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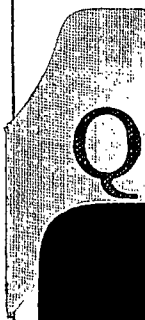

Regular Meeting;-

Present Commissioners Mahler and Graham, Absent Commissioner Jorres.

Minutes were read and approved.

Colonel A.G. Gassen filed application for the construction of a one story brick building on C Street between 4th. & 5th. Streets the estimated cost to be \$2,000.00.

Upon motion the same was granted to be constructed in accordance with the drawings submitted.

Communication from the Superintendent of the Water Department recommending the purchase of 84 lengths of 36" Cast Iron Water Pipe to be laid on El Cajon Avenue to the University Heights Reservoir, Estimated cost will be \$620.00.

The Secretary was directed to recommend the same to the Honorable Common Council also that the same be purchased in the open market without advertising and the ordinance authorizing the same to contain the urgency clause as this pipe will fill out a car that has been ordered.

The Water Department recommend the purchase of 6 Fire Hydrant Tops for repairs at a cost of \$108.00.

The same was ordered to be purchased by the Water Department in accordance with its recommendation.

Petition was filed for a sewer line to be constructed in the Alley between N and Webster Streets beginning at a point 40 feet from the westerly end of 32nd. street and running easterly across 32nd street and along the alley to a point 200 feet east of 32nd. St in Block #135 of Central Park Addition and Block #347 of Central Homestead Addition.

Referred to the Superintendent of Sewers for investigation and report.

The Superintendent of Streets filed a report showing a comparative cost of work done by the men under the jurisdiction of the Public Improvement Committee and the Street Department Force.

Application for work was filed by Homer E. Stode for the position of Teamster in the Street Department.

Referred to the Superintendent of Streets.

(R.L. Morgan was granted permission to make improvements to building of 5th. Street between A & B Streets) (granted on 3rd, inst.)

Ordinance #3175 from the Honorable Common Council directs the Board of Public Works to purchase from Sweetser & Baldwin Safe Company of Los Angeles one No. 65 Victor manganese steel screw door safe for the use of the City Treasurer of the City of San Diego, Cal. deliver and install the same at a cost of not to exceed \$3250.00.


The Secretary was directed to address a communication to said Company to ascertain when they will be able to enter into a contract and when delivery will be made.

The contract for the construction of a sewer line to be constructed in Block #82 of University Heights Addition was read and approved and the bonds therefor in the sum of \$1150.00 & \$575.00 respectively Labor and Material and Faithful performance of contract, were approved, the same being in the American Bonding Company of Baltimore sureties.



Regular Meeting;-

Present Commissioners Jorres, Mahler & Graham.

Minutes were read and approved.

Petition was this day filed by John Johnston of Escondido, California, P.O. Box #81, offering to sell to the City 15,000 feet of 4 inch screw pipe in car load lots at 25¢ per foot.

Referred to the Water Department for investigation and report.

The property owners along the line of 3rd. street between A Street and K St. being very desirous of having said 3rd. street paved and as the same is being held back on account of a line of water pipe to be constructed therein under the bond issue and as said issue is included in the suit now pending in the supreme court and as the ultimate outcome is uncertain, the property owners have asked that an estimate of cost for the construction of the same be furnished it was therefore decided to have the City Engineer and the Supt of the Water Department to furnish an estimate for the construction of the same.

Petition was filed for the construction of a water pipe line in Juniper Street to accomodate lots 11 & 12 of Block 67 of Seaman & Choates Addition immediately that a meter may be set to supply a residence to be erected at once.

Referred to the Water Department for investigation and report.

The Water Department report having laid the following pipe lines.

Ordinance #3182, from the Common Council appropriates \$607.68 for the payment of the Blue Printing Machine for the use of the City Engineers Office.

The Fire Commissioners filed a communication in relation to the payment of water bills that have been charged against it by the Water Department, claiming that there is no provision in the Water Ordinance providing for the Fire Department to pay for the use of water other than the payment of rental of Fire Hydrants.

The San Diego Union Co., was authorized to put in crosswalks in front of the Union Building across D Street and 3rd. Street. The work to be done under the directions of the Superintendent of Streets and the City Engineer.

