manname and Schiller's Addition, thence south easterly one hundred and forty (140) feet from and parallel to the north easterly line of Miller Avenue to the westerly line of twenty sixth Street, thence south along said westerly line of twenty sixth Street to its intersection with the north easterly line of Alley in Frae. Block 125 of Land and Town Co's Addition, thence northwesterly one hundred and forty (140) feet from and parallel to the south westerly line of Miller Avenue to the point of beginning.

The San Diego Daily Sun is hereby designated as the daily newspaper, published and circulated in this City, in which notice of the passage of this Resolution of Intention shall be published for ten days as often as said newspaper is issued therein.

The Superintendent of Streets of this City is hereby directed to post and publish said notice in the manner prescribed by law.

That A. C. Gowenkin, Ed Dougherty, and John Sherman be and they are hereby appointed Commissioners to assess benefits

and damages and to have general supervision of all work pertaining to the opening and extending of Miller Avenue in the City of San Diego, California, as the same is particularly described in the resolution ordering said street opened.

That the Compensation of each of said Commissioners hereby appointed is hereby fixed at \$4.00 per day during the time said Commissioners shall be actually engaged in such work, That said Commissioners shall before entering on said work qualify and file such bond as is required by law.

That immediately after receiving notice of their said appointment the undersigned duly qualified and filed their bonds as such Commissioners and now are and ever since have acted as such.

That after such qualification the Commissioners proceeded to view the lands described in the resolution of intention, and examined witnesses and improvements and property affected by said opening and extension and considered the testimony presented, they have determined the value of the land to be taken for public use by reason of said proposed opening and extension of said street and the damages occasioned by the segregation thereof, and also the expenses incident to said improvement or extension, and have assessed the same upon the district of lands declared benefited, the exterior boundaries of which were fixed by the resolution of intention in proportion to the benefit to be derived from said opening and extension, so far as the Commissioners can reasonably estimate the same.

Section 1. That the rates or compensation to be collected for water by the Board of Water Commissioners of the City of San Diego, or any person, company or corporation engaged in the business of supplying water to the inhabitants of the City of San Diego for family uses, for private purposes, for public purposes and for Municipal purposes and for all purposes for the year commencing July 1<sup>st</sup> 1893 and ending June 30<sup>th</sup> 1894, are hereby fixed as follows:

First. For water furnished dwellings and tenement houses on a lot not more than 25 feet frontage, the same being occupied by not more than three persons 90 cents per month including irrigation for said lot and for each additional person 15 cents per month.

Second. For water furnished dwelling and tenement houses on a lot not more than 35 feet frontage the same being occupied not more than three persons 95 cents per month, including irrigation for said lot, and for each additional person 15 cents per month.

Third. For water furnished dwelling and tenement houses on a lot not more than 50 feet frontage the same being occupied by not more than three persons \$1.05 per month including irrigation for said lot; and for each additional person 15 cents per month.

Fourth. For each additional lot or fraction thereof irrigated, one cent per front foot.

Fifth. For families of not more than three persons occupying rooms in second and third stories 75 cents per month.

Sixth. For rooms in second and third stories occupied as offices, for each room per month from 15 to 25 cents.

Seventh. For private boarding houses, in addition to family rates 15 cents per month for each person.

Eighth. For lodging houses in addition to family rates 10 cents per month for each bed.

Ninth. For Hotels in addition to family rates 15 cents per month for each bed. The keeper of hotels, lodging houses or boarding houses shall furnish the Secretary of the Board of Water Commissioners, (under oath if required) with a correct list of the number of persons in his or their families, (including servants) and the number of boarders.

Tenth. To stores and warehouses, from \$1.00 to \$5.00 per month.

Eleventh. For small stores and business offices from 50 cents to \$1.00 per month.

Twelfth. For saloons from \$2.00 to \$5.00 per month.

