A Cleaner, Greener San Diego!

Measure B, passed by a majority of voters in 2022, amended the 1919 People's Ordinance to clarify in the San Diego Municipal Code that residential solid waste collected by the City includes trash, recycling, and organic waste from single-family homes and multi-family residences with up to four units on a lot. The amendment also removed a prior prohibition in the municipal code that had prevented the City of San Diego (City) from charging fees for these services. In response, the City has been engaging in a public process to evaluate:

- Feedback on current services

- Fee options for the City to recover the costs of providing customers.

Public Involvement Process



Public Feedback Received So Far

The City has gathered valuable feedback from thousands of residents through community events, surveys, and monthly meetings with leaders from various communitybased organizations. Notably, 80% of residential customers expressed satisfaction or high satisfaction with their current trash, organic waste, and recycling collection services. Residents also provided meaningful insights into potential areas for service enhancements, including:

Additional container size options

Who Does This Impact?

Eligibility for City service. With the passing of Measure B, the San Diego Municipal Code clarified that the City of San Diego shall provide waste and recycling collection services to singlefamily homes and multi-family residences with up to four units on a lot that meet the City's eligibility requirements. The City is currently updating the regulations to align with the new code.

Multi-family residences with more than four units on a lot are now ineligible for City waste and recycling collection services and must enroll in service with a private hauler.

Potential fees for City service. A vote by City Council on potential fees for City-serviced customers is anticipated for June 2025. If approved, fees would apply to single-family homes and residential properties with up to four units on a lot that are eligible to receive trash and recycling services from the City of San Diego.

New San Diego Municipal Code Requirements

City to provide collection services for:



Single-family homes



Residential complexes, up to 4 units

Private haulers provide collection services for:



Non-residential properties



Mixed-use properties



No Plastic Bags in the Blue or Green Bin

Plastic bags are not recyclable in your curbside blue and green recycling bins. These are considered tanglers and wrap around and jam recycling equipment, disrupting the sorting process at the recycling facilities. If plastic bags are placed in the green bin (including bags labeled as "compostable") they get ground up into small pieces during the composting process and end up in compost and mulch products.

No one wants plastic pieces in their compost and mulch that are used in gardens, parks and farms! Instead please place any plastic bags in the black trash bin or check wastefreesd.org for where to take clean plastic bags to be recycled.

TIPS: Keep recyclables in the blue bin loose and empty. Food scraps in your green bin can be loose, frozen, or placed in a paper bag or wrapped in paper napkins or newspaper.