Plans and specifications for the placing of laterals in 7th street between B & L Streets were read and approved and the Secretary directed to endorse the approval of the Board on said plans and specifications.

The Superintendent of Streets was directed to place the surplus dirt from Albatross Street on to Washington Street as Washington street is short of dirt, and the property owners are willing that the said dirt be placed there.

Minutes read and approved.

A communication was received from the Mayor relative to owners or occupants of any premises within the City of San Diego who allow or permit overhanging limbs or branches of trees to obstruct the sidewalks; and suggests that steps be taken to at once protect the public against the indifference shown by the offenders concerned.

The Superintendent of Streets was directed to enforce Ordinance No. 487, approved January 18th. 1898, wherein a penalty of \$50.00 can be imposed upon the owner or occupants of the premises upon which these trees are obstructing the sidewalks.

Col. Ed Fletcher complains that B Street between 30th. and 31st. Streets is in a very deplorable condition and needs immediate attention.

Referred to the Superintendent of Streets for report.

J.A. & J.C. Rice complain that the alley in Block 223 University Heights is being occupied in part by a stable and a chicken yard and that said alley is the only access to the cottage on Cypress Street.

Referred to the Superintendent of Streets for investigation and report.

John B. Osburne makes application for 525 feet of old pipe to be used for drains on a contour road to be constructed and dedicated to the City through blocks 153 & 154 of Middletown.

Referred to the Superintendent of Streets to ascertain if there is any pipe available and report.

Communication from the Board of Health calling the attention to the fact that ^{for sanitary reasons} they will be compelled to close up a couple of houses unless a sewer is provided. ^{for sanitary reasons} Referred to the Superintendent of Sewers for investigation and report.

Upon motion being duly seconded and by a unanimous Aye vote of the Board it was decided to notify the South Park & East Side R.R. Co. the Los Angeles San Diego & Beach Ry Co & the San Diego Electric Ry. Co. to at once fix all places along the paved streets between the railroad tracks and to grade and fill in in all places along the street where not paved and where washed by the recent rains.

J.F. Jones filed a bond in the sum of \$200.00 for S/C in the City of San Diego, California, G.C. Arnold and Solon Bryan as sureties.

The same was ordered approved.

G.E. Gabrielson filed a bond for blasting in the City of San Diego, California, Sureties T.L. Barnes, H.W. Simpton and Thomas Kneale as sureties.

Charles F. Whalden filed a petition for the position of watchman at the City Hall. Filed.

In accordance with a request from the Superintendent of Sewers for proposals to be delivered at the office of the Board at 10 o'clock a.m. February 27th. 1908, for the laying of sewer laterals in 7th. street between "B" and "L" Streets at a price per lateral, the following bids were received.

Said bids were taken under consideration.

A communication was received from the City Engineer to the effect that the City Attorney states that there will be considerable difficulty in obtaining the necessary right of way for the construction of a sewerline in "C" Street through private property from India street west. By changing the course of the sewer by running on India Street to "B" Street thence on "B" Street to Atlantic Street "B" Street is thence open all of the way to the Bay and no rights-of-way would be necessary. The estimated cost for the construction of said line of sewer is \$7600.00.

The Secretary was directed to recommend to the Common Council that an ordinance be adopted authorizing the construction of said line in accordance with the plans and specifications as prepared by the City Engineer provided the cost does not exceed \$7600.00.

Communication from the City Engineer calling attention to the tower #2 of the 30th. Street Bridge the plans not calling for depth enough to secure a good foundation and asking permission to instruct the contractor to carry the pier to a sufficient depth to obtain this.

The extra work will amount to about 35¢ per cubic foot or \$9.45 per cubic yard.

The Engineer was directed to use his judgment in the matter.