- Thirteenth. For Dental rooms \$1.50 per Month.
- Fourteenth. For bakeries for monthly use of flour, for each 25 barrels \$2.00
- Fifteenth. To Wagon and blacksmith shops, from \$2.00 to \$3.50 per Month.
- Sixteenth. For Livery stables, including carriage working for each horse 35 cents per Month.
- Seventeenth. For fuel yards from \$3.00 to \$5.00 per Month.
- Nineteenth. For Restaurants and eating houses from \$2.00 to \$5.00 per Month.
- Twentieth. For Drug stores from \$1.25 to \$2.00 per Month.
- Twenty-first. For Soda fountains 50 cents per Month.  
For one jet 50 " " "  
For each Tumbler washer 50 cents per Month.
- Twenty second. For persons Slackening lime 15 cents per barrel, and Cement 15 cents per barrel, Laying bricks 15 cents per 1000.
- Twenty third. For persons keeping horse and carriage, 35 cents per month for the first horse and carriage, and 20 cents for each additional horse.
- Twenty fourth. For Barber shops of single chair, 75 cents per Month for each additional chair 25 cents per Month.
- Twenty fifth. For Water troughs on sidewalks from \$2.00 to \$5.00 per Month.
- Twenty sixth. For Water closets in private residences or business houses 25 cents per Month for each closet, and for each Urinal in such premises, 25 cents per Month.
- Twenty seventh. For Water Closets public \$2.00 each per Month, and for each Urinal 50 cents per Month.
- Twenty eighth. For bath-tubs in private residences 25 cents per Month for each tub.
- Twenty ninth. For bath tubs public \$1.25 per Month for each tub.
- Thirtieth. For Horses, Mules and Cows 20 cents per Month each.
- Thirty first. For Coffee houses open day and night from 2.00 to \$3.00 per Month.
- Thirty second. Water for Hydraulic Elevator & Motors in Hotels and Stores 15 cents per 1000 gallons by meter.
- Thirty third. Water to be used for irrigating, two or more acres, in one tract 6 cents per 1000 gallons by meter.
- Thirty fourth. Meter Rates. The rates for water furnished to consumers in any one Month through Meters are fixed as follows: Twenty two and one half cents per 100 cubic feet, or 30 cents per thousand gallons, provided the amount used shall not exceed 1333 1/3 cubic

feet, or 10000 gallons per month,

Eighteen and three fourths cents, per 100 cubic feet, or 25 cents per one thousand gallons, for each one thousand gallons over 10 thousand and up to 30 thousand gallons,

Fifteen cents, per 100 cubic feet, or 20 cents per 1000 gallons, for each 1000 gallons over 30 thousand gallons and up to 100 thousand gallons,

Eleven and one fourth cents per 100 cubic feet or 15 cents per 1000 gallons for each one thousand gallons over one hundred thousand gallons,

Water shall be furnished and delivered by meter measurement to shipping lying along side <sup>any</sup> of the wharves on the water front, where water-pipes or mains are laid, between the hour of 6 o'clock A.M. and 6 o'clock P.M. daily, upon application being made therefor, at the following rates:

Seventy five cents per one hundred cubic feet, or \$1.00 per 1000 gallons.

Water shall be supplied and delivered to water supply boats, at any of the wharves on the water front above mentioned between the hours of 6 o'clock A.M. and 6 o'clock P.M. daily for the purpose of supplying shipping in the Bay of San Diego upon application being made therefor, at the rate of  $5\frac{1}{2}$  cents per 100 cubic feet, or 50 cents per one thousand gallons.

No water-boat furnishing and supplying water to shipping lying at anchor within the limits of the waters of the City of San Diego, shall charge a rate to exceed \$5.00 per 1000 gallons.

Thirty fifth. Where water is furnished to hotels, lodging houses, Boarding houses, Steam engines, gas machines or works, Wash houses, Chinese or otherwise, Street and sidewalk sprinkling, Washing stone and shop fronts, where satisfactory rates cannot be agreed upon, the meter rate shall govern.

