LOCATION: Miramar Water Treatment Plant; Scripps Lake Water Pump Station; Scripps Lake Water Pump Station; Princess Park WPS; Rancho Penasquitos WPS; Scripps Wood #11 WPS; Del Cerro WPS; Deerfield WPS; College Ranch RES and WPS; Bayview RES; Black Mountain RES; Rancho Bernardo RES; Soledad RES; Montezuma WPS; Scripps Poway WPS; Meanly Reservoir Tank (Dog Park); Otay Water Treatment Plant; Corner of Encina Dr./San Ysabel; Point Loma RES; Miramar RES; and San Vicente RES.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The City of San Diego Public Utilities Department, Water Systems Operations division is soliciting bids for a licensed Landscape Maintenance contractor to provide landscape maintenance and improvement services at the sites identified above.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically Exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Sections 15301 (Existing Facilities) and 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor–Appointed Designee.

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:

The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review and determined the project is exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Sections 15301 (Existing Facilities), which allows the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features involving negligible or no expansion of use; and Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land), which allows minor public or private alterations in the condition of land, water, and/or vegetation which do not involve removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees except for forestry or agricultural purposes. The exceptions listed in CEQA Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to

a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.