The Secretary was directed to recommend to the Common Council that the claim of the Barber Asphalt Paving Company for extras done in making the culverts on National Avenue from 26th. Street to 31st. Street thicker or extra heavy in accordance with the new specifications prepared for Street Paving work, said claim being for \$261.45.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, as follows;

That, whereas, the Common Council of the said City of San Diego, on the 17th. day of February, 1908, adopted an ordinance providing for the disposal of garbage and waste matter in the City of San Diego, California, and authorizing and directing the Board of Public Works of said City, pursuant to the terms thereof, to advertise for proposals and let a contract according to the terms of said ordinance; which ordinance was approved by the Mayor of said City on the 19th. day of February, 1908; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Public Works that the Board give and cause to be published a notice, pursuant to the terms of said ordinance, calling for sealed proposals to be submitted to this board on the 23rd. day of March, 1908, at ten o'clock a.m. for the right and privilege to take, receive and execute a contract for the taking and disposal of said garbage and waste matter, according to the terms of said ordinance, and that for that purpose the Secretary of this board be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to publish, or cause to be published, said notice, which notice shall be signed by the Secretary of the Board, and shall be published for at least ten days before the said 23rd. day of March, 1908.

Present Commissioners Mahler, Jorres & Graham.

Minutes of March 2nd and of April 27th. a.m. and p.m. were read and approved.

Commissioner Mahler files a report that (verbal) that he has investigated the matter referred to him in relation to the condition in which he finds the property of Mrs. Murphy, against whom one Mr. White has registered complaint that said property is damaging his property by reason of its location, and finds that said house complained of is located entirely within Atlantic Street and as said Atlantic Street cannot be used in its present condition he recommends that Mrs. Murphy be allowed to remain upon the street until all others are also ordered off as her house is not doing damage to either the City or to Mr. White the party complaining.

Upon motion the Secretary was directed to notify the Common Council in accordance with the said findings.

Ordinance #3197, provides \$7600.00, for the construction of a Sewer line in "C" Street, ^{India Street} between 4th. & Atlantic Streets.

The Secretary was directed to advertise for the construction of said line making the bids returnable at 7.30 p.m. March 16th. 1908.

Complaint was filed that steps were sticking out on sidewalk on Evans Street and 25th, streets. Referred to the Superintendent of Streets for investigation and report.

Ordinance #3192, \$620.00 for the purchase of 84 feet of 36" Cast Iron Water Pipe to be used by the Water Department from the reservoir south.

referred to the Water Department with authority to make said purchase.

Ordinance #3194, provides \$430.00 for the purchase of 1000 street signs.

Referred to the Superintendent of Streets with instructions to furnish this board with a list of all signs needed along the Street car lines of the City and report to the board.

The City Engineer files an estimate of cost for the construction of a bulk-head at the ends of the bridge on Prospect Street La Jolla, of \$150.00.

Upon motion being duly seconded it was decided to allow Mr. M.D. Goodbody do said work by days labor provided the expense thereof does not exceed the sum of \$150.00. *under the supervision & to the satisfaction of the City Engineer.*

Cut in blocks
(granite blocks) The City Engineer files a communication relative to taking out the crosswalks (blocks) on "D" Street between 4th. and California, stating that it will be necessary to do this in order to properly pave the street, besides being much cheaper if the street department do the work.

The City Engineer was allowed to place the taking out of the granite blocks in the specifications in the specifications as suggested by him.

The Secretary was directed to recommend to the Common Council that they authorize the construction of re-enforced concrete abutments for the bridge to be built over Switzer Canyon on 30th. street, San Diego, California, at a cost of \$4,000.00 this being deemed advisable for the reason that the specifications under which this bridge is being constructed calls for bents number 1 and 10 to be placed on mud sills and at a depth that will be a fatal defect to the bridge.

George M. Todd of Dove and Washington Street makes application for the use of the extra dirt from Dove Street for a distance of 150 feet North of Washington Street Which was granted provided said Dove Street is brought down to the official grade and a

cement sidewalk laid in front of his property for the entire distance of 150 feet and that said work all be completed within six months from date.

These conditions must be accepted in writing otherwise the permit will be null and void.

Ordinance #3515.

Grants authority to purchase from the South Coast Land Company the Los Penasquitas Creek Bridge for \$2686.15.

Filed and the Secretary was directed to notify Mr. Ed. Fletcher accordingly.

Ordinance #3191.

Provides \$1129.78 for extra expense in strengthening the culverts in 7th. Street and in C Street, before the said streets are paved.

Filed.

Gentlemen;-

With reference to the bill against the Keller Kerckhoff Railway Company, which your Honorable Body referred to the City Attorney for collection, I have felt it in the line of my duty to investigate and ascertain the facts with reference to the dispute over the matter, and if possible of harmonizing the difference existing between the parties.