Thirty six. Rent for each hydrant and for water used through such hydrant \$80.00 per year, to be paid monthly by said city. New hydrants to be located upon order of the Common Council, and the same rate to prevail, providing that the Board of Water Commissioners or persons, associations or companies furnishing water through hydrants to the City shall maintain a pressure of forty pounds at the hydrant located at the corner of



fifth and "A" Streets, and a proportionate pressure at all other hydrants, to entitle the Board of Water Commissioners, or such persons, association or company to the hydrant rate provided in this ordinance; and further, that upon an alarm of fire a full fire pressure shall be immediately turned on. The Board of Water Commissioners or Company, person or corporation shall make or charge for any pipe or fire apparatus connected with their mains and to be used only in case of fire.

Section 2. The Board of Water Commissioners or any person or association or water company so furnishing water to said City or the inhabitants thereof, shall have the power in all cases to apply meters and collect meter rates;

First. All water used for city purposes shall be charged at meter rates as above mentioned except those hereinafter mentioned.

Second. All water used for street sprinkling purposes to be charged at the rate of 10 cents per thousand gallons.

Third. All water used for flushing sewers to be charged at the rate of 15 cents per thousand gallons.

Fourth. For water required and used for purposes not specified in the above rates, the rate shall be in accordance with, and in conformity to said above rates.

Fifth. Any water rate payer shall have the right to demand a meter and to pay meter rates for water upon tendering to the Board of Water Commissioners or any Company, Corporation or person furnishing water, the sum of seven dollars for placing and connecting the same to the supply pipe of such water rate payer.

Upon such demand and payment or tender of said sum by any water rate payer, it shall be the duty of the Board of Water Commissioners, or any person, Company or Corporation to furnish, place and maintain a meter; Provided, that the Board of Water Commissioners, or any person, Company or Corporation furnishing the water shall be entitled to collect from such water rate payer at least \$2 per month so long as the maintenance of a meter is required.

If any consumer after having a meter put in discontinues or abandons the use thereof, he shall pay to the owner thereof \$3.00 for removing it. All water rates, except meter rates are due and payable monthly in advance on presentation of bill, and if not so paid shall be subject to an addition

of five per cent. Meter rates are due and payable monthly on presentation of bill, and if not so paid shall be subject to an addition of 5 per cent.

Nothing herein contained shall be construed as requiring the Board of Water Commissioners, any person, company or corporation to charge and collect meter rates in any case where he or they shall at his or their own cost have applied either before or after the passage of this ordinance, a meter for the purpose of detecting waste.

Wherever any meter has or shall be placed or maintained as a "wast detector" the house and irrigator rates as allowed by this ordinance shall be collected, but if any such meter shows an excess of water used over and above what is an equivalent for the house and irrigator rate paid or payable then the Board of Water Commissioners or any person, company or corporation supplying the water may collect for such excess the meter rates allowed by this ordinance.

Section 3. The Board of Water Commissioners or any company, corporation or person engaged in the business of supplying or furnishing water, by their or his authorized agents, shall be allowed access to make personal examination of the premises of any applicant for or consumer of water, to designate the rates, as herein established, and for inspection of water pipes and apparatus.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and one publication in the San Diegoan Sun.

Second. We will agree to furnish the City with water for one, ten, or twenty years upon the following basis:-

one million gallons daily average in each month at 5 cents per one thousand gallons. All over one million gallons, up to two millions gallons, 4 cents per one thousand gallons. All over two millions gallons, 3 cents per one thousand gallons;

