C. AT&T Wireless Facility at 4375 1/3 Boundary St. (Public Right of Way, Project # 226649) (8:10 pm) UDPR has heard the item three times previously and voted to deny. The applicant has redesigned the facility based on the Subcommittee's suggestions. Three design options were presented. Each includes new lighted street bollards, landscaping, backlit, brushed, stainless steel cut-out North Park identification sign, narrowed "legs", reduced height, (as is technically possible) and stubbed out irrigation lines that can be tapped into for future development. Option #1 includes tile tower top. Option #2 is a design reflecting the iconic North Park Water Tower. Option #3 includes a stucco tower top. AT&T is responsible for the tank's maintenance. All options are improvements to original design & members expressed appreciation for the effort AT&T put into coming up with the much improved options. Committee ruled out Option 1 which some thought looked like a prison guard tower; with a slight preference for Option 2 –The NP Water facsimile, although there are concerns it could look kitschy if it is too literal. NP Artist Lynn Susholtz will be invited to attend the NPPC Board meeting, since this was partly her suggestion. MOTION: Recommend that the Board endorse design option #2 and approval of the CUP Lewis/Morrison 7/3/0 (Barry, ? & ? opposed)

D. Plaza de Panama Project, Balboa Park: Update & next steps.

(Heard at 2/13/13 Public Facilities Meeting) NPPC voted the project down for a number of reasons but specifically because the findings necessary to approve the Site Development Permit could not be made. (April 17, 2012 NPPC Resolution included see pg 4 below.) In a law suit SOHO v. City of San Diego (Plaza de Panama Ctee.), Case # 2012-00102270 Judge Taylor found the City violated the Municipal Code section 126.0504 (i)(3) when the approved the SDP without being able to make the required findings & therefor the If the BPMP & CMPP are left in their currently amended status it opens the door for another similar project to be approved with less public review. Council. President Todd Gloria & City Attorney Jan Goldsmith are currently looking into an expedited process to amend the Municipal Code to remove the section of the code Judge Taylor cited in his published ruling (see link below). Concerns that this would create problematic precedents and approval of the project the NPPC has found to be deferential to Balboa Park. Following nearly two years of attending the applicant's presentations, studying, analyzing and debating the Proposed Plaza de Panama, Circulation and Parking Structure Project, The North Park Planning Committee finds the following:

- Per the General Plan Land Use element, Sec LU-D.10, the proposed Plan Amendments must be "consistent with
 the goals and policies of the General Plan and Community Plan" NPPC finds that there are basic inconsistencies
 with existing goals and policies adopted within the City's General Plan, Balboa Park Master Plan and Central
 Mesa Precise Plan, as outlined in detail in NPPC's March 14, 2012 letter to Mayor Sanders. Key issues include:
 - An intrusive bypass bridge and road in non-compliance with the General Plan's Historic Preservation, Urban Design, and Recreation Elements in terms of historic preservation goals
 - Excessive and unnecessary grading and use of retaining walls and other elements
 - Overtly project-specific amendments which jeopardize future approval of superior alternatives should the proposed project not go forward
 - Inappropriate use of the plan amendment process for fundamental land use changes that merit comprehensive plan updates.
 - Introducing parking fees at the Organ Pavilion parking garage that will create significant impacts to the surrounding no-fee parking lots;
 - Creating substantial general fund liabilities for City taxpayers to repay the parking garage bonds if the project's estimated parking garage occupancy levels of 77% cannot be sustained.
- 2) Proposed circulation and parking designs are in conflict with current regional park best practices which encourage relocation of centralized parking and related traffic to the park's exterior, combined with investment in Traffic Demand Management techniques within the park's interior
- 3) The three findings required by Municipal Code 126.0504 for any project to be approved or conditionally approved for a Site Development Permit (SDP) cannot be made to justify the project's adverse impacts, specifically related to historic resources
 - The proposed project will adversely affect the applicable land use plan(s). The applicant's SDP findings fail
 to acknowledge the General Plan's applicability to the project and thus fail to acknowledge non-compliance
 with the General Plan's Historic Preservation, Urban Design, and Recreation element goals, as has been
 concluded by City staff and documented in the Draft EIR.
 - The proposed project will be detrimental to the public health, safety, and welfare by increasing pedestrian and vehicle conflicts in the Alcazar Garden and Cabrillo Bridge/new bypass road intersection, and by relocating existing disabled parking from the Plaza de Panama to more than 800 feet away from the museum core
 - The proposed project will not comply with Land Development Code regulations (Chapters 11, 12, 13, and 14) because it will cause significant unmitigable impacts to historic resources and does not qualify for a deviation from Historical Resources Regulations under §143.0260(c).

For these reasons the North Park Planning Committee opposes the proposed Balboa Park Master Plan Amendment, Central Mesa Precise Plan Amendment, Site Development Permit and Balboa Park Plaza de Panama Circulation and Parking Structure Project.

Subject: OLP Settlement Finalized

Good evening - I wanted to give you this update concerning the action taken by the City Council in Closed Session this morning. The following was read into the record this afternoon by Deputy City Attorney Mary Jo Lanzafame:

"The City Council voted on Closed Session Item #1 – Academy of Our Lady of Peace vs. City of San Diego U.S. District Court Case No. 09CV0962 CAB to authorize entry of the Consent Decree by the court in full, and for final settlement of the case. The Academy sued the City claiming the City violated its rights under the Federal Religious Land Use and Institutionalized Persons Act. The Consent Decree will order the City to issue a permit for the Modernization Project and pay a monetary settlement to OLP in the amount of \$500,000. The permit will allow OLP to construct a 2-story classroom building and a 2-story parking structure; will allow OLP to demolish a single-family dwelling owned by OLP on Uvada Street without any further discretionary review by the City. It will allow the removal of two other houses, one on Collier Street and one on Copley Street owned by OLP and will allow for a Conditional Use Permit with student enrollment of 750 students on campus. Upon notice by OLP the City will remove the Collier single-family dwelling and the Copley Street single-family dwelling from the OLP property. The removal must occur by May 1, 2014 unless a new date is agreed to by OLP and the City, and approved by the Court. The City will be responsible for all aspects of the removal of the two homes. OLP will retain no legal interest in or responsibility for the Copley or Collier single-family homes following their removal from OLP's property. The City will limit the cost to OLP for processing further permits for the Modernization Project to no more than \$100,000. All further permits needed for OLP's Modernization Project will be processed through the City's Express Plan Check Process at no extra cost to OLP. Other than payment of the settlement funds, each party will bear their own costs and fees associated with the action. The action will be dismissed with prejudice when the conditions of the Consent Decree have been met. The motion passed 6-2 with Council Members Gloria and Lightner voting no and Council District 4 vacant."

I'm told that there will be no further Council action on these items. Obviously this is a blow to the community who opposed the project as it was proposed, and to Council President Gloria, all of whom have fought to preserve the community's character and the historic homes in the neighborhood. If there is specific information I can find for you beyond what is stated above, please let me know.