After due investigation and consultation with Col. Ed. Fletcher, the representative of the Keller-Kerckhoff Railway people and members of the City Council, I now believe the whole matter over the payment of the bill of \$463.18 is the result of a misunderstanding between Col Fletcher and the City Councilmen and that neither Col Fletcher or his principals were trying to avoid the payment of the claim in any dishonorable manner, whatever, but thought as a matter of fact that the City would pay for the water service over which this dispute has arisen.

Neither do I believe that any member of the City Council intentionally misrepresented the City's status relative to the payment for the water service in question, but, as stated, I believe the whole dispute is based upon a misunderstanding, and as the Keller-Kerckhoff interests have come forward, after the matter has been discussed and explained and have voluntarily agreed to pay into the City Treasury the amount in question, I think then they ought to be exonerated from any reflection of bad faith, and the matter be then considered closed. Regular Meeting;-

Present Commissioners, Jorres, Kneale & Graham.

The minutes were read and approved.

Communication from the Superintendent of Streets relative to the storm drain at 1st. & Grape Streets, stating that the east end of said drain is apparently open, but the west end is closed. Mr. Campbell, the contractor for Mr. Sprigg, on the building on the South-west corner of 1st. & Grape, says the foundation of said building cuts off the west end of the drain and furthermore that Mr. Sprigg would not allow said drain to discharge upon his property. Filed.

Communication from the Mayor relative to the appointment of an inspector on the University Heights Reservoir desiring to confer with the board before said appointment is made, as the matter of said appointment is very important and the desire to have all of said work as a credit to the City.

Notify the Mayor that an appointment had been made prior to the receipt of his request, but that another appointment will be required and will notify and confer with him before said appointment is made.

Superintendent of Streets files an application for a T/W Machine that he understands is in the office of the City Attorney and for which there is no use, to be transferred to his department without cost to his department.

The Secretary was directed to make requisition upon the City Attorney for said machine after which time the board will settle as to the disposition of the same.

Communication from the Superintendent of the Water Department recommending the rebuilding of the La Jolla Reservoir on its present site for the reason that this reservoir is lower than the Pacific Beach Reservoir and consequently would receive a better water supply. If the reservoir were constructed as is contemplated in the bond issue it will be 61 feet higher than the present one and would therefore receive no water in the summer time for the reason that the consumption would exhaust the supply before reaching this reservoir as the present supply pipes are entirely inadequate. There are at present time 354 water consumers at La Jolla and a sewer system nearing completion, with the increased demands for water by the Biological Station and contemplated improvements will tax the supply to its utmost limit to pass through the coming summer. The only way to get water to supply the higher elevation is to place a small reservoir at the 302 foot elevation and put a pumping plant at the lower reservoir to keep it full.

Referred to the City Attorney to ascertain whether or not if better results may be obtained by building a small reservoir costing approximately \$3000.00, on the bond issue level, of 302 feet, and then to use the balance of the bond money provided for a larger reservoir, and reconstruct and better the old reservoir at La Jolla on the 240 foot level, this lower reservoir being sufficient for the requirements of La Jolla and for adequate pressure. Can the bond money be diverted in this manner.

The Point Loma R.R Co., complain that at the intersection of Rosecrans & McCauley Streets, the natural water way runs up Mc Caluey Street 600 feet. Conditions make it impossible to divert it from the natural way. It is estimated that a 36" concrete pipe will carry all the water passing through this waterway. The Company will place the pipe if the City will furnish it. Referred to the City Engineer for investigation and report.

The Southern Electrical Company petition for permission to install a 120 gallon gasoline oil tank between the curbing and the building, known as the Union Garage, located at the S.W. Corner of 4th & G streets, dimensions 30 X 42 inches of 1/8 steel.

Referred back for plans and specifications and the same to be to the satisfaction of the City Engineer, and in accordance with the specifications of the Board on file in this office.

At a regular meeting of the Board of Public Works held on December 3rd. 1908, the following resolution was adopted.