along said north Easterly line of Main Street to its intersection with the south line of Horton's Addition, thence Easterly along said south line of Horton's Addition to the point of beginning; and the damages, costs, and expenses of making said improvement shall be assessed in proportion to benefits upon a district, the exterior boundaries of which are hereby fixed as follows, to wit: Beginning at a point on the south line of "N" Street in the center of fractional block 165 Horton's Addition, thence south along the center of said fractional block 165 to the south line of Horton's Addition, thence East along the south line of Horton's Addition to the Alley in Fractional Block 90 Cleveland's Addition; thence South Easterly along the south westerly line of alley in said fractional Block 90 and 91 to the north westerly line of South 20<sup>th</sup> Street, thence South westerly along the north westerly line of South 20<sup>th</sup> Street to the north Easterly line of Alley in Fractional block 86; thence North westerly along the north Easterly line of Alley in Fractional block 86 to tide water line; thence beginning at the tide water line at the intersection of said tide water line with the North Easterly line of Alley in Fractional block 87 thence North westerly along the North Easterly line of Alley in Fractional block 87; to the south Easterly line of South 18<sup>th</sup> Street thence North Easterly along the south Easterly line of South 18<sup>th</sup> Street to the south westerly line of Main Street; thence beginning at a point on the south line of Horton's Addition, in the center of Fractional block 164 Horton's Addition; thence North along the center of said Fractional block 164 to the south line of "N" Street; thence East along the south line of "N" Street to the point of beginning.

The Daily Sun is hereby designated as the daily newspaper published and circulated in this City, in which notice of the passage of this Resolution of Intention shall be published for ten days as often as said newspaper is issued therein.

The Superintendent of Streets of this City is hereby directed to post and publish said notice in the manner prescribed by law.

That the notice of the passage of said resolution was by the direction of the Common Council of said City of San Diego published in the San Diego Daily Sun (a newspaper printed and published in said City) for a period of ten days, to wit: on the 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> of June, and on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>d</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> of July. That after the passage of said resolution of intention to wit: on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of June 1892 the Street superintendent of



Said City caused to be conspicuously posted along the line of said street at not more than three hundred feet in distance apart but not less than three in all and within the boundaries designated in said resolution of intention. Said notices so posted were headed as follows to wit: "Notice of Public Work" in letters not less than one inch in length in legible characters stating the fact of the passage of said resolution its date and briefly the proposed opening and extension of said street and referring to the resolution for further particulars.

That immediately after receiving notice of their said appointment the undersigned duly qualified and filed their bonds as such Commissioners and now are and ever since have acted as such.

That after such qualification the Commissioners proceeded to view the lands described in the resolution of intention and examined witnesses and improvements and the property affected by said opening and extension and considered the testimony presented. They have determined the value of the land to be taken for public use by reason of said opening and extension and the damages occasioned by the segregation thereof, also the expense incident to said improvement and have assessed the same upon the district of lands declared benefited, the exterior boundaries of which were fixed by the resolution of intention in proportion to the benefit to be derived from said opening and extension so far as the Commissioners can reasonably estimate the same.

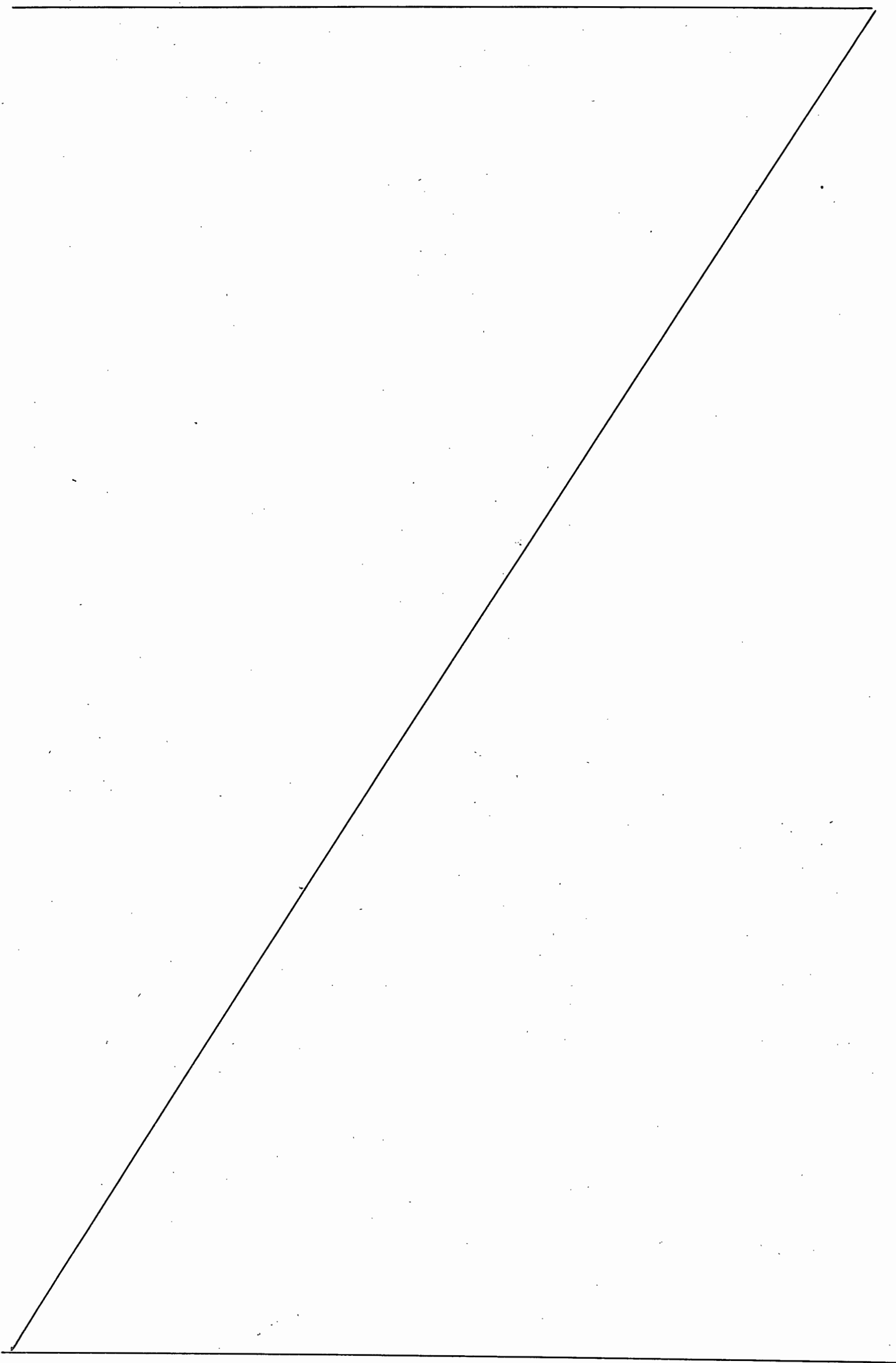

Section 2. The City Engineer shall certify to the correctness of the plats of property, and such other evidence of official work done by him, or his assistants, as may properly be so certified.

Section 3. The cost of surveys, plats and diagrams, relating to the improvement of streets, parks, places, courts and alleys, or other such places, shall be assessed as a part of the cost of improving the street, park, place, court, or alley for which such work shall have been ordered done.

Section 4. The resetting of work once laid out, shall be at the expense of the contractor, or such other person who may be responsible for the negligence in carrying for said stakes.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect from the date of its approval by the Mayor of the City of San Diego, and one publication thereof in the San Diego Union & Daily Bee.

Section 6. All ordinances, or part of ordinances, heretofore ordained the provisions of which are contrary to the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

All that portion of the City known as Pacific Beach, also beginning at a point made by the intersection of the bay shore with Noel street, thence along said

Noel Street to California street; thence along said California street to Henry street; thence along Henry street continued in a straight line to the brow of the hill on the South side of Mission Valley; thence Eastward along the Brow of the hill to Utah street, extended Northward; thence in a direct line Southward along Utah street continued, to the Bay shore; thence North-westernly along Bay shore to the place of beginning. Also, Reed & Hubbels, and Whitney's addition to the City of San Diego, are included within said Bound Limits. Except that portion of the above described territory lying and being within the following boundaries to-wit: On the North by the North Line of "C" street, on the West by the West line of Fourth street, on the South by the South Line of "D" on the East by the West line of Seventh street, provided the exception herein shall only apply to horses and teams found within such excepted territory.