Be It Resolved by the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, as follows;—
That the Board of Public Works would respectfully recommend to the Honorable Common Council that it adopt an ordinance appropriating the sum of \$3600.00 as the City's portion for the construction of the concrete bridge across Chollas Creek required in the building of a boulevard from M street and 32nd Street to the main entrance to the cemetery. The contract for the construction of said bridge has been awarded for the sum of \$5600.00 and the San Diego Electric Railway Co., has given its undertaking to pay the sum of \$2000.00 towards the construction of said bridge, same to be applied as the work progresses, this leaves a balance of \$3600.00 to be appropriated by the City, and for the payment of which the board requests the passage of an ordinance appropriating said amount to wit \$3600.00 under the urgency clause. The estimate of the City Engineer for the construction of said bridge is \$7200.00.

Commissioners Jorres, Kneale & Graham voting AYE.

A communication was directed to be transmitted to the Common Council recommending that the ordinance approved December 24th. 1889, be suspended so as to allow the laying of pipes on the the sides of the newly constructed Boulevards, so as not to ruin these roadways.

Said ordinance provides for the laying of said pipes within 10 feet from the center of the street.

Complaint was filed by Mrs. H.P. Newman, 1560--8th. Street, that the chimney now under construction in her house is being done in a dangerous manner and asks for relief from the Board.

Upon examination of the chimney complained of, by members of the Board, it was decided to direct the contractor for said work to tear down said chimney and make the same safe and to the satisfaction of the Board and in accordance with the ordinances regulating the construction of buildings in said City of San Diego,

Petition was filed by property owners for the construction of a foot bridge on Vermont Street between Hendricks and Lincoln Streets when the sewer line is in the course of construction. Referred to the City Engineer for investigation and report.

Property owners petition for relief in the 30th. street water main between Juniper and Beech streets, claiming that the same is badly leaking at all times. Filed.

Resolution from the Common Council #4638, provides for the removing of trees from Alley between 1st. & Brookes from over the sewer line. The Superintendent of Streets was directed to comply with the order of the said Resolution.

W.P. McLelland filed application for the position of Inspector on the University Heights Reservoir. Filed.

J. Alexander Parker filed application for the position of Asst. Electrical Inspector. Referred to the City Electrician.

Minutes were read and approved.

Communication was received from the Superintendent of construction of Sewers in relation to the petition filed by Henry Timpken for a sewer line to be run in 6th. St, for the accomadation of the Timpken Building.

The same was referred to the Common Council with a copy of the communication filed by the Superintendent of construction for its consideration.

Car Lewis petitions for a sewer line to be constructed in the alley between Campus & North Av enue in Block 79 of University Heights.

Referred to the City Engineer and the Superintendent of Sewer Construction for investigation and report.

The following opinion was received from the City Attorney;-

"Yours of April 8th, in re Marshall, Brown & Gallagher, has been duly received. As between the city and Marshall, Brown & Gallagher and their bondsmen, I am of the opinion, that the city can legally pay said Marshall, Brown and Gallagher 40% of the material as delivered on the grounds and before it is put in place, but I cannot say as a matter of law that the rights of the third parties may not intervene under the conditions wherein the city would not be fully protected. While I do not understand that there is the slightest danger of any judgment being obtained against the firm of Marshall, Brown & Gallagher, or of their being any danger whatever that an attachment might issue against said firm, I am of the opinion that should any judgment be obtained, or an attachment issued against them there is nothing to prevent said judgment of attaching creditor from levying upon any of their property delivered on the grounds and not yet put in place. In other words, until such materials shall be delivered on the ground and put in place, as provided by the contract I do not see how the city will acquire such absolute title therein as would enable it to successfully claim such materials as might be delivered upon the grounds and before it was put in place, as against the judgment or attaching creditor. Until material is delivered on the grounds shall have been put in place there is nothing in the contract which would prevent Marshall, Brown & Gallagher from removing such material and afterwards substituting other material in lieu thereof. This shows that the title to said material is vested in Marshall, Brown and Gallagher until it shall have been put in place, when, upon the city paying the 75% of the value thereof, as provided in the contract, the title, for the first time, becomes fully vested in the city. I can readily understand how it might benefit said firm to have the 40% of the value of the material delivered upon the ground paid to them now, and in the absence of any judgment being rendered against them or any attachment issued, the city would take no risk, but should such judgment be obtained, or such attachment issue, I see no way whatever, to protect the city in case they should pay said 40% in advance of such materials being put in place as provided by the contract."