Section 4. That the Police of said City shall and they are hereby required to look after, and take charge of any and all horses or teams found running at large within the limits of the excepted territory described in section three of this Ordinance.

Section 5. That the Poundkeeper in and for the City of San Diego be and he is hereby authorized to appoint two Deputy, Pound-keepers, Subject to the approval of the Board of Delegates.

Section 6. It shall be unlawfull for any person owning or having the control, of any of the above mentioned animals, to graze or pasture the same, or caused the same to be done within the limits of said City herein before described, unless all such animals are securely fastened and staked so that the same shall not run at large within the meaning of this Ordinance.

Section 7. Whenever the Poundkeeper of the City of San Diego shall discover or be notified of by any person that any animal or animals above enumerated are grazing, or pasturing or running at large in violation of this Ordinance, it shall be his duty, and he is hereby directed to immediately take them in charge and put them in the



City pound, and within twenty four hours thereafter have three notices posted in three conspicuous places, and one published in the official papers of the City for ten days describing such animals or animal so impounded, giving the marks or brand or other distinguishing points with the date of the posting of such notices, and unless the owner or owners thereof come and claim said animals so impounded within ten days from and after the date of said notices and prove the ownership of said property, and pay all lawful charges thereon, as hereinafter provided, said Pound-keeper is hereby authorized and it is made his duty to expose said animal or animals for at public auction to the highest bidder for cash; and the proceeds of said sale, together with all fines, charges, fees and other expenses chargeable against said animal or animals, according to the schedule of charges hereinafter specified shall be delivered to the secretary of the Auditing Committee, together with a full description of the animal or animals sold as aforesaid, and the said Pound-keeper shall deliver to the purchaser of any animal or animals sold as aforesaid, a bill of sale thereof, which shall rest the title of said property in the purchaser.

Section 8. The following charges and fines are hereby imposed for any violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance. For any horse, mule, cow, hog, pig, goat, sheep or other animal impounded, the sum of one dollar, and in addition the sum of seventy-five cents per day, for keeping any such animal, and the sum of two dollars if the same are advertised, and five percent commission of the amount of sale, if said animals are sold, and one dollar for taking up and driving each and every one of said animals to the pound, all of which is hereby made a lawful charge against the owner or owners of said animals impounded, and shall be a lien upon said animals for the payment thereof.

Section 9. The salary of said Pound-keeper shall be derived from the impounding of all

animals mentioned in this Ordinance, and being one dollar for each animal and all sums derived from driving any of said animals to the Pound, being one dollar for each of said animals, and five percent commission on the proceeds of the sale of any such animals, and the said compensation shall, when properly allowed by the Auditing Committee of said city, be paid to said Poundkeeper, and the same shall be in full payment for the services of said Poundkeeper, and the said city of San Diego shall be in no manner liable for further compensation for said poundkeeper, other than such fees as are herein provided.

Section 10. Should any amount remain in the custody of the city after deducting all expenses and charges herein provided for, the same shall be placed in the Treasury of the said city, to be paid to the owner or owners of said animals, so sold on proper proof of ownership of said animals, but if not called for within one year from date of sale, by the owner of said animals or animals, the same shall be placed to the credit of the general fund of the city.

Section 11. That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 12. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and ten daily publications in the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

It is hereby made the duty of said Deputy Tax Collector, to give written notice by mail to all delinquents, where residence or address is known, or can by reasonable inquiry, be ascertained by said Deputy; to pay the tax due by such person to the City within ninety days from the date of said notice; or the City will take steps to acquire a deed to his property in the manner prescribed by Law.