The foregoing matters should have been spread upon the minutes of the 5th. inst. but a portion of which was omitted in error.

Clerk R.G.Vallin, of the Board of Public Works, filed his resignation to take effect at the pleasure of the Board.

Referred to the City Attorney for an opinion as to liability of the city for damages that might be incurred by using a patented article, if the article referred to shall be held to be duly patented.

The City Attorney filed the following opinion in relation thereto. Viz:-

"San Diego, California, April 26th. 1909.

To the Honorable Board of Public Works,
of the City of San Diego, California.

Gentlemen;-

Replying to yours of April 22nd. we beg to say that in our opinion the bids of Fairchild-Gillmore-Wiltin Co., and the Barber Asphalt Paving Company are each in due form.

As to the liability of the City for damages that might be incurred by using a patented article, we beg to say, if the article referred to shall be held to be duly patented we are of the opinion that the city would be liable for infringement the same as a private individual if it should use any patented article without permission so to do. If the matter you have in mind relates to the intersection of 4th. and "H" streets we would suggest that in order to avoid any possible contingent liability, the intersection of 4th. & "H" Streets should be paved under the same specifications as were used in paving 4th. street and "H" St from 4th. to 5th. streets. This seems to us more advisable than it would to have the intersection paved under specifications which might be an infringement upon a patented article. However, in our opinion, in so small an undertaking, it is not likely that any difficulty would arise.

Owing to the fact that the grade of D street, from the east line of Third Street to the west line of Columbia street, has been raised some six inches above the present elevation of the track on that street, it has been impossible to fully complete the work of paving without blocking the traffic of the electric cars.

We hereby guarantee to pave, according to contract, the unfinished portions of this street, as above noted, whenever the tracks in the Railroad Company's Right-of-way are raised to conform with the present grade of the pavement, and to do any other part of said work not entirely completed.

Be IT RESOLVED By the Board of Public Works of the City of San Diego, as follows;-

That it be, and is hereby, determined that the contract entered into between the City of San Diego, by and through its Board of Public Works, and the Barber Asphalt Paving Company, on the 18th. day of December, 1908, for the paving of that portion of D street in said city of San Diego, from the east line of third street to the west line of Columbia street and the construction of the culverts thereon, and all the work described in said contract, all as specified and described in said contract and plans and specifications referred to therein, has been completed to the satisfaction and acceptance of said board of public works, and that the president of this board be, and he is hereby, authorized, empowered and

directed, for and on behalf, in the name, and as the act and deed of this board of public works, to deliver to said Barber Asphalt Paving Company a certificate to that effect.

Commissioners, Jorres, Kneale & Granam voting Aye.

The San Diego Electric Railway Company filed a petition which reads as follows;

"Under the contract with Sterigen for the construction of the concrete bridge over the river in Chollas Valley, along the cemetery road, and the terms of the subscription of \$2000.00 thereto by the San Diego Electric Railway Company, it was agreed that if a surplus should remain after completion of said bridge that the sum of \$500 thereof would be reimbursed to the said railway company; It appears there now remains in the fund a sum in excess of the sum of \$500, and said San Diego Electric Company hereby makes request for refund of the sum of \$500.00 according to terms of its subscription."

Notify the San Diego Electric Railway Company that the said bridge was not accepted until April 1st. 1909, and that the last payment cannot be made until 35 days thereafter; also that until said 35 days shall have lapsed the board do not know if all claims have been paid.

Ordinance #3679 from the Common Council provides the sum of \$3690.86 for the payment of Cast Iron Water Pipe purchased from J. Johnston Jr. of Escondido. Filed.

Ordinance #3682 directs the Board of Public Works to rebuild the S/C on lots 11, 12, 13 of Block 174, Land & Town Co.'s Addition to the City of San Diego, California, and provides \$125.00 therefor. Said work to be done by the street department in accordance with specifications as contained in Ordinance #1140 or the ordinances of the City of San Diego, California.

Referred to the Superintendent of Streets to do said work.

Ordinance #3683, authorizes the purchase of all Fire Alarm boxes etc., in the open market without advertising for bids.

The Fire Department was authorized and directed to make the said purchase in accordance with the terms of said ordinance #3683.

Superintendent of Streets was authorized to purchase one Rooter Plow at a cost of not to exceed \$45.00.