Section 5. The notice required to be given by section 4 of this Ordinance, shall contain an accurate description of the property sold, the amount of Tax, Percentage, Interest, and costs due thereon, the year assessed, to whom assessed, and date of sale to the City.

That Fifth <sup>Street</sup> in said City from the south line of "A" <sup>Street</sup> to the south line of University Avenue, (except such portion thereof as is required by Law to be kept in order or repairs by any person or Company having Railroad tracks thereon) and the sidewalks and the entire crossings thereof with the streets intersecting the same be graded to its full width and to the grade thereof, as established by Ordinances numbered 33, 54 and 172 approved respectively October 10th 1889, December 4th 1889 and July 26th 1892.

Section 3. Every person who deposits or causes to be deposited in any alley, street, lane, place, court, park, or on any vacant lot within the corporate limits of the city of San Diego, other than the Public Dump, without the consent in writing of the Board of Health, any rubbish, street sweepings, stable manure, tin cans, waste paper, or other refuse material is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$1.00 nor more than (\$100.00.)

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage and one publication in the San Diego Union and Daily Bee.

The Report of the Joint Street Committee, to whom was referred the matter of changing the grade of Hawthorne Street was read and on motion of Alderman Levi adopted, and is as follows.

The Report of the Joint Finance Committee charged with the duty of investigating the expenditures of the city government was read and on motion of Alderman Levi adopted, and is as follows.

To the Honorable, the Common Council of the City of San Diego, Cal:

GENTLEMEN—Your joint finance committee by joint resolution No. 278 was charged with the duty of investigating the expenditures of the city government, and to consider in what manner if necessary they may be reduced. The resolution also refers to our consideration the message of the mayor in which he recommended that the services of certain city officers and employes be dispensed with.

We have completed our labors and do report as follows:

All the departments were investigated and we made inquiry as to the number of officers and employes, their duties and requirements, in which we were assisted by the oral testimony of all the heads of departments.

#### WATER DEPARTMENT.

The officers of this department as at present authorized include three commissioners, of whom two receive \$100 per month each, and one of whom acts as superintendent, and the other being the city engineer, receives \$50 per month. The other employes are a secretary at \$40 per month, assistant secretary at \$75 per month, two collectors at \$55 per month each, and a meterman at \$50 per month. One collector has a monthly allowance of \$22.50 for horse hire, the other \$2 for car fare, and the meterman \$25 for horse hire.

Your committee believes that the cost of running this department is excessive, and we recommend the following changes to be made by an ordinance to be passed in the immediate future:

One commissioner, who shall be an engineer, at \$25 per month; one commissioner who shall act as superintendent and meter man and furnish his own horse, at \$100 per month; one secretary and bookkeeper at \$75 per month, and one collector, who shall furnish his own horse, at \$75 per month.

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT.

Your committee finds that the city now has a first-class fire department, well equipped, in charge of a thoroughly competent chief, and we think it inadvisable to make any change, or in any way impair its efficiency. We especially think it inadvisable to adopt the recommendation of the mayor to appoint firemen who shall be paid for services in helping to extinguish actual fires. Such a policy we consider visionary and well calculated to impair if not to completely disorganize the department.

#### DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS.

Your committee, after a thorough and searching investigation of this department, and the duties of its various officers and employes, find that the best interests of the city will be subserved by retaining it as at present constituted. In regard to the superintendent of sewers, the superintendent of streets and the superintendent of parks, we find these officers all busily engaged in keeping up their departments, which requires all of their time. The superintendent of sewers we find to be a practical man, thoroughly conversant with the entire sewer system (which cost the taxpayers of this city over \$400,000), and not only superintending the one laborer employed on the sewers, but actually and continually at work flushing sewers, removing obstructions, etc. We do not think it in the interest of economy to neglect so valuable and expensive a sewer system or to allow the care of the same to be entrusted to inexperienced persons. And more serious consequences may result, for, if the sewer system is not properly cared for the health of the city will undoubtedly be jeopardized. The superintendent of streets is an absolutely necessary officer, whose time is entirely occupied. The superintendent of parks is simply city gardener, and is continuously employed. In this department your committee recommend that the salary of the secretary of the board be increased from \$60 to \$75 per month on account of the large amount of work required of him. His entire time is taken up with varied duties, and we consider him a capable and competent officer, and should be paid the same salary as other members of the city's clerical force. With this exception your committee recommends that the officers and employes of this department remain as at present. Your committee has taken into consideration the matter of a possible consolidation of superintendent of sewers with plumbing inspector, also superintendent of streets with superintendent of parks, and some other changes, but find the same impracticable and not for the best interests of the city.

#### HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

Your committee have considered his honor's recommendation that the health inspector be discharged. We find that the inspector is not a salaried officer, but the inspecting is done by the plumbing inspector, whose services we find are necessary to the proper conduct of the health department, and we do not deem it for the best interests of the city to

lessen the duties of this officer by discharging him as health inspector and retaining him as plumbing inspector, for which he receives salary. Therefore your committee recommend that this department remain as at present constituted.

#### POLICE DEPARTMENT.

We recommend that the matter of keeping city prisoners in the county jail be referred to the board of police commissioners, with power to act as will be for the best interests of the city. Your committee is of the opinion that if satisfactory arrangements can be made with the board of supervisors for keeping city prisoners in the county jail, if the same can be legally made, it should be done, and in case such arrangements are made the services of one policeman should be dispensed with.

#### CITY CLERK'S OFFICE.

Your committee find that a typewriter was employed in this department temporarily under authority of the common council for the specific purpose of copying the ordinances of the city preparatory to publication, and we further find that when said copying was completed the services of said typewriter were duly dispensed with. The same is true of the

deputies in the assessor's office. The term of service to the employes in these two offices would necessarily end when the work for which they were employed was completed.

#### PUBLIC LIBRARY.

Your committee find that the board of trustees of the public library have full authority in the premises to employ such assistants as may be necessary, and that said board is responsible to the people by whom they are elected for the economical management of the affairs of this department.

#### CITY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE.

Your committee recommend inasmuch as the city is getting satisfactory and valuable services from this department for as small a compensation as could be expected, that no change be made.

#### TREASURER AND TAX COLLECTOR.

We recommend that no change be made in this department, except that the ordinance now before the council providing for an additional deputy to collect delinquent taxes, should be finally adopted and such deputy allowed.

#### AUDITOR AND ASSESSOR.

Your committee recommend that ordi-

nance No. 192, providing for a permanent deputy in this department, should not be repealed, and that said officer should be allowed to keep a permanent deputy, as we think it in the interest of economy to allow a permanent deputy in this office in order that the assessor may have time to prepare new lot books, the abstract of the list of owners of property, and make the list of mortgages and otherwise prepare for the assessment of 1894, rather than wait until the 1st of January, when such work will be required to be completed within a short time, and would necessarily have to be done by men more or less inexperienced.

In making this investigation your committee have utterly failed to find any evidence of the charges that the city is being run in "an extravagant manner," or "that the treasury is raided from all directions under the cloud of a 'penny'." We cannot but conclude that the statements made and the comparisons drawn between the present time and the period of six years ago, when the mayor was serving the city as trustee are far-fetched and imaginative.

From comparisons of the salary lists of other cities, the salaries paid by the city of San Diego are found to be less than those of any other city of equal size and population west of the Rocky mountains.

Your committee are as heartily in favor of "economy and reform" as his honor, or as any citizen can possibly be; but after a thorough investigation, we find the charges of "extravagance, lavish expenditures, ruinous robbery," etc., wholly unfounded. And as to the statement that the taxpayers of this city were called upon in the year 1892 to pay a tax revenue of nearly \$500,000, we find the total amount of taxes levied was \$192,548.27, as shown from the assessment roll, of which \$187,758.44 was collected.
